This document provides basic information concerning the operational affairs of the Delta Chi Chapter of Delta Kappa Epsilon at Cornell University. It is intended to be a handy reference for those brothers who are concerned with the administration of the chapter's undergraduate affairs in Ithaca and also with alumni affairs throughout the country.

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I. The International Fraternity Organization

A. Legal Status. The Fraternity was founded with the Phi Chapter at Yale University on 22 June 1844. On 12 June 1884, the New York State Legislature passed an act "to incorporate the Council of Delta Kappa Epsilon, and provide for the organization of subordinate chapters." [Laws of 1884, 107th Session, NYS Legislature, Chapter 520].

B. Constitution. The Fraternity is organized and administered in accordance with *The Constitution of Delta Kappa Epsilon* as amended on 2 December 1985.

C. Objects. The objects of Delta Kappa Epsilon are the cultivation of general literature and social culture, the advancement and encouragement of intellectual excellence, the promotion of honorable friendship and useful citizenship, the maintenance of gentlemanly dignity, self-respect and morality in all circumstances, and the union of stout hearts and kindred interests to secure to merit its due reward.

D. Board of Directors of Delta Kappa Epsilon. This is the central governing authority for the Fraternity. It is comprised of seven Regional Directors, seven Directors-at-Large and one Undergraduate Director. Brother Henry H. Michaels, Jr., Rho '31 is now serving as the Chairman of the Board.

E. International Headquarters. The Fraternity is headquartered at 35 McKinley Place, Gross Pointe Farms MI 48236-9940 (TEL: 313-886-2400, FAX: 313-886-2227). The following serve on the Headquarters staff.

F. The Rampant Lion Foundation. This is a tax exempt public charitable organization (IRS ¶501(c)3, EIN #38-2407195) that awards scholarships, educational grants and maintains the Hall of Delta Kappa Epsilon in Ann Arbor MI. To this end, it maintains computerized records and provides administrative support for DKE fund raising activities. Brother David K. Easlick, Jr., Omicron '69, serves as President.

G. Publications. The Fraternity publishes *The Deke Quarterly* (ISSN #0164-8314) on an intermittent basis. The most recently published membership list was promulgated in *The Delta Kappa Epsilon Alumni Directory* (White Plains NY: Bernard C. Harris Publishing Co., 1994).

H. Conventions and Conferences. The Fraternity holds conventions and conferences on alternating years. The last DKE Convention, the 150th, convened at Florida's Innesbrook Resort on 8-12 June 1994. The most recent DKE Regional Conference convened during February 1994 at Cornell University.

II. The Undergraduate Organization

A. Legal Status. The Delta Chi Chapter of Delta Kappa Epsilon was chartered by the Phi Chapter of Delta Kappa Epsilon with an effective date of 11 February 1870. THE DELTA KAPPA EPSILON FRATERNITY AT CORNELL UNIVERSITY was incorporated in the State of New York on 5 November 1883 "for the purpose of mental, moral and social improvement."

B. Bylaws and House Rules. The Chapter is organized and governed in accordance with *Chapter Bylaws* ratified on 9 April 1990. In addition, members are bound by the provisions of subordinate *House Rules* (compiled and published on 12 December 1994) that govern conduct, discipline, decorum and other such matters.

C. Objectives, Operations and Responsibilities. The organization (1) operates a fraternal association, (2) manages a residence facility, (3) runs a dining service, and (4) conducts social entertainments for the benefit of its active members and alumni.

D. Office. The legal address for the chapter is that of the lodge: *The Deke House*, 13 South Avenue, Ithaca NY 14850-3985. The House telephone numbers are (607) 272-4948 for the residence and (607) 272-6052 for the kitchen.

E. Federal Tax Status. The chapter is registered with the Internal Revenue Service as an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code as per a group ruling letter issued to the Delta Kappa Epsilon Council in January 1943. The federal Employee Identification Number (EIN) for The Delta Chi Chapter of DKE is 15-0287600.

F. State Tax Status. The chapter is recognized as a "not for profit" corporation by the Division of Corporation Records, NYS Department of State, in a letter (J. C. Aube) dated 23 April 1987.

G. Elected Officers and Committee Assignments. See Appendices A and B.

H. Schedule of Charges. The chapter recognizes four categories of undergraduate affiliation for purposes of billing: (1) pledge members, (2) resident active members, (3) non-resident active members, and (4) non-members (live-in boarders). The system of charges assignable to these individuals breaks down as follows:

1. Ordinary Charges

- a. rent (fall & spring terms)
- b. rent (summer term)
- c. board
- d. lodge maintenance (presently included in rent)
- e. chapter dues (presently included in rent)

- f. social subscription
- g. athletic subscription (presently included in rent)

2. Extraordinary Charges

- a. security damage deposit (refundable)
- b. initiation fee
- c. guest charges (presently unscheduled)
- d. special tax or levy
- e. disciplinary fine

See Appendix C for the current schedule of charges.

I. Accounting Data.

1. The chapter's operational accounts are administered by a professional accountant who provides the following services:
 - a. maintenance of the DKE checking account;
 - b. preparation of monthly financial statements for the eight months when the University is in session;
 - c. preparation of a year-end financial statement;
 - d. annual preparation and filing of the following U. S. Internal Revenue Service Forms: (1) Form W-4, Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate, (2) Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, and (3) Form 990T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return;
 - e. annual preparation and filing of the following New York State Department of Taxation and Finance tax forms: (1) Form CT-13, Unrelated Business Income Tax Return, and (2) Form IT-2104, Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate; and
 - f. annual preparation and filing of OMB Form I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification.

The accountant also provides general advice and guidance with regard to preparation of the chapter's annual operating budget.

2. The chapter's fiscal year ends on 30 June.
3. The chapter deposits funds into two Cornell University administered accounts: (a) an operating account and (b) a facility reserve fund. See §IV (Cornell University).

4. The chapter participates in the Cornell Bursar Billing Program.

J. DKE Depository. The records, correspondence, publications and selected artifacts of the chapter are held in the DKE Depository maintained by the Cornell University Library's Rare and Manuscript Collections Department, Carl A. Kroch Library, Ithaca NY 14853-5302, (607) 255-3530, under terms set forth in a formal MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING dated 29 February 1988 and executed on 4 March 1988.

K. Publications. The following publications are issued by the chapter.

1. Newsletter. The chapter publishes *The Delta Chi Deke* newsletter (ISSN #0895-5255, registered on 10 September 1987 with the Library of Congress National Serials Data Program) under the direction of an undergraduate editor and distributes same to all alumni and friends of Delta Chi. Back issues dating from Volume I, Number 1 (May 1935), are held in the DKE Depository.
2. Rush Book. The chapter contributes an entry that is published in the IntraFraternity Council Rush Book in the fall of each year. This activity is coordinated by the Office of the Dean of Students.
3. *Cornellian* announcement. The chapter provides photography depicting the lodge and brotherhood for this annual publication.
4. Christmas Cards. The chapter sends an annual Christmas greeting to all alumni and friends of the chapter.
5. Directories. The chapter has published membership directories in 1920, 1934, 1950, 1971, 1974, 1983 and 1993.

L. Chapter House and Grounds. The 13 South Avenue property (City of Ithaca tax parcel #31-1-10) and the lodge thereon known as *The Deke House* are owned by Cornell University.

1. The lodge has been listed on the NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES managed by the U. S. Department of the Interior National Park Service since 11 January 1991 (cf. National Register Inventory System #90002144) consequent to a petition filed by THE DELTA CHI ASSOCIATION on 20 August 1988.
2. The lodge has also been listed on the NEW YORK STATE REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES managed by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic

Preservation, since 3 December 1990 as a result of a collateral petition filed on 25 September 1988.

3. The two Roosevelt Spruce Trees (*picea abies*) standing on the west lawn are listed on THE NEW YORK STATE REGISTRY OF FAMOUS AND HISTORIC TREES administered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, 50 Wolf Road, Albany NY 12233-4253. A petition to list these conifers with the Famous & Historic Trees Program of the AMERICAN FORESTRY ASSOCIATION was filed on 22 January 1994.
4. THE DELTA CHI ASSOCIATION is at present considering registration of the lodge on the HISTORIC AMERICAN BUILDING SURVEY managed by the U. S. Department of the Interior's National Park Service.

M. Dining Services. Meals are served at the lodge in accordance with the following schedule during the regular academic terms. "Self Service" denotes a make-your-own meal in the Kitchen.

N. Trademarks and Emblems.

1. The armorial bearings of the Delta Chi Chapter of Delta Kappa Epsilon are listed with the American College of Heraldry, Drawer CG, University of Alabama, Tuscaloosa AL 35486-2887, as Registration Number 715, effective as of 14 October 1987.

An application for listing this insignia as a Collective Membership Mark on the Principal Register of the U. S. Patent and Trademark office is under consideration.

2. The Delta Chi Monogram is not currently registered with any authority.

O. Insurance.

1. The undergraduate chapter relies on the protection of Cornell University for property and casualty indemnification and restoration in the event of mishap.
2. The chapter is not a member of the CORNELL FRATERNITY INSURANCE PURCHASING GROUP (FIPG).
3. The chapter subscribes to a liability insurance policy underwritten by MOUNT HAWLEY, INC., and sponsored by the DKE International Headquarters. The premium is assessed at a rate of \$75 per active member per annum based on the chapter's membership roll on 1 November. Coverage is limited to \$1,000,000 per occurrence with certain exceptions.

P. University Affiliations.

1. The Chapter is a full member in good standing of the INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL OF CORNELL UNIVERSITY as defined by the constitution of that body. The IFC maintains an office at 314 Noyes Center, (607) 255-5183.
2. The Chapter recognizes the jurisdiction of the GREEK JUDICIAL COMMITTEE.
3. The Chapter recognizes GREEKS ADVOCATING MATURE MANAGEMENT OF ALCOHOL (the GAMMA Committee) and subscribes to GAMMA guidelines prescribing the conduct of entertainment functions.

Q. Employees.

1. Current. Mrs. Robin Harrington serves as House Cook.
2. Retired. Mrs. Florence Lansdowne (RFD #1, Locke NY 13092) served as House Cook from 1963 until 1987.

III. The Alumni Organization

A. Legal Status. THE DELTA CHI ASSOCIATION was incorporated in the state of New York on 9 March 1888 pursuant to Chapter 267 of the 1875 Laws of the State of New York "to promote social intercourse among ourselves and other members of the Delta Chi Chapter of the Delta Kappa Epsilon Fraternity, to provide facilities for such intercourse, and in general to promote the welfare of said Delta Chi Chapter and of the Cornell University."

B. Bylaws. The association is organized and administered in accordance with a *Proposed Amendment to the Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws of the Delta Chi Association* dated 20 November 1988.

C. Objectives, Operations and Responsibilities. As a vendor, THE DELTA CHI ASSOCIATION, INC., provides the following services to THE DELTA KAPPA EPSILON FRATERNITY AT CORNELL UNIVERSITY, INC., upon request and receipt of due consideration: (1) alumni contact activities, (2) fund raising programs, (3) organizational management advice, (4) architectural, engineering and restoration consulting directed towards preservation of the chapter lodge, and (5) historical research.

D. Limitations. THE DELTA CHI ASSOCIATION, INC., does not in any way operate or otherwise control THE DELTA KAPPA EPSILON FRATERNITY AT CORNELL UNIVERSITY, INC., the undergraduate organization at Cornell.

E. Federal Tax Status. The association is not recognized by the Internal Revenue Service and does not have an assigned Employer Identification Number.

F. State Tax Status. The chapter is recognized as a not-for-profit corporation by the Division of Corporation Records, NYS Department of State, in a letter (J. C. Aube) dated 23 April 1987.

G. Organization. The association is currently served by the following officers:

L. Publications.

1. The Association publishes an annual *Chapter and Alumni Operations Handbook*.
2. The Association files an annual meeting notice for publication in the *Cornell Reunion Program* with the Director, Class Programs, Office of Alumni Affairs, Alumni House, 626 Thurston Avenue, Ithaca NY 14850-2490, (607) 255-2390. The copy deadline is the first day of March in the year of the reunion meeting.

M. Historical Research. The Association sponsors a continuing project aimed at documenting the history of the undergraduate chapter. See *Appendix E* for a list of published material, studies and reports in progress.

N. Accounting Data.

1. The association maintains a checking account with CITIZENS SAVINGS BANK, Tioga and Seneca Streets, Ithaca NY 14850, (607) 273-7111.
2. The association maintains a brokerage investment account with DEAN WITTER REYNOLDS, INC.
3. The association solicits funds for a Cornell University administered contributions account. See §IV (Cornell University).

4. The association approves an annual budget having line items for PROJECTED INCOME (dues, contributions, interest and dividends) and PROJECTED EXPENSES (alumni services, lodge maintenance grants, lodge improvement grants, restoration grants, education grants, special projects and investments).
5. Income derived from investment interest and dividends is reported to the Internal Revenue Service and the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance by THE DELTA KAPPA EPSILON FRATERNITY AT CORNELL UNIVERSITY, INC., using the federal EIN for that body.

O. Affiliations. The association is an active member of the Cornell University Alumni Interfraternity Council.

IV. Cornell University

A. Founding. The University was formally established by the signature of Governor Rueben E. Fenton to Chapter 585, Laws of 1865, New York State Legislature, on 27 April 1865, as the State's land grant institution under the U. S. Morrill Act of 1862. The first meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on the following day in Albany and included the Governor, Ezra Cornell and Horace Greeley.

B. Status. The University is a private, not-for-profit, co-educational, non-sectarian institution of higher learning.

C. Communications. The mailing address is Cornell University, Ithaca NY 14853. The main switchboard number is (607) 255-2000.

D. Accounts. Cornell University administers several accounts on behalf of the resident undergraduate chapter (THE DELTA KAPPA EPSILON FRATERNITY AT CORNELL UNIVERSITY) and the alumni society (THE DELTA CHI ASSOCIATION):

1. A Social/Miscellaneous Operating Account (#H86-3826) connected to the University Bursar's Student Finance System that receives rent and board funds from the undergraduate chapter and dispenses same to the University to pay for services supplied (housing, dining, telephone, utilities, consumable supplies, trash removal, insurance, safety inspections, etc.);
2. A Year-End Operating Results Account (#H50-3911) that carries the year-end surplus or deficit from the House Operating Account;
3. A Facility Maintenance Account (#H86-3764) that receives charges for repairs and capital improvements projects that are subsequently distributed to either the Facility Reserve Account or the Gift Account for reconciliation;
4. An interest earning Facility Reserve Account (#H86-1834) that receives funds (principally from the undergraduate chapter) that are obligated for long term capital improvement projects;
5. A Gift Account (#H60-9005) that receives funds (principally alumni contributions) and directs same to capital improvement activities for the benefit of the 13 South Avenue physical plant. This account is interest bearing if and only if a minimum balance of \$25,000 is maintained; and
6. A University administered Social Account (#H86-3826) that receives social subscription funds from the

chapter's membership that are expended at the direction of the chapter's Entertainment Committee.
