

".... So Easy Even Faculty Can Do It!"

Thanks to the purchase of some new digital equipment and cooperative arrangements among Communications Services, the Library, the Computer Center and the Director's office, Station employees will be able to put together presentations that are smoother and more effective than ever.

Two new scanners have been purchased in order to help research-

ers enhance their PowerPoint presentations, posters and/or publications with high quality graphics. The scanners are the brainchild of Communications Service's Rob Way and the Library's Jane Irwin. Way and Irwin recognized that the Station community needed additional scanners that would be available for public use. The most cost-effective approach was to have them accessible to the Station community at large at no charge rather than have each lab or department invest in individual machines.

After much research and comparison shopping, the duo selected one Epson Expression 1600 flatbed scanner and one Nikon LS-2000 slide scanner. The two scanners chosen offer an excellent performance to price ratio, said Irwin.

The scanners are located in the Learning Technology Center (LTC) in the basement of Jordan Hall. They are available for general Station community use whenever there are no classes in session. To determine when the room is free, check the LTC schedule on the web at http://www.nysaes.cornell.edu/library/cal.html.

For those who need help getting started with scanning, the LTC will offer a course, "Introduction to Scanners and Basic Image Optimization," taught by Way on June 8, from 10 am-noon. This is sure to be a popular class, so, if you plan on attending, come early.

In order to help the Station community make PowerPoint presentations from a computer notebook instead of using a tray of slides on a slide projector, the Station now has three video projectors that may be checked out from Communications Services. These units are available on an hourly, half day, full day or a weekly basis at no cost. Communications Services encourages those members of departments traveling to large meetings to reserve and use the equipment jointly.

The three projectors consist of one Sony SVGA 800x600 900 ANSI Lumen projector which is 1.5 years old and weighs 13 pounds, and two new Toshiba XGA 1024x768 1300 ANSI lumen projectors. Both Toshibas include an Apple laptop that can travel with the projectors.

The new projectors were chosen because of their resolution capability, brightness of projected image (brighter than a standard slide projector and highly visible even with the lights on), and their weight and size. At 7.9 pounds, these units are incredibly bright and small!

Wendell Roelofs, chairman of the Entomology Department, was one of the first to use the Station's new Toshiba TLP670 projector and Apple G3 laptop to make a PowerPoint presentation. He found it "so easy to use, even faculty can do it!"

According to Way, "Many presenters have a fear of presenting digitally. With the equipment we purchased and the training we offer, everyone can present smoothly and confidently. Many people are surprised to find out that these systems can work from a remote so you're not tethered to your computer while presenting."

In the near future, Communications Services will be visiting each department at a faculty meeting and holding workshops in the LTC to train Station faculty, staff and graduate students on the use of the laptop/projector technology.

Communication Services plans to have one of the Toshibas available in Jordan Hall for check-out and one in Barton for the departments of Plant Pathology and Entomology to use. 

The spray season has begun. Please remember to check the electronic posting board (EPOST), WPS Central Posting, or the on-site posting before entering any re-search blocks. The EPOST instructions "Read Me First" are in the "sprays" folder on the CC fileserver.

Please remember applicators cannot always see people in or around the blocks being sprayed.
