I should like to express through the Bulletin a suggestion, which has presented itself to a few girls, in regard to the reorganization of the student Government rules. This would prevent girls who are so unfortunate, either through health, inability or lack of invitation not to go to dances, from enjoying a legitimate and natural form of diversion - eating after the theatre. However much we profess to scorn such a commonplace proceeding, still through it we must admit of a certain sociability which is hard to attain in a street car to and from the first performance of the Crescent. We would advocate a strong movement to restrict dances and other social functions to the week end. Then for those evenings extend the hour of return from such "theatres which give two performances in one evening" to twelve o'clock. The requirement of a chaperone for the underclassmen on those occasions would render the privilege free from criticism.
