

Burr Bridge. Nothing peculiar about it, and probably you would not care for those drawings. It was erected about 1846, and afterwards burnt. The bridge now standing between City & Island was built by old Mr. Henry R. Campbell. It is a perfect example of the Burr system, - a fine timber bridge, built I think about 1838,

I have at home a batch of old fashioned timber bridge work gathered together from the oldsters in my young days. If you would like to look over them I will bring them over. Haupt himself is old fashioned now and might furnish you some illustrations. Whipple on the Contrary, our James Watt of Bridgebuilding, is quite modern in style though old in date.
