NORDEN DISTINGUISHED TEACHER AWARD

DR. JOHN RANDOLPH has been selected as the 1987 recipient of the Norden Distinguished Teacher Award. This is the second time Dr. Randolph has been honored with this award; he was first named in 1982.

Over half of Dr. Randolph's time is spent on the medicine service of the small animal clinic; he also lectures in the small animal medicine and surgery and the general medicine and surgery courses. A coordinator of the small animal residency program, he is a member of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine, board-certified in the specialty of internal medicine. He has served as the AAHA Faculty Representative, as a member of the ACVIM Certifying Credentials Committee and the Committee on Student Conduct, the supervisor of the Small Animal and ICU Summer Crew, and as co-chairperson of the Senior Animals Veterinary Endowment Fund.

A 1977 graduate with distinction of the College of Veterinary Medicine,

Cornell University, Dr. Randolph completed an internship (1977-78) and a residency (1978-80) at the Animal Medical Center in New York City. While at the AMC, he received the President's Award for Outstanding Intern. He is a member of the Cornell Chapter of the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi; the National Veterinary Honorary Society of Phi Zeta, the New York State Veterinary Medical Society, the American Animal Hospital Association, and the American Veterinary Medical Association.

The Norden Distinguished Teacher Award is given annually to a full-time member of the veterinary medical faculty who is primarily engaged in teaching. Preceptorship and teaching ability as judged by responsiveness of the students, moral character and leadership are the primary qualifications for consideration. A list of nominees for the award is submitted by the four classes in the DVM program and the final selection is made by a committee appointed by the Dean.
