Dear Sir:-

I am in receipt of yours of the 6th inst.

I will accept the proposition made by you for the settlement of our account, and have given orders this morning for the loading and shipment of the amount of old rails required to settle the account.

I am inclined to try some steel, and have on hand at least one thousand tons of old rails. Can any arrangement be made with or thro you by which the Cleveland Rolling Mill could furnish us steel, and you take the old rails. I should probably want the same pattern as is being used by the T. W. and W. R.R., which is Fifty-two and one half (52-1/2) pounds to the yard.
