



# **CORNELL ALUMNI NEWS**

THE LARGEST Summer School ever held at Cornell came to an end August 13. The chimes are now silent and the Campus is deserted except for the army of workmen on new buildings and repairs. The total registration was 2,794 as compared with 2,121 for the preceding year. Deducting duplicate registrations the figures are 2,557 and 2,007 respectively; adding those in the Graduate School and in the Agricultural College third term, the totals for 1921 and 1920 are 2,739 and 2,124. The largest previous registration was 2,546 in 1919.

"BUSY" is no name for the Groves of Academos! But that's what's the matter with Cornell to-day; a snorting steam shovel is ripping the in'ards out of the hill where the new Chemistry Building is to stand. Rym Berry was foresighted enough to start a caravan of truck loads of surface soil from the site to the new baseball field, and when he had all he wanted Mr. Curtis of the Grounds Department diverted the rest to the making of a straight road on grade from the Library Tower to the Campus of the College of Agriculture. It goes through the hill-side garden which was once the delight of passers by from the south, and the never-ceasing care of Mrs. Andrew D. White. Even at that it will be a great improvement.

GOVERNOR MILLER made a short visit to Cornell, inspecting the College of Agriculture as part of his program to see and learn at first hand the needs of the various State institutions. He did not say what he thought of the place, but he had just come from the insane asylum at Willard, which he had visited in the morning. This juxtaposition recalled the story that when the State College of Agriculture was established a local politician of Ovid made every effort to have it there; but it went to Ithaca, and Ovid was given the asylum as a consolation. He was not wholly consoled, and is reported to have said "it'd take two insane asylums to equal one college of agriculture!"

LECTURES during the last days of the Summer Session included the following: "The Project Method of Teaching," Professor W. H. INFANT MORTALITY figures for the State give Ithaca the unenviable position of eleventh; in other words 22 of the 33 cities are better in this respect than Ithaca, which has a death rate of 94 for every thousand babies born, or almost one in ten. The rate is highest in the poorest homes, and additional public health nurses are suggested to remedy the situation.

LOUIS P. SMITH, vice president of the Ithaca Gun Company, is assured of the nomination for Mayor of Ithaca by joint action of the leaders of the Republican and Democratic parties.

A FULL DAY is promised for Thursday, October 20, when Livingston Farrand is inaugurated fourth president of Cornell, the cornerstone of the new Chemistry Building is laid, and the College of Architecture celebrates its fiftieth anniversary.

GEORGE T. HEPBURN, in the chemical and metallurgical department of the Westinghouse Lamp Company at Bloomfield, New Jersey, has been awarded a scholarship by the Westinghouse Company, and has selected Cornell for a course in electrical engineering.

ZETA BETA TAU Fraternity has sold its house at 109 Summit Avenue to Cascadilla School and will move to 128 Dryden Road, the house formerly occupied by the Huntington Club. A new house is to be built on the Heights near Deadhead Hill, overlooking Percy Field.

RHO PSI, Chinese fraternity, has bought the house of John R. Bergen at 212 Fall Creek Drive, where lived three Cornellians, Madeline Bergen '07, Robert R. Bergen '08, and Ruth Bergen '09.

THE SAGE CHAPEL preacher for August 7 was the Rev. President Murray Bartlett, of Hobart College.

STEWART PARK, dedicated to Ithaca's late mayor on June 26, has been a popular place these hot summer days. The beach has been cleaned, pavilions and bath houses have been opened, and the city generally has taken advantage of its lakeside playground.

Cornell's new president, spent June 29 in Ithaca with President and Mrs. Albert W. Smith. The Farrands have five daughters ranging in age from five to twenty years. They will occupy Andrew D. White's former residence at the head of President's Avenue.

KAPPA DELTA held its fifteenth annual convention in Prudence Risley Hall June 26 to 30, with an attendance of about two hundred and fifty delegates. Two new chapters, at St. Lawrence University and at the University of Pennsylvania, make a total of thirty-four. A two months' Kappa Delta European tour followed the Ithaca convention. A daily paper, *The Katydid*, appeared during the convention, in five issues.

C. B. WELLES '24 of Denver, Colorado, who is at the civil engineering camp at King's Ferry, swam across the Lake to Kidders on June 26, a distance of two and one-half miles, in two hours and fifteen minutes. He is said to have made a record for Cayuga Lake.

ALPHONSE D. WEIL '86 was Cornell's official representative at the laying of the cornerstone of the University of Louvain Library on July 29. Nearly half a million dollars was donated by Americans for the new library, which is to replace the famous one wrecked by the Germans during the war.

A SCHOLARSHIP amounting to \$12,500, "for American boys and girls of Scotch, English, and Irish parentage," is said to have been left to Cornell by the will of Mrs. Mary E. Saunders, of Yonkers. The will also provides a scholarship of like amount at Vassar and one of \$12,-000 at Columbia. All three are to be awarded by the faculty of the Yonkers High School.

HORACE.E. WHITESIDE '22, of Bell Buckle, Tennessee, won the Boardman Senior Law Prize of \$100 for the year, and Elbert P. Tuttle '23, of Ithaca, the Modern American Law Prize, consisting of a set of books by that name. The first is awarded for the best work during the first two years of the law course, and the second for the best work during the first year.

BY HIS ELECTION as Commissioner of Education for the State of New York, Dr. Frank Pierrepont Graves, now dean of the School of Education of the University of Pennsylvania, becomes an exofficio member of the Board of Trustees of Cornell, succeeding Dr. John H. Finley.

## Colonel Barton Dies

### Commandant and Alumnus Succumbs to Sudden Heart Attack.

Colonel Frank A. Barton, '91, Professor of Military Science and Tactics, and Commandant of the Cornell R. O. T. C. unit, died suddenly at the Ithaca Hospital on August 5. He had become ill while attending the summer military camp at Plattsburg, having contracted a cold as a result of unusual exertion and becoming overheated, and returned to Ithaca a week before his death. Pneumonia threatened and he was taken to the hospital, but just before his death he seemed to be recovering nicely. His family had left the hospital when an unexpected heart attack caused his death on August 5. He was retired from active Army service in 1917 on account of sickness for which his heart was apparently responsible.



Colonel Barton was born in Washington, D. C., July 25, 1869, and was graduated from Cornell with an M.E. (E.E.) degree in 1891. He was a member of Delta Upsilon, Quill and Dagger, the Unitarian Club, and the C. U. C. A., and was active in the Cadet Corps, having served as first lieutenant, later as cap-tain, and finally as colonel. During the winter course in both his sophomore and junior years he was captain of the Volunteers. He served on the Military Hop committee in 1889 and 1890, and in 1891 was chairman of the committee. He was editor of the Crank. He entered the Army from civil life, a procedure made possible by his excellent work in Sibley College, where he was an honor student. He had a brilliant military career following his appointment as second lieutenant of cavalry in 1891. He was promoted to a first lieutenancy in 1898 and served in the Philippines during the Spanish-American War and the Philippine pacification campaigns from 1899 to 1902. He was made a captain of cavalry in 1901, and in 1902 became superintendent of the Sequoia National Park in California.

In 1910 he attended the Army School

of the Line at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, where he was a distinguished graduate. He is also a graduate of the Army Staff School. He received his majority in 1916, the year before his illness necessitated his retirement from active service with the rank of lieutenant colonel.

Following his retirement, Colonel Barton was stationed at Camp MacPherson, Ga., for a short time, after which he was appointed Commandant of Cadets at Cornell University in the summer of 1917. He had previously been Commandant here from 1904 to 1908. During the University year 1917-18, the new Commandant brought the Cornell Reserve Officers' Training Corps up to a high state of efficiency, and in the fall of 1918 was responsible for the training of the Students' Army Training Corps unit at Cornell. In October, 1918, he was made officer in charge of inspection of Students' Army Training Corps units at all the universities in the Department of the East, which assignment he held until the close of the war.

The provision in the army appropriation bill of 1919 authorizing the War Department to appoint retired army officers as commandants of universities having units of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps enabled the chief of staff to assign Colonel Barton as Commandant at Ithaca once more, and he was on active duty in that capacity until the time of his death.

Colonel Barton was interested in several local activities. He was elected president of the Boy Scout Council when that body was organized in Ithaca a few months ago. He was an enthusiastic Rotarian, and a loyal supporter of Ithaca Post of the American Legion, of which he was a member. He was also a member of the Town and Gown and Country Clubs. Colonel Barton was very popular in Ithaca and the news of his death was received with genuine grief by citizens generally as well as Hill folk.

He is survived by Mrs. Barton and five children, a son, Lieutenant William W. Barton, a graduate of the United States Military Academy, who has been assigned to duty with the Cornell corps for next year, and four daughters, Harriet J., who is a member of the Class of 1924 at Cornell, Ellen, Katherine, and Wilhelmina.

The funeral was held August 8 in Sage Chapel, which was crowded with friends. The casket was draped with a huge American flag and was guarded by two members of the Regular Army stationed in Ithaca in connection with the R. O. T. C. Interment was in Lake View Cemetery where "taps" was sounded by an Army bugler.

### Why Farrand Comes

### New President Feels That Training Leads to Educational Field

On the day that the election of Livingston Farrand to be president of Cornell was announced, he told his associates at National Headquarters of the American Red Cross that he thought the field of education to be the one where he could render the greatest service. His talk, taken from *The Red Cross Bulletin*, follows:

"I am exercising a purely personal privilege in asking you to meet me today and to permit me to say a word to you in an intimate way. You have seen an announcement in the daily press this morning of my election to the presidency of Cornell University, and of my acceptance of that position to take effect at some time in the future. The report is true, but I can not allow the day to pass without making clear to you, who have been my loyal and devoted fellow workers in the Red Cross, the reason for this decision. I regret greatly the fact that circumstances did not permit me to make the announcement to you in person before it appeared in the public press. For obvious reasons this was not possible, since it was the University which had the responsibility of speaking.

"Every man must decide for himself what the field may be in which he can render the greatest service. Other things being equal, that field will be the one in which his training and experience have been the longest and most complete. I have found myself in a position where such a decision had to be made by me.

"Like many other citizens, when the war broke in 1917, I was drawn into a field of activity in France quite apart from that of my professional life. When the armistice came, I was persuaded that my responsibilities still lay in lines far removed from my former sphere. In assuming the chairmanship of the Central Committee of the American Red Cross my responsibility has been to do what I could to complete the war obligations of the great organization and to work with you in transforming it into an effective agency for times of peace. The period of transition has been complex and difficult, but in my judgment the lines have been soundly laid and the solution of our problem is in sight. With this situation I was forced to conclude that my greater opportunity of service lay in the field of education in which my professional life had been passed. I had hoped that the necessity of choice might be postponed for a time, but circumstances have forced the decision which you have heard.

"I wish you to hear this from me

personally, and my only word to you today, aside from one of gratitude for which I find no adequate expression, is to impress upon you the fact that the Red Cross with all its opportunity and with all its power is greater than any individual or group of individuals. No one is indispensable to it, but every one can and should serve in one way or another under its banner. I know of no work as inspiring as this, and nothing in my life has given the satisfaction that has my association with the Red Cross. That association I have no intention of severing, even though I can not continue in my present relation. I am not saying good-bye, for I shall not withdraw until all that I can do has been done, and until those tasks which I have personally in hand are completed. I wish in closing this purely personal talk, to thank you again from the bottom of my heart for the devotion to the ideals of the Red Cross which you, one and all, have shown; for your loyalty to the administration and for the sacrifices which you have made to enable the Red Cross to realize its purpose. That you will continue to work in the same spirit with whomever may be chosen to take up the leadership, I am entirely confident."

Commenting on his election, the Bulletin says that Dr. Farrand, as chairman of the Central Committee of the American Red Cross, "has directed the important work of transition from a war to a peace basis and the inauguration and development to date of the permanent program of the American Red Cross. As the executive head of the National Red Cross organization he has won the esteem of all his co-workers, who one and all unite in wishing him success in his new duties and in congratulating (Cornell University on securing his leadership."

#### BRISTOL GETS DEGREE

Hamilton College at the recent commencement conferred on Professor George P. Bristol, of the class of 1876, the honorary degree of L. H. D.

In conferring the degree President Ferry recalled the long connection of the family with Hamilton. Professor Bristol's great-grandfather was one of the founders of the college and was for years a trustee, his grandfather was a graduate of the first class and afterwards a trustee, and his father was a member of the faculty for several years. Professor Bristol became a member of the faculty in 1882, but left Hamilton in 1888 to begin at Cornell the thirtythree years of service now finished.

President Ferry then said: "A scholar of rare culture, author whose work contributes understanding and inspiration to the tasks of teacher and pupil, accepted leader in all that concerns the relation of the school to the college, for more than thirty years eminent as professor and administrator in Cornell University, most trusted of counselors to his Alma Mater in every time of need, George Prentice Bristol has long been worthy of the honor which the college now bestows.''

### NEW FRATERNITY HOUSE

The Phi Delta Theta House at 125 Edgemoor Lane has been sold to Lambda Chi Alpha, possession to be given September 1. Stamps on the deed would indicate a purchase price of approximately \$40,000.

Phi Delta Theta hopes to be able to occupy its new house, now under construction on Cornell Heights, by the opening of the fall term. The new house is located on property formerly owned by Professor Atkinson not far from the Frank Morse residence. It is of hollow tile and cement construction, fireproof.

The architect is William Dunbar of Cleveland, Ohio, a member of the fra-

ternity, who was graduated from the College of Architecture with the class of 1921, and is now in Ithaca supervising the work.

The estimated cost of the new house, it is understood, is in excess of \$100,-000. It is 120 feet long and 65 feet wide. There are deep porches commanding splendid views of the Lake and the Inlet valley. The exterior of the house is to be stucco. The rooms are all spacious and the house will accommodate twentyeight or thirty men.

The living room is a two-story room, higher than the entrance to the house, part of the room being a balcony to be used as a music gallery. The library is on the ground floor with French windows leading into the garden, and the dining room is on the same floor with the library.

The rooms are arranged in units, each unit providing for four men with two studies, two bed rooms, and a bath.

## BROWER '72 STILL ALIVE

Irving B. Brower, who is reported in the last '72 directory as having died in Flushing, N. Y., on April 11, 1909, has written to E. V. Wilson '72, of Athol, Mass., advising him that he did not die then but is still very much alive. This is how Wilson found him: He wrote to Washington, D. C., and the librarian of the Public Library at Flushing, without result; then he wrote the Secretary's office for the address of Brower's son, Irving C. Brower '00, but the letter sent to the address furnished was returned to him. Several months later he saw the son's address published in the ALUMNI NEWS, and wrote again to Brower in his care. The son forwarded the letter to his father, who replied to Mr. Wilson's letter. Mr. Brower has been in the insurance business in Chicago for the past eight years, and has an office at 637 Insurance Exchange. He lives at Riverside, Ill.

#### **RESOLUTIONS TO CARPENTER '06**

The World Traders of Los Angeles, of which the late George B. Carpenter '06 was president, have passed the following resolutions on his death:

Whereas, Mr. George B. Carpenter has been taken from this organization by accidental death, and

Whereas he has been, throughout the entire period of the existence of this organization, not only its founder and its president, but its constant and ever-present inspiration: the Board of Directors of the World Traders of Los Angeles, in special session, do hereby

Resolve that in the death of Mr. Carpenter, this organization, its several members in particular, and the business life of the City of Los Angeles and of the Southwest in general, have had taken away from them a man of the highest nobility of character, purity of purpose, and of unsurpassed usefulness, and that in addition to the personal loss sustained by his associates, to whom he had endeared himself, the entire business life of the Southwest has suffered irreparably through the withdrawal of his intense devotion to the advancement of its foreign commerce, which he had done so much to create and to develop.

Be it further resolved that there be sent to his family a copy of this resolution, as an expression to them of the deep sympathy and appreciation of their bereavement on behalf of his associates in this organization.

Mr. Carpenter was fatally injured in an automobile collision in Los Angeles on April 22 and died the following day. A notice of his death was printed in the ALUMNI NEWS of May 12, page 390.

#### A SOUTH AFRICAN PRESIDENCY

On May 7 Dr. Bertha Stoneman '94 was inaugurated as president of the Huguenot University College, Wellington, Cape Town, South Africa. For many years Miss Stoneman has been professor of botany and psychology at the college, and has won among students and faculty alike a position of influence of which her elevation to the presidency is but a fitting recognition.

Miss Stoneman entered Cornell with the class of '92, but her course was interrupted for two years, and she at length graduated Ph.B. with '94 and in 1896 was admitted to the degree of D.Sc. She is a member of Delta Gamma and Sigma Xi. She is a sister of Mrs. Gilbert D. Harris, and has spent many of her vacations in Ithaca at the home of Professor Harris. During her last visit, a year or two ago, she was an acting instructor in the Department of Botany.

### MEMORIAL TO POUCH '16

A memorial window is to be placed in the First Presbyterian Church, New Brighton, Staten Island, in memory of Lieutenant Harold R. Pouch, of the Rainbow Division, who died on November 21, 1918, of wounds received in action, in the Argonne. The Division will be represented in glass by a rainbow, which spans a scene in the Argonne. Special photographs have been made of the battlefield where he fell, and these will be used in making the window. Lieutenant Pouch was a graduate of the Law School, class of 1916.

#### MILWAUKEE BROIL

The First Annual Cornell Broil, staged on July 16 by the Cornell University Alumni Association of Milwaukee, was a big day. The story is best told in the following extract from a letter from one of the participants:

"The day was perfect. The big doings started at about ten o'clock in the morning when Clif Stevens '06 and Al Mellowes '06 arrived with the food and the two African cooks. The first job was to fit up a five-foot-square open air hot grill. The fire was started in the morning, and by night we added charcoal for the chickens to broil over, but that part comes later.

"By eleven o'clock we had enough of

a crowd to start our swimming events off Eschweiler's pier in North Lake. The main event was a fifty-yard dash which started in waist-high water and ended out in the lake in about twenty feet of water where you could not stand when you most wanted to. Ed Foote '06 was judge, but there was too much splashing to locate a winner. The next contest was fancy diving in which Dudley Montgomery '06 drew the first prize. He tried anything once.

"After the morning's swim we all went back to the picnic grounds and ate our own lunch. By two o'clock we had a full crowd, the total being sixty-six, including guests.

"The main event of the afternoon was a baseball game between the odd and even classes. Ed Foote captained even classes and Al Slocum '13 the odd, with the odds putting it over the evens by about ten to one." Lew Tatum '97 was umpire when the rest of the teams weren't. Everybody had a chance to play on both teams so there was plenty of irregular baseball.


"After the ball game we all went over to the summer place of Jimmy Friend '16 and went in swimming there. The chief sport was aquaplaning behind Jimmy's thirty-foot motor boat. Everybody had a chance who wanted to. It was the greatest sport of the day, especially when the rider got dumped off and had to swim for it. The canoe tilting contest was the next most popular water event, and the only unscheduled part of the program was the breaking of the pier with about twenty of the audience watching the contest. This was a big surprise but resulted in no serious accidents.

"When we got back from our afternoon's swim the chickens were beginning to give out delicious odors. The grill was simply covered with wonderful spring chickens being swabbed with a long stick covered with cloth and butter. Our menu consisted of broiled chicken, potatoes au gratin, corn on the cob, rolls, iced tea, and ice cream cones. It was a real feast.

"Quoits and African golf took up inbetween-times. After dinner everybody gathered around the fire and had a good old-fashioned sing and about nine o'clock the first annual picnic of the Milwaukee club ended with the Evening Song. It was the most successful gathering we have ever had and everybody said they had a good time. Not the least important factor in the success of the party was the enthusiasm shown by the class of 1906. Fresh from their fifteenyear reunion in Ithaca, the '06 men in their uniforms dominated the party."

JUNE AND JULY were the sunniest periods in Ithaca in eight years, with 64 percent of possible sunshine; in 1913 there was 70 percent. Ithaca is within a recognized cloud belt.

#### A UNIVERSITY UNION

Harold Flack '12, secretary of the Cornellian Council, has written the following as a result of a recent visit to Hart House, the new University Union at the University of Toronto:

As stated in the preliminary announcement of Hart House, the origin of the plan came from a proposal to the University of Toronto by the trustees of the estate of Hart A. Massey to erect and to give the University a building containing a Students' Union, hall, and Y. M. C. A. rooms. It was felt that a building of this kind would serve a very useful purpose as a place where the men of the entire University could meet on common ground.

Since that time the scope of the undertaking has been greatly enlarged. "The plans have been extended to include a section for the Athletic Association, with gymnasia, indoor running track, boxing, fencing and wrestling rooms, racquet courts and a large swimming pool; dining hall; fully equipped theatre; a library; a small chapel; a music room; an indoor rifle range; a sketch room; photographic rooms; the faculty Union; and common rooms, reading rooms, billiard room and club and committee rooms for general use."

The building is in reality a center for all undergraduate life and activity at the University of Toronto and during my brief visit, comprising less than a day, I saw its facilities used by several hundred students. The great hall was completely filled for luncheon; the balcony which is reserved for members of the faculty contained about one hundred, including Sir Robert A. Falconer, the president of the University. The largest common room was occupied by fifty or sixty undergraduates; the pool and billiard room, which contained a dozen or more tables, had fifty or sixty students either playing or looking on; the library was being used by thirty or more students; various games were going on in the two gymnasia and a number of men were making use of the swimming pool. All of this I saw between the hours of eleven in the morning and two in the afternoon.

The building is constructed of stone of the English collegiate gothic style, and in some respects reminds one of our new residential halls. It is probably three hundred feet long by about two hundred fifty feet wide and is around a court. It is five stories high, including a basement and a sub-basement. Strange as it may seem, the theatre, which is complete in every detail, is built under the court on the lower two floors. The building itself is fully as beautiful in its architecture and in the details of its interior decorations as the buildings of the older English universities, and the only thing that it lacks now is usage and traditions.

Hart House is administered by a board of stewards and by several committees serving under this board. The administrative officer of the institution is the warden who lives in the building and who has a suite of offices there. The-Union is largely supported by a fee of. \$8.00 which is compulsory and is collected from every undergraduate of the University at the time of the payment of tuition. Fees are also paid by members of the faculty who belong to the Union,. there being several common rooms and other special facilities provided forthe alumni. As this income is not quiteadequate to pay all of the expenses, a plan is under way to ask the Province of Cutario to make up the deficit. The feewhich the undergraduates pay not only includes all club dues in connection with Hart House but also the fee of the Students' Administrative Council and membership in the Athletic Association. The membership fee for members of thefaculty is \$5.00 a year and the fee forgraduates of the University is \$10.00 annually.

On the fifth floor several suites of rooms with private baths are provided It has already been discovered, however, that the provision is not nearly adequate and the management is now looking for additional space for this purpose. The University of Michigan Union has provided the two upper floors of its building containing 153 rooms and private baths for alumni and guests of the University, and during certain periods of the year these rooms are all occupied. It is perfectly natural that alumni on their return to the University should want to live in the very heart of all undergraduate life, and such a provision for their entertainment undoubtedly encourages a far larger number to return.

My purpose in writing this is to keep before the alumni of Cornell not only the desirability but the urgent necessity of providing a Union on the Cornell campus. It is true that Barnes Hall has begun the germ of the idea and with its new coffee house and greatly improved lounging rooms, it is providing a social center which is available to all the members of the student body and Faculty, but in order to provide for the centering of all University activities in one building we must have one as large as the Union at the University or Toronto or at the University of Michigan. While they have found it desirable at Toronto to include as a part of their Union a gymnasium, a running track, a swimming pool, a fencing, boxing, and wrestling room, and the offices of the Athletic Association, it does not seem wise or desirable to include this as a part of a Union. In fact it is highly desirable that all athletics and purely physical recreational facilities be provided in a new gymnasium on Alumni Field. The Union should, however, contain a swimming pool and bowling alley in addition to the facilities ordinarily provided in a modern club house.

There has been a movement under way for several years to provide a dining hall in the center of the new dormitory group in the location of the present Baker Cafeteria. In the light of the experience of other universities, it would seem highly desirable to combine this dining hall and the Union. Where the undergraduates go for their meals there should be all the recreational facilities which are afforded in a Union. And in providing for the dining hall, it would be highly desirable to provide not only a great hall similar to the halls of Oxford and Cambridge which might seat four or five hundred at a time, but numerous dining rooms which might be reserved for smaller groups of students who desire to have their meals together. Experience at Yale and Harvard has shown that students do not desire to take their meals in a tremendous hall continuously for a long period. After dining for a month in a hall which has facilities for two thousand a student becomes tired of the noise and rattle of dishes and seeks a quieter place away from the crowd.

Now as to the location of such a building: If it were possible to complete immediately the group of residential halls which has been started and if it were possible to build additional halls of residence between the University Library and South Avenue so that every student who so desired might live in one of the dormitories, it would be highly desirable to construct the Union in the center of this group, probably where Baker Cafeteria now stands, but if these buildings are not to be completed for many years to come, it would seem more desirable to build on Central Avenue south of the Library, on the ground now occupied by the residences of several members of the Faculty. At the present time, several times as many students pass this particular spot on their way to and from classes than any other spot on the University Campus. It is natural that a Union and dining hall should be provided on that location where the larger proportion of students pass during their daily routine. It is a question whether the large number of students who live beyond Cascadilla Gorge would come all the way down the Library Slope for luncheon or dinner if they had to ascend the hill again to their rooms. Also, with the constantly increasing number of afternoon classes, it will be more and more the custom of the undergraduates to remain on the campus for lunch and if facilities were provided on Central Avenue, the maxium number of students would take advantage of it.

However, the location of the building can be very quickly decided upon when the necessary funds for its construction are in sight. It is obviously impossible to start a campaign for a Union building. The field of alumni has been so thoroughly canvassed for the Semi-Centennial Endowment that an additional campaign at this time, either among the alumni or the undergraduates would not be popular nor could it produce the amount necessary for this purpose. It is earnestly hoped that some good friend or friends of the University who may be in a position to make a fairly large gift will realize that this is one of the greatest needs of the University.

Cornell is famous for her spirit of democracy, for her student life, and for the comradship of her students, but we shall never have a truly ideal University life until a social center is established where the fraternity man and the non-fraternity man, the student and the Faculty, the American and the forigner, the rich and the poor, the undergraduate and the alumnus, have a common meeting place on the campus.

Ross W. KELLOGG '12 has been authorized by the City of Ithaca to prepare a memorial biography of the late Edwin C. Stewart. A committee has also been appointed to select and erect an appropriate permanent memorial.

#### MICHIGAN FROSH

The Cornell University Association of Michigan will make sure that no freshman enters Cornell this fall from that state without a definite feeling that he belongs, and that someone else besides his mother is interested in his college career. The elub will hold an outing in September with the freshmen who are about to enter as guests of honor. Undergraduates who are home on their vacation will also join forces with the local alumni. Reports from other points around the country indicate that similar events will be held for the freshmen in these sections.

# OBITUARY

### Prof. Charles H. Royce '91

Charles Howard Royce, extension professor of animal husbandry in the New York State College of Agriculture, died at the Ithaca City Hospital on August 5 of injuries sustained in a fall from a silo on his farm at Newfield. While helping his son and other helpers in building a chute on his silo, he slipped from the temporary staging and fell about thirty feet to the ground. In the fall his body was wedged between two structures, and this is thought to have caused the breaking of one rib, which punctured a lung, and the fracture of nine others.

He was born on May 11, 1866, in Mongaup Valley, Sullivan County, N. Y., and entered the College of Agriculture in 1887, receiving the degrees of B.S. and M.S.A. in 1891 and 1892, respectively. He was a member of the C. U. C. A. and the Cornell University Agricultural Association. Soon after the completion of his work he went to the

University of Wisconsin, where he became associated with Professor S. M. Babcock, whom he assisted in perfecting the Babcock test for determining the percentage of butter-fat in milk. Then he spent about twenty-three years as superintendent of large estates, chief among which was the famous establishment of former Vice-President Levi P. Morton. It was while acting as superintendent for Mr. Morton that Professor Royce first came into prominence as a Guernsev breeder, because of his work in the interests of advanced registration of pure-bred cattle. He later came to be one of the leading American authorities on Guernsey cattle.

He came to the College of Agriculture in 1916 as assistant professor of animal husbandry, and had been active in all forms of rural activities in the county, being particularly interested in school problems. Last June he was made a full professor.

Professor Royce is survived by his widow, three daughters, Mrs. M. L. Patten, of Virginia, Miss Esther T. Royce '18, home bureau manager for Cayuga County, and Miss Elizabeth H. Royce '22, of New York, a son, Milton P. Royce '20, and two sisters, Miss Mary E. Royce and Mrs. E. B. Merritt.

#### John C. McMynn '91

John Clarke McMynn, the engineer who designed the giant Ferris wheel operated during the World's Fair in Chicago, died in Chicago on July 7. Mc-Mynn came to Cornell in 1890, and received the degree of M.E. in 1891, and that of M.M.E. in 1892. He was a member of Chi Psi. For a number of years he was engaged in the practice of his profession in Chicago and designed many boats, boilers, and factories, and he was the builder of the town of Zeigler, Ill. For ten years he was editor of *Electrical Engineering*.

#### Dr. Sarah E. Finch '04

Dr. Sarah Elizabeth Finch died suddenly in the Lenox Hill Hospital, New York, on June 21. She had undergone an operation, and died of heart failure.

She was born on March 3, 1881, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lounsberry Finch. She attended Syracuse University, where she was graduated with the degree of B.A., and entered the Cornell Medical College in 1902, receiving the degree of M.D. in 1904.

She was bacteriologist in the New York Skin and Cancer Hospital for several years, and had also practiced in Connecticut. She was a member of the Connecticut Medical Association, the Fairfield County Medical Association, and several scientific bodies.

Dr. Finch is survived by her parents and a brother, Edward, all of Sound Beach, Conn.

### John D. Collins '06

John Dempsey Collins, a prominent Ithaca attorney, and former district attorney of Tompkins County and leader of the county bar, died on July 22 at his home, after an illness of two weeks. Death was due to general septicemia resulting from a diseased condition of the bones of the right leg, caused by an illness of scarlet fever when he was ten years old.

Collins was born in Elmira, N. Y., on January 10, 1882, the son of Mr. and Mrs. John H. Collins. When a boy, he moved with his parents to Ithaca, where he attended the Parochial School and the Ithaca High School. While in high school he took a special interest in athletics, and was manager of one of the school's football teams. He entered the University in 1902 in the course of arts, and received his A.B. degree in 1906. Then he entered the Law School, receiving the degree of LL.B. in 1908. He was a member of Gemel Kharm and the Cricket Club, and served on various undergraduate committees.

After his graduation he took a trip abroad and on his return began the practice of law in the offices of Attorney George B. Davis, later opening an office for himself. In 1914, when Morris S. Halliday '06, then district attorney, was elected state senator, Collins was appointed by Governor Whitman to fill his unexpired term. On the expiration of his term as district attorney, Collins resumed the private practice, and in 1917 became associated with Attorney Fitch H. Stephens '06, under the firm name of Stephens and Collins, with offices at 102 West State Street. During the war he spent nearly a year in campaign work for the Fourth Liberty Loan. and was so successful in his work that he was asked to remain permanently in Government service, but he preferred to return to Ithaca and resume the practice of law.

Collins was a member of the Ithaca Lodge of Elks and the Tompkins County Bar Association. He was married on October 20, 1920, to Miss Elizabeth Fox, of Scranton, Pa., who survives him, with his parents.

#### Mrs. John L. Morris

Mrs. John L. Morris, died suddenly on July 9 at her home, 108 North Geneva Street, Ithaca. She had been in poor health for a number of years, but her death came as a shock to her many friends.

Mrs. Morris was born in Ithaca, May 23, 1841, the youngest daughter of Chauncey G. Heath and Susan Cantine. On October 5, 1859, she was married in Ithaca to the late John B. Yates Sommers and lived in New York until the death of Mr. Sommers. Then she returned to Ithaca with her two children, Frederick Skelding Sommers '82 and Henry Cantine Sommers '81.

On July 23, 1867, Mrs. Sommers marricd the late Samuel H. Wilcox, by whom she had one son, who died in boyhood. Mr. Wilcox died in 1883.

On June 22, 1897, Mrs. Wilcox became the wife of Professor John Lewis Morris of Sibley College, who died in Ithaca, November 19, 1905.

Mrs. Morris was a charter member of the board of directors of the Children's Home, and a member of the Congregational Church. She leaves her eldest son, Frederick S. Sommers, and a sister, Mrs. James B. Taylor, sr., of Ithaca.

#### Mrs. R. B. Hinman

Mrs. R. B. Hinman, wife of Professor Hinman of the Department of Animal Husbandry, died at the City Hospital on May 22 after an operation for appendicitis. Mrs. Hinman came with her husband to Cornell in the summer of 1920, and had been much interested in the activities of the younger members of the University community.

## INTERCOLLEGIATE NOTES

VIRGINIA had on July 9 obtained \$1,272,725.25 of the three millions sought for added endowment.

BOTH the bow and the stroke (John H. Leh) of this year's Princeton crew are members of Phi Beta Kappa; and all the others with only one exception are high-stand men. One of these men said, "I never felt a desire to study until I started to row."

BY A RECENT act of the Legislature the salaries of teachers in Hunter College and the College of the City of New York have been fixed within certain limits. The presidents will receive \$10,000-\$12,500; professors, \$5,000-\$8,000; curators and auditors, \$4,000-\$6,000; lecturers, \$2,000-\$4,000; associate professors, \$4,500-\$5,000; assistant professors, \$3,-000-\$4,000; intsructors, \$2,000-\$3,500; elerical, laboratory, and investigation assistants, \$1,400-\$2,400; tutors, \$1,000-\$2,000; fellows, \$500-\$1,000.

AT MICHIGAN the Student Advisory Committee has ruled that there shall be no more kidnaping.

MICHIGAN has established a School of Education, of which Professor Allen S. Whitney will be acting dean.

BROWN has announced that the threemillion-dollar endowment fund has been oversubscribed, the total amount being actually \$3,500,628.

DR. JAMES R. DAY has resigned the chancellorship of Syracuse University. In October he will be seventy-six years of age. He has been at the head of Syracuse for twenty-seven years.

# The American of Today

The Armies of Labor: a chronicle of the Organized Wage-Earners. The Boss and the Machine: a Chronicle of the Politicians and Party Organization. Our Foreigners: a Chronicle of Americans in the Making. By Samuel P. Orth. New Haven. Yale University Press. 1919-20. 8vo. pp. viii, 279; x, 203; xii, 255. Illustrated. The Chronicles of America 35, 40, 43.

In these volumes we have three substantial and important contributions to the story of the development of modern America. Securing the rights of the laborer, honest government, immigration: surely no problems have been more insistent, more perplexing than these; and the story of how our country has progressed in the attempt to solve them is one of entrancing interest. In these words Professor Orth gives an eminently fair summary of the labor advance:

"As one looks back upon the history of the workman, one finds something impressive, even majestic, in the rise of the fourth estate from a humble estate to one of power in this democratic nation. In this rise of fortune the laborer's union has unquestionably been a moving force, perhaps even the leading cause. At least this homogeneous mass of workingmen, guided by self-developed leadership, has aroused society to safeguard more carefully the individual needs of all its parts. Labor has awakened the state to a sense of responsibility for its great sins of neglect and has made it conscious of its social duties. Labor, like other elements of society, has often been selfish, narrow, vindictive; but it has also shown itself earnest and constructive. The conservative trades union . . . stands as a bulwark between that amorphous, inefficient, irresponsible Socialism which has made Russia a lurid warning and Prussia a word of scorn, and that rational social ideal which is founded upon the conviction that society is ultimately an organic spiritual unity."

Most interesting and encouraging is the record of the progress of clean government. The Tweed Ring, the Philadelphia Gas Ring, and the St. Louis Franchise Deal are sad blots on our institutions; but the people are learning, slowly but surely, how to deal with such offenders, and the fact that "murder will out" will tend more and more to give pause to intelligent but unscrupulous politicians. There will be nothing but increasing contempt for public men who fatten at the expense of the people. Moreover, the need of trained experts has been driven home by recent events; and the scientific expert is perhaps less susceptible to bribery than the ignorant and unresourceful person.

In "Our Foreigners" the author systematically describes the tide of immigration from the different European, Asiatic, and African groups. A whole chapter is devoted, naturally, to the Irish, and another to the Teutonic element; to both the author is eminently fair. On the problem of Japanese and Chinese immigration he expresses no opinion, confining himself to a full statement of objective facts. A curious and interesting chapter is the one on the many Utopias which immigrants have attempted to found on American soil.

Finally, we note the pleasing style in which these volumes are written, a style marked by many humorous or unexpected felicitous turns of expression, which help to give the reader constant joy.

### Farms of the Empire State

Rural New York. By Elmer O. Fippin, '04-5 Grad., Extension Professor of Soil Technology in the College of Agriculture. New York. The Macmillan Company. 1921. Sm. 8vo, pp. xviii, 381. Illustrated. Rural State and Provincial Series 1. Prices, \$2.50.

The worst thing one can say about this useful book is that some of the illustrations are too small, so that one has to use a magnifying glass to make out their details. In future numbers of this series we have no doubt that this defect will not be found.

It is fitting that New York should lead off in the list of States which it is the hope and the intention of the editor to have included in the series. Not that the State is remarkable for size; but it is one of the older States; it is largely (though not predominantly) an agricultural State; and in the study of rural problems its sons, native and adopted, have taken a leading place in our country.

The author first discusses the physical and climatic setting of the State, then sketches the history of agriculture in the State. His chapter on soils is based on wide and exact knowledge gained at first hand from many years of study and travel throughout the State. A brief chapter on fish and game, mines and quarries, and water supply, is followed by the two principal chapters, dealing with the agricultural industries, plants and crops and the animal industries. Other chapters deal with markets, rural manufactures, administrative and regulatory organizations (such as the Council of Farms and Markets and the Conservation Commission), the educational

and research organizations, and the outlook for farming. He hopes to see an adequate soil survey, geological, chemical, and physical; more study of weather and climate; larger crops through scientific adaptation of varieties; better adaptation in types and numbers of livestock; more efficient marketing and distribution; improved educational and social facilities for the country-dweller; more intelligent and increased State encouragement of research; and better organization of the forces directing and controlling State supervision of agriculture and rural interests. He rightly emphasizes, also, the need of improving not only crops and live stock, but men and women.

The book is well written, comprehensive, systematic; a worthy initial number of a series which we hope will be carried through to completion.

#### Books and Magazine Articles

Emeritus Professor W. Gilman Thompson contributes to *The New York Times* for June 26 a note on "A Retiring Age for Statues." The same number includes an illustrated review by T. R. Ybarra of "Let 'Er Buck," which is soon to be published, through the Putnams, by Charles Wellington Furlong '02.

In School and Society for June 25 Professor Elsie Murray '04, of Sweet Briar College, writes on ''The New Humanities.''

Professor Oliver F. Emerson, Ph.D. '91, of Western 'Reserve University, in *The Modern Language Review* for April discusses ''Grendel's Motive in Attacking Heorot,'' in ''Beowulf.'' Professor Crane's ''Italian Social Customs in the Sixteenth Century'' is favorably reviewed by Edmund G. Gardner.

In Modern Language Notes for June Professor George I. Dale '10, of Washington University, discusses "The Date of Antonio de Villegas' Death."

The Modern Humanities Research Association of England has just published a "Bibliography of English Language and Literature for 1920." Professor Clark S. Northup '93 was in charge of the contributions from America, and among his assistants was Professor Leslie N. Broughton, Ph.D. '11.

Professor Albert T. Olmstead '02, of the University of Illinois, writes in The American Journal of Semitic Languages and Literatures for April on "Babylonia as an Assyrian Dependency."

*Bird-Lore* for May-June includes an article on "Summer Bird Study" by Professor Arthur A. Allen '07:
