Dear Ms. Lesher:

This follows up on your telephone call a week or so ago with my colleague, Professor Charles Wolfram. As you will recall, our interest is in obtaining both permission from the copyright holder and a computer-usuable copy of both the ABA Model Code of Professional Responsibility and the ABA Model Rules of Professional Conduct, which supplanted the Code.

The print publishers who put out student editions of the Code and Rules do so with permission from the ABA. I should like the ABA's permission to publish the Model Code and Model Rules electronically for the benefit of students here at Cornell and elsewhere. Using software that allows both full text search and "point-and-click" moves from one section or comment to another, following cross-references, I have prepared electronic versions of other codes that are central to law school courses (e.g., the Copyright Act, the U.C.C.). I would like to prepare a full computer-based equivalent to the print versions of the Code and Rules for distribution: 1) through the school's local area network to its students and faculty, 2) on disk to students and faculty members who want to work with their own copy, and 3) across the Internet to other law schools here and abroad. With permission of Lawyers Cooperative Publishing I have already done this with several Federal statutes (drawn from U.S.C.S.) and under license from the Permanent Editorial Board of the U.C.C. with Articles 1, 2, and 9 of the U.C.C.

Cornell has established a Legal Information Institute to pursue such educationally focused electronic publication. I seek the ABA's permission on its behalf. There will no profit for individuals. Distribution on disk will carry a charge but one designed simply to cover the costs of publication and production (the intellectual property disks, which include the necessary software, are currently priced at \$15).
