##### Biographical Statement

Pauline Morin is Director of Undergraduate Exchange Programs for the College of Human Ecology at Cornell. The College has over 12 Exchange Programs in Asia, Australasia, and Europe.

Pauline teaches three courses in the College of Human Ecology, HE 4000 Reflective Leadership Studio, HE 2222 Global Citizenship, which includes a travel component to Cuba, and DEA 4000, "Looking for Alberti, a 15th Century Italian Quest," in Italy through Summer Sessions. The course itinerary includes travel to Rome/Florence/Bologna/Mantua/Venice.

#### Teaching

##### Teaching and Advising Statement

HE 2222 Global Citizenship - 1 Credit Spring 2014

Course Overview and Objectives: This seminar/workshop class is designed to prepare students who will participate in a global educational experience either in New York, Washington or abroad. Students will develop a self-directed project and design an e-portfolio to structure their upcoming experience. The Course will center around the idea of global citizenship which promotes engagement, experiential learning, reflection and develops intercultural competence. The aim of the course is to reduce the participant's global footprint.

#### HE 4000 - Leadership Directed Study - 2 Credit - Spring 2014

Met on bi-weekly with two student leaders to develop courseware and review literature for an upcoming Reflective Leadership Studio. Tested a class project which entailed interviewing a Human Ecology Leader as part of a Leadership Interview/Lecture Series. We interviewed and video taped Kay Obendorf. The video is now archived on Cornell e-commons.

HE 4000 Reflective Leadership Studio - 2 Credit Fall 2014

HE 4000 is seminar/workshop designed for Human Ecology students to support their leadership development. Topics include skills related to empathy, self-awareness, self-direction, gender and mindfulness. Students engage in a number of projects to develop communication skills and confidence and visualize identity. Reflective analysis is done using e-Portfolio to connect experience to learning and complete challenging yet thoughtful readings that question views on interactions with others. The final class project is a video recording of an student interview of a Human Ecology Leader. In the Fall the class completed a video recording of Loraine Maxwell in DEA, which emphasized the role of Mentors in leadership. The video will be archived on e-commons.

#### ADVISING

I advise students on their study abroad options to determine the best fit for the student.

For students who are better suited to going through a Study Abroad Program I refer them to Paul Fisher.

I then work closely with students who choose to go out on exchange and those who come to Cornell.

11 HE students who went out on Exchange and 9 incoming exchange students.

I engage in a dialogue with students to help them determine their best interests in terms of school selection and creating a balance while abroad or at Cornell. I encourage and mentor students in carrying out their responsibilities as good ambassadors and mentors. I also mentor and assist students to reflect upon their experiences and communicate to others with formal visual and written presentations.

#### 1) Director of Human Ecology Undergraduate Exchange Programs

I build international educational collaborations all over the world.

My responsibilities also include expanding the exchange programs to other appropriate Partner schools. In this regard targeting appropriate partners is essential. One potential partners are identified, getting faculty support is essential. I work with Chairs, and designated faculty to review and approve programs. Finally meeting and engaging our potential exchange partners to complete the exchange is necessary. This means communication and information exchanges via e-mail and travelling to these schools to make personal contact.

It is my responsibility to facilitate student participation in Human Ecology's exchange programs. This begins with administering student applications from and to our exchange partners. I work with Cornell Study Abroad, International Exchange Programs in Australia, New Zealand Hong Kong and Paris, Seoul, Korea, Lucern, Switzerland, and Milan, Italy and administrative staff and faculty, and Cornell students and faculty to make this exchange possible and visible. This role includes information gathering, assessment, distribution and promotion.

I also advise students on which schools would suit their professional and personal interests best.

### **3) Developing a Strategic Plan for HE Exchange Programs.**

In the fall of 2014 initiated a series of discussions with Departmental Chairs, and DUS's to get input on strategic planning for the Exchange Programs.

As of 2014, HE's Design Schools are well served and students can attend all 12 exchange schools with the exception of a Medical School in Paris, which we recently signed with in July 2014. The focus of our exchange program development has transitioned to serve other departments and provide them with the options as we have for DEA and FSAD.

In the last year we have been working to develop agreements with schools with a focus on programs that are of interest to PAM, Nutrition, and Human Development.

As part of this development process we reached out to the Departments to update them on our progress and ask for guidance and involvement. I have listed the meetings and discussions that took place as part of this effort.

## Meetings with Department Chairs and DUS's Fall 2014

DEA

November 18<sup>th</sup>, Sheila Danko and Kathleen Gibson

At this meeting we discussed the strong exchange programs we had already developed together and received approval for a new Exchange Agreement with TEKO Design in Denmark. Sheila and Kathleen met with professors from TEKO earlier in the semester and were impressed with the quality of the school also as an option that would replace DIS in Copenhagen for Design.

Both Sheila and Kathleen commented on our focus on Europe and Asia. Sheila would like to see our programs reach out to schools in Africa and Latin America. They were very enthusiastic to hear about the possibility of another student exchange with a large private University in Istanbul called Istanbul Bilgi University which has a number of Design programs, as well as science and other majors of interest to HE students. I met contacts persons from this school when I was in Milan last November and was impressed with their presentations and student support.

## Human Development

November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2014. Meeting with Elaine Wethington, DUS of HD, Chuck Brainerd not able to attend. Kay Obendorf and myself.

Human Development sends the most number of students abroad and has the most flexible curriculum for study abroad.

We are in the process of signing an agreement with the City University of London, which we will hopefully complete in the near future. This is the first for HD and is focused on exchanging students from very specific programs.

Elaine was pleased to hear that we were in communications with Stockholm University's Department of Child & Youth Studies regarding an Exchange and thought that would complement areas in HD and meet student interest needs.

Aging and Neuroscience are of particular interest to students in our college.

Elaine mentioned that a strong Program in Berlin, and at Oxford, Nuffield College, is a major social and behavioral science college. Many HD faculties in Sociology have spent sabbatical leaves there. It might also be useful to look at Harris Manchester College. Edward Hall AKA "Teddy Hall," has a strong neuroscience program as well.

Elaine agreed to get Exchange programs on the Faculty agenda and report back.

FSAD

November 13<sup>th</sup>, 2014 Meeting with Tasha Lewis and Pauline Morin Vandyke invited but not in attendance.

Tasha was very positive of our recent negotiations with TEKO Design in Denmark, which has a strong business/design focus.

Tasha also expressed an interest in setting up connections with schools in Latin America, and also mentioned Canada as a possible partner especially with business.

November 21, 2012

Meeting with Margaret Frey, Kay Obendorf, and Pauline Morin. Jin Tu Fan did not attend.

Updated Margaret on exchange agreements in process, and recently signed. We signed an agreement with NABA, a design school in Milan that has an apparel Design major for FSAD students. We are also in the process of signing an agreement with Bocconi – a business school in Milan which has a fashion business major, which may be of interest to FSAD students as well. We are also in the process of signing an agreement with TEKO Design in Denmark, which has programs in interiors, furniture, strategic design planning, and apparel Design. It is one of the largest design schools in Scandinavia. Courses are in English.

Margaret agreed to discuss Exchange Programs at a faculty meeting and get feedback on a strategic plan.

PAM

November 22, Meeting with Rosemary Avery, Tom Evans, Kay Obendorf, Pauline Morin

Rosemary suggested developing Exchanges in major global centers where students already wanted to go. It makes sense to serve both travel and occupational interests.

We are in process of developing an Exchange Agreement with Stockholm University on behalf of PAM. Kelly Musick is on leave in Stockholm and involved in the negotiations.

Received approval from Rosemary to proceed on Exchange Agreements with Bocconi University in Milan and IESEG School of Management - Business in Paris as discussed.

In the long term we will extend our exchanges at Hong Kong Poly U to include management and policy and business.

We already have an Exchange with the University of Singapore and hope to have the University Wide MOU agreement approved in the near future so we can exchange students there.

Hopefully, we can develop exchanges that include schools in London and Stockholm that we are already working with in the next couple of years.
