Scholarships

THE VALENTINE MOTT KNAPP SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship of the value of \$400, awarded to a third year student and paid at the beginning of the fourth year, established by the will of David V. Knapp as a memorial to his brother, Dr. Valentine M. Knapp, '04. The scholarship is awarded by the Veterinary Faculty on the recommendation of a committee which considers the ability of the applicant to do creditable academic work, the personal qualities of the individual, his attitude toward professional matters, and his financial need.

THE A.S.P.C.A. SCHOLARSHIP, I

A scholarship of the value of \$300, awarded annually to a third year student and paid at the beginning of his final year. Established by the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals from funds raised by Gordon Wright, owner of Secor Farms, from benefit horse shows held at his stables in White Plains, New York. The recipient is chosen by the Veterinary Faculty on the basis of need, scholarship, interest in horses, and general competence. It is open to students (a) who are particularly interested in equine practice, (b) who are residents of New York, and (c) who expect to practice in New York after graduation.

THE A.S.P.C.A. SCHOLARSHIP, II

A scholarship of the value of \$100, awarded to a third year student and made available at the beginning of his fourth and final year. It is awarded by the Veterinary Faculty on the basis of need, scholarship, and general competence. Established by the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals from the donations of a contributor memorializing an Elkhound named Ruff of Dragondele C. D.
