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being what we might call a double triangular truss
of 3x12 plank put together with wooden pins,
the span being I think 240 feet, and intended
for RR work at that. The bridge was not a
success, and soon gave out, being on of the
vagaries of a very ingenious man.

You ought to find somewhere drawings of
the old RR bridge over the Delaware at Lewiston.
Jos. Wilson, who replaced it, would perhaps have them.
There are some good photos. of the queer old trap
at Schenectady over the Mohawk, after the inter-
mediate pins were put in. The Cascade arch
& the old Postage trestle on the Erie R I guess
can be found somewhere. It seems to me too
that McCallum's bridge ought to find a place
in your paper. There was a good specimen at
Brimhampton at one time. Let me know if
you care for the two bridges of which I have the
drawings, & I will send them to you as soon as
I can put my hands on them.
