Dear Sir:-

I received your two letters from Attica but did not answer them as I expected you in St. Louis Saturday last, and went to Hotel to meet you, but learned this morning that you were at Hannibal. I would like to see you. Can't you come down and see us? My time is pretty well taken up looking after our street rail way. I think it will pay. Weather is against us now, very wet and muddy. Saw Bond to day, his shadow (Jaynes) was with him.

I sent Mirick my certificates of stock in Parsons bank \$21,000.00 and wrote him that I would arrange the other \$4,000.00 when I saw you, as I was a little short, in consequence of my recent investment here.
