FOREIGN STUDENT ENROLLMENT 1972-73

We are pleased to present a summary of the foreign student enrollment at Cornell University for the academic year 1972-73. A total of 1199 students from abroad are enrolled this year, a decrease of 13 (1.1%) from last year.

Foreign students, representing 91 countries, make up 7.6% of the total Cornell student population in Ithaca. Canadian students comprise the largest national group (181) followed by Chinese (167) and Indians (76).

Graduate foreign students number 819, a decrease of 31 from 1971-72. Our foreign graduate students make up 22% of the University Graduate School enrollment. Graduate level enrollment, including The Graduate School and the Schools of Aerospace Engineering, Business and Public Administration, Law and the Veterinary College is 18.1%.

The University has 380 undergraduate foreign students enrolled, an increase of 18 over last year. They comprise 3.4% of the total undergraduate enrollment. Undergraduate schools and colleges with the highest percentage of foreign students are Hotel Administration 15.9%, Engineering 5.3%, and Architecture 3.4%.

The distribution of foreign students by country, college and school is attached with a list of graduate level enrollment by department.
