ATTENTION ALL STATION EMPLOYEES FIRE DRILL AND EVACUATION PROCEDURE

To successfully complete a fire drill or any type of emergency there are six (6) practical factors that each occupant of the building should be familiar with.

1. Know your Department Safety Committee Member and any fire wardens he has appointed to assist him.
2. Know every regular and emergency Exit in buildings in which you work.
3. Know how to activate the alarm system and what it sounds like.
4. Know the location of each fire extinguisher in the building especially those on your corridor. Know what kind of fire each type of extinguisher is for and how to use it.
5. Before leaving the building, REMEMBER to (a) alert other occupants, (b) close windows if possible, (c) leave lights on, and (d) shut doors on your way out.
6. Proceed to the nearest Exit. DO NOT re-enter the building for any purpose until directed to do so by proper authorities.

CONGRATULATIONS

Rosario Provvidenti, Professor of Plant Pathology, was recently appointed a Liberty Hyde Bailey Professor. This honor was bestowed upon Dr. Provvidenti by the Cornell Board of Trustees, through a nomination by the Department of Plant Pathology and a faculty committee appointed by the Dean. This honor has been given to only ten faculty members in the College. By making this appointment, the College and University have commended Dr. Provvidenti for his commitment to excellence in his teaching and research programs. Our heartiest congratulations to Dr. Provvidenti! This is a double honor for the Station, since two of the ten Cornell Liberty Hyde Bailey Professors are now in Geneva. Wendell L. Roelofs, Professor of Insect Biochemistry received the honor in 1978.

RETURN THOSE LUG BOXES

Hundreds of black plastic lug boxes are missing from raw products. If the products' harvesting and storage is to proceed effectively in the 1987 season, these lugs must be returned. You should be aware that some have been hot stamped "RAW PRODUCTS BLDG". If you're using lugs for any other purpose than to store raw products please return them by April 30.

ATTENTION ALL STATION EMPLOYEES IN THE EVENT OF FIRE

1. If you detect fire or smoke, act quickly but coolly. Alert others by means of fire alarm system if there is one in your building. This will send a signal to the Heating Plant. Do not yell "FIRE" or scream--this will only cause confusion and panic.
2. Notify the Geneva Fire Department by dialing 9-789-2121, giving exact information as to the location and, if possible, the type of fire.
3. If call cannot be made pull alarm on pole on North Street in front of Hedrick Hall.
4. If the fire is still small, it may be controlled or extinguished by using the proper type fire extinguisher. In fighting any fire, large or small, never let yourself be trapped by its spreading or mushrooming and never take chances.

PLEASE NOTE

Fire alarms in all buildings will be tested between 7 and 8 am, Wednesday, April 15.

In the use of kerosene heaters...take care to use only 1K, water clear, kerosene. DON'T SUBSTITUTE GASOLINE...the heater becomes a bomb waiting to go off. Fire-wise advice from Cornell University Life Safety Services.
