MORGAN P. SWEENEY

The death of Morgan Sweeney at noon today, coming as it did so soon after encouraging reports of indications of improvement, was a grievous shock to his associates at the Station.

To say that Mrs. Sweeney and the children have our profound sympathy is but a feeble expression of the sorrow that the Sweeney's innumerable friends feel in the face of this event.

Morgan came to the Experiment Station as an Assistant Chemist on June 1, 1909, thus having completed twenty-two years of service on the first of last June. On July 1, 1930, he was promoted to Associate in Research in Chemistry, and was devoting most of his time to certain chemical studies for the Division of Pomology, being immediately associated in this work with Mr. Collison. He also continued to assist in the Inspection Laboratory.

Our personal contacts with Mr. Sweeney were, of course, outside the laboratory, and we shall leave to others who are better informed on that phase of his activities the evaluation of his professional achievements. For the past several years, however, we have worked intimately with him on committee assignments, and for genuine interest in the job in hand and intense loyalty to the Station and its welfare we are sure that no one surpassed him.

He will be sorely missed as a constructive and energetic associate in Station affairs and as a genial and loyal friend.
