## STUDENT GOVERNMENT.

This is the first time all of the seniors have been assigned to one dormitory. The Executive Committee of the Student Government Association has recommended for the dormitories the following arrangement for 1917-1918:-

"All Seniors be in one dormitory. All Freshmen in the dormitories. All Sophomores out in approved houses, and as many Juniors in the dormitories as there are available rooms."

The recommendation was approved by the Adviser of Women for the year 1917-1918. This plan gives each girl three years in the dormitories and one year outside.
