How effective are the Feline Leukemia Virus Vaccines?

The feline leukemia virus (FeLV) vaccines are reasonably effective in preventing persistent feline leukemia infection should your vaccinated cat be exposed to the virus. However, no vaccine is 100 percent effective, and this is true for the FeLV vaccines. The immune response produced by these vaccines will protect most exposed cats from becom-

ing infected with the virus.

Removing Cat Odors

The following hints will help you eliminate cat odors safely from the house:

- ✓ Chlorine bleach neutralizes odors and disinfects litter boxes. Use a dilution of 4 ounces of chlorine bleach to 1 gallon of water.
- ✓ Do not use Lysol for disinfecting litter boxes. The chemicals are toxic to cats.
- ✓ Treat urine-stained carpets immediately with a deodorizer and cleaning solution. If the padding underneath is soiled, it must be removed if the treatment is to be effective. If the stain occurs on concrete, clean the surface and then apply a sealer to the concrete.
