Cornell veterinary alumni and current campus community members congratulate Mike Kotlikoff for his recent appointment as university provost by President Elizabeth Garrett. Kotlikoff, a VMD from the University of Pennsylvania and PhD from UC, Davis, served as Cornell's veterinary college dean for eight years and, before that, as chair of the Department of Biomedical Sciences beginning in 2000.

Though Kotlikoff is the first veterinarian to be appointed provost at Cornell, it is noteworthy for the strength and distinction of the profession that there have been other veterinarians who have achieved high offices in university administrations.

Several other veterinarians currently serve as university presidents or provost, including:

- Warwick Arden, provost and executive vice chancellor, North Carolina State University
- Timothy Boosinger, provost and vice president for academic affairs, Auburn University
- Joseph DePietro, president, University of Tennessee system
- Teresa Welch Fossum, vice president of research and strategic initiatives, Midwestern University

- Lisa Freeman, executive vice president and provost, Northern Illinois University

Preceding those listed above, many veterinarians have served in senior university administrations over the years. An incomplete list includes:

- James Coffman, provost, Kansas State University
- Robert D. Phemister, acting president, Colorado State University
- Alastair Summerlee, president, the University of Guelph in Canada

Whether or not a list of veterinarians in senior university administration of distinguished universities is disproportionately large is for others to determine. Regardless, it serves the profession well to know that in our midst are those who have major roles in directing the broad academic future of higher education.
