INTRODUCTION

Among New York's farm and rural families, there has been increasing interest in nontraditional agricultural commodities, innovative marketing strategies, rural enterprise development and farm diversification. In 1986, Cornell Cooperative Extension and the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets initiated the FARMING ALTERNATIVES PROJECT, to provide information and programs on agricultural diversification and enterprise development.

This directory has been developed as one means of supporting the efforts of Extension field staff to respond to inquiries and to develop local programs relating to farming alternatives. Because of the sheer number of alternative enterprises being considered by farm families, and because of the lack of solid economic data, production data, and campus backstopping for many of these enterprises, any single agent or county is unlikely to have expertise in more than one or a few types of alternatives. However, as we look statewide, the range of experience among field staff is quite impressive.

This directory is intended to be used by Extension field staff to identify colleagues with some degree of expertise or at least familiarity with a given type of enterprise. Contact with these individuals may prove helpful in designing programs or responding to local inquiries. Included in the directory are agents and regional specialists with experience in one or more of the following:

- diversification or conversion of an existing farm operation, such as conversion of a dairy operation to a vegetable farm;
- new or nontraditional agricultural crops, livestock food and forest products such as specialty vegetables or game;
- innovative, entrepreneurial approaches to marketing such as mail order or direct wholesaling;
- 4. innovative production systems such as organic farming, hydroponics, aquaculture, energy or input-reducing systems;
- 5. innovative products and services which make use of farm family or natural resources such as bed and breakfasts, farm tours, or winter recreation facilities.

Organization of the Directory

The directory is divided into two main sections. The first section contains the names, addresses, and phone numbers of Cooperative Extension field staff and regional specialists who have varying degrees of interest and involvement in farming alternative topics. This section is arranged alphabetically without regard to county or subject area. A brief statement is provided on each person's EXPERIENCE AS IT RELATES TO FARMING ALTERNATIVES. It must be remembered, however, that this experience often represents only a minor part of their overall responsibilities. The second section of the directory presents subject headings, under which are listed the names of agents with related experience. Individuals may be listed more than once within the subject index.

Procedures Used to Obtain Listings

In the fall of 1986, the Farming Alternatives Project conducted a survey of Cooperative Extension field staff and regional specialists. In this survey, we asked the respondents to list any agents or specialists whom they felt had particular experience(s) relating to alternative commodities, marketing, or enterprise development. In most cases, we then contacted the recommended agents and specialists in order to determine the specific nature of their involvement in farming alternatives. In many cases, these conversations led to further referrals. Every effort was made to make the information contained in this directory accurate and complete, however, we recognize that this is not an exhaustive list of all the field staff and specialists who have experience in farming alternatives.
