In March, Janet received one of only two recognition awards ever presented by the United States Department of Agriculture Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA-APHIS) for an outstanding contribution to the national program.

As one of 50 state survey coordinators in the CAPS Program, Janet monitors the immigration of pests that are not native to a state or region and fosters the introduction of natural enemies of pests, such as the ladybird beetle. Her goal: to protect agricultural products.

Janet's leadership among her colleagues during the past five years, her commitment to networking and follow-through, and her willingness to initiate new activities have helped to build a particularly strong program. The information gleaned through CAPS becomes part of a national database and an electronic message system. Pest reports are then produced for the agricultural agencies and universities involved with pest surveys.

Since filling the CAPS position in 1985, Janet has carried out a diverse effort. From her home base at the Integrated Pest Management Program headquarters here in Geneva, she searches literature to define pest migratory methods, documents activities of exotic pests (such as the African honey bee) and indigenous pests (the gypsy moth and golden nematode, for example), conducts research on the use of pheromone traps, and maintains a network of volunteer pest and weather observers. Much of her time is spent providing for the exchange of information between Cornell University, USDA-APHIS, the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, the Department of Environmental Conservation, and the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry at Syracuse.

"I enjoy most working with such helpful and cooperative people. If it weren't for the cooperation, we wouldn't have much of a program!" says Janet. One of her favorite activities is coordinating the multistate survey project on potato leafhopper and pear thrips.

After earning a B.S. in zoology from North Dakota State University, Janet received her M.S. from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in 1983. When she's not bending over a microscope or attending a meeting, Janet enjoys sailing, birding, and landscaping with perennials.
