Migrant Farm Labor in the Census of Agriculture

Summary: Specific questions about migrant farm works were asked in the three most recent Agricultural Censuses. In the 2012 Census of Agriculture, the number of migrant farm workers is asked. In 2007 and 2002, respondents are asked if any migrant farm workers were hired, but not the number of such workers. In 2002, this question was only asked of a sample of respondents (approximately 25% of all operations on the mailing list). None of these questions asks the about the citizenship status of migrant workers.

Farm labor outside the Census of Agriculture

NASS also conducts the **Farm Labor Survey (FLS)** in partnership with the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Details can be found here:

This survey collects information from employers about the number of workers and wages paid by class, but migrant is not a defined worker class. You can play with report totals from this data using the USDA quick stats website (http://quickstats.nass.usda.gov/). To do so, set (double-click) in order:

Program: Survey; Sector: Economics; Group: Expenses; Commodity: Labor

The Current Population Survey (CPS) conducted by the Census Bureau asks about type of employment and US citizenship, but does not ask whether non-citizens are working without legal authorization.

The Department of Labor also collects information on farm laborers through the **National Agricultural Workers Survey (NAWS)**, which interviews workers at their place of employment (in contrast to FLS, which interviews employers): https://www.doleta.gov/agworker/naws.cfm

NAWS only considers workers involved in crop production (not livestock production, which accounts for 44% of agricultural labor in the United States) and workers in agricultural support services for crop production. This survey asks workers about place of birth, length of time in US, movement across international borders in the past year, and family members located in other countries. *It also ascertains citizenship and whether non-citizens are working with legal authorization.*
