FOREIGN STUDENT ENROLLMENT 1964-65

We are pleased to present a summary of the foreign student enrollment at Cornell for the academic year 1964-65. This year we have 1020 foreign students with us from 82 countries, which is the largest number ever to enroll at Cornell and represents an increase of 7.2% over last year. It means that foreign students now make up 8.1% of the total student population of the University. The three largest national groups are Canada 163, China 92, and India 92.

Graduate students (734) make up 72% of the foreign student enrollment and comprise 24.8% of the total number of graduate students enrolled. This includes those students enrolled in the Graduate School and Master's degree candidates in the Graduate Schools of Business and Public Administration, and Aerospace Engineering.

Our undergraduate foreign student enrollment (286) increased by only 39 students over last year and represents 3.1% of the total undergraduate enrollment. The School of Hotel Administration continues to show the highest percentage (12%) of foreign students in any undergraduate division, followed by the College of Architecture with 6.6% and the College of Agriculture with 4.4%.

Although we have witnessed a general increase in the enrollment of foreign students in both graduate and undergraduate divisions, it is interesting to note that this is not due to an increase in new students but results from a larger number of returning students. This is most apparent in the graduate area when we compare this year's figures with those of last year.

For those interested in the enrollment of foreign students across the nation, we quote from the annual census conducted by the Institute of International Education and summarized in their publication OPEN DOORS. In 1963-64 75,000 students were reported representing 150 countries studying in over 1800 institutions. Universities with the greatest numbers were (1) University of California 3,927, (2) Columbia University 2,289, (3) New York University 2074 (Cornell ranked 11). Howard University again had the highest percentage of foreign students (15.8) followed by M.I.T. (12.9) and Columbia (9.4). Cornell with 951 (7.8%) ranked 6. Enrollment in Engineering, graduate and undergraduate, continues to lead with 16,549 or 22%. The Humanities had 14,602 for 19.5%, and Agriculture had the least number, 2,294, 3.1%. The greatest number of graduate students are found in the natural and physical sciences (7862). The Far East continues to dominate the area representation with 27,000 students, almost 35%. Africa with 6100 students showed the fastest rate of increase, 23% over last year.

The Cornell distribution of foreign students by country and by college or school is attached, and for the first time we have been able to list the graduate student enrollment by department.
