P. M., 39-1/2 — 5/8; Erie, 14-5/8; Ohio, 19-1/4 — 19-1/2. The decline in the latter & the other low priced stocks have effected Hannibal. A. & P. preferred, 13-1/2; Mo. P., 47-1/2 — 48; <? - 2 lines unreadable>.
