## BROKEN LEG SNAPS 220-DAY SAFETY RECORD

After an enviable 220 days without a lost time accident, the NYSAES record ended last week with an on-the-job mishap at the Vineyard Lab at Fredonia.

A temporary service technician with Horticultural Sciences slipped while boarding a van that was preparing to go into the field to collect samples about 9 a.m. She suffered a broken fibula and chipped a bone in her left ankle. She was treated at Brooks Memorial Hospital, Dunkirk.

Because the injured employee missed five workdays, the record begins all over again starting October 19.
