NEW EAP PROGRAM

We are pleased to announce that effective January 1, 1985 the Family Counseling Service will be responsible for the Station's Employee Assistance Program (EAP). Contract negotiations have been completed, and we will send you a list of their services as soon as they are received. A major reason for the change is that we feel Family Counseling Service will offer a more diversified approach to problems affecting our employees. This new program is designed to work with the total family unit as well as with the individual worker.

Our present contract with Maxwell Corporation expires on November 30, 1984. This means there will be a month without an official Employee Assistance Program at the Station. However, Family Counseling Service will automatically take over the current active caseload beginning December 1, 1984 so that employees already using the

Employee Assistance Program will have uninterrupted service. They have also agreed to handle any emergencies until the official start of the program on January 1, 1985.

We will inform you of details of this new program as they develop.
