COORDINATORS

Representatives of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, the State Department of Agriculture and Markets, the College of Agriculture, and the Experiment Station conferred all day Monday in Jordan Hall on ways and means of coordinating the research, control, and regulatority attack on the European chafer, a turf and forage insect which has invaded western New York. Heading the USDA delegation were S. A. Rohwer and F. C. Bishopp, assistant chiefs of the Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantine, From Albany came Dr. A. B. Buchholz, Director of the Bureau of Plant Industry there. The College delegation was headed by Dr. Charles E. Palm, head of the Department of Entomology, while the Station was represented by Doctor Heinicke, Doctor Chapman, Doctor Gambrell, and Doctor Adams of the Poughkeepsie laboratory.
