I was at Hannibal twice <?> the first of this month hoping to see you. As you were not there, accepted the situation and returned here as Div. Supt. of the Osage. It has been almost impossible to leave since then without neglect of duty, and I take the liberty to write you about the position which you asked me to come and see you about.

I would like very much to be under you again, but as my surroundings here are such, and so pleasant that I would respectfully ask in what capacity you would wish me to act, and what the salary would be, before I would decide whether it would be better to sever the tie with the M. K. & T., the road I have tried to faithfully serve for last five years, or go where better inducements were offered.
