Dear Sir:-

I have your favor of the 25 and beg to say in reply that my associates and myself who have put 600,000 Dollars in money on our little road, which at present has no lien or mortgage on it, are anxious to extend the same to connect with the Gulf and with the M. K. & T. Our trouble is that we have not much money to invest at present, and if we could obtain 2000 tons of iron against the sale of a reasonable price of a part of the Bonds to be issued at such a figure as will ensure the coupons to be paid out of the net earnings of the road, we would raise the bal. of the money necessary for rolling stock and laying of the iron.
