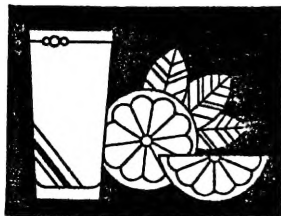

SPECIAL DEER PERMIT ISSUED

We wish to notify all employees that a special deer permit has been issued by the Department of Environmental Conservation to the Experiment Station. This permit is in effect from August 5, 1985 through October 5, 1985. The permit states that up to six deer may be taken by the designated agent(s) of the Experiment Station.

Dr. Charles Eckenrode, Entomology, and Steve Carpenter, Horticultural Sciences, have been named the designated agents for the Station. That means they will be doing the hunting.

As most of you know, deer have been causing excessive damage on several of our farms, especially Loomis, Robbins, Lucey, Darrow, and the Vegetable Research Farm. Some valuable experiments have been badly damaged or destroyed. The problem was assessed by a representative of the DEC, and the special deer permit was issued.



Every effort is being made to conduct this program as safely as humanly possible. Chuck Eckenrode and Steve Carpenter are both excellent hunters and are very safety conscious. They are being allowed to hunt deer only in the very early morning hours or late in the evening. In addition, Chuck and Steve will post where they will be hunting and when at the Spray Shed Platform Building. Employees may check at this location to see on what farms the agents are hunting. Further, Chuck will place a red and Steve a yellow flag on the farm(s) where they are hunting. This means that if you should have to visit one of these farms early in the morning or late in the evening and see a red or yellow flag on the gate to that farm, Chuck or Steve are currently hunting on the farm.

If a deer is taken, the DEC will be notified and the meat will be given to a family who is on their waiting list.

Although none of us is pleased about having to apply for a special deer permit in order to protect valuable research, it is not the first time that such a permit has been issued to the Station for this purpose. We appreciate Chuck and Steve for taking on this rather thankless assignment.

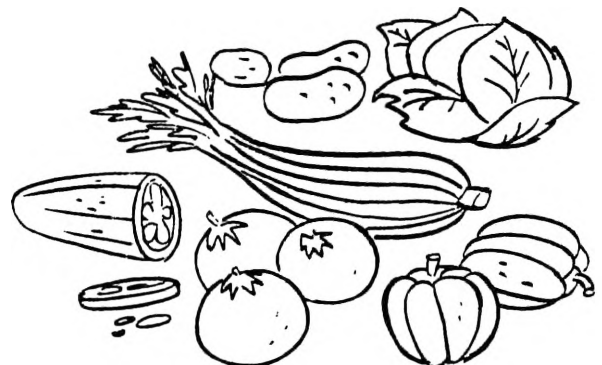
