HISTORICAL NOTES

THE Veterinary Virus Research Institute was established in September, 1950, by the Board of Trustees of Cornell University. At the same time approval was given for formation of the Cornell Research Laboratory for Diseases of Dogs to be built as a unit of the Institute, with the expectation that it would become the first permanent research center in the world for study of diseases of dogs.

The entire Veterinary Virus Research Institute was designed to become a center for correlated studies of immunology and of ways to prolong productive life and to prevent diseases. Some of the diseases most difficult to work with, but most destructive to health or life, always have been those caused by infectious organisms, such as viruses, rickettsiae, leptospirae, fungi, bacteria, and parasites. With immunological research specifically in mind, new buildings were planned in which such research could be carried out accurately. Facilities have been built accordingly, as funds gradually became available through the years.

For a beginning, the Institute was assigned approximately one-half of the premises that comprised the former Veterinary Experiment Station on Snyder Hill, about two miles from the Cornell University campus. A gift to Cornell by Professor and Mrs. James A. Baker of an adjoining thirteen acres of land made possible immediate construction into the Institute grounds of a graded road that could be kept open in winter.

Breeding stocks of disease-free laboratory animals and the herd of disease-free cattle from the Rockefeller Institute were given to us in 1950. Also in 1950, a gift from the Gaines Dog Research Center allowed us to build at that time the Cornell disease-free dog kennel.

In January 1951, the Cornell Research Laboratory for Diseases of Dogs was dedicated officially. This building, pictured in our frontispiece, contains individual study units, and two main laboratory sections, The Daynemouth Division, given by Colonel and Mrs. Lee Garnett Day, and The Giralda Division, given by Mrs. Geraldine Rockefeller Dodge. Later in 1951, Mr. and Mrs. William Flemer, Jr., of Princeton, New Jersey, sent us approximately 5000 trees and shrubs. During the following year, a maintenance building was constructed.

In 1955, the new Microbiology Building, given by Colonel and Mrs. Lee Garnett Day and Mr. John M. Olin, was finished. In 1958, with funds from the U. S. Public Health Service and the Institute, the Control Laboratory was built. In 1960, a grant from the Caspary Estate allowed establish-

ment of our first endowed professorship. In 1961, expansion of our work with tissue culture became possible following construction of the Colgate Division provided by the late Miss Adele Colgate. In 1963, the John M. Olin Professorship was established in appreciation for all that Mr. Olin has done for the Institute.

None of this work could have been possible without the continuous support of many hundreds of individuals throughout the world who have thereby expressed their interest in the present and future welfare of animals.

MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

THIS annual report of progress from the staff of the Veterinary Virus Research Institute to founders and donors of the Cornell Research Laboratory for Diseases of Dogs marks our fourteenth year of operation.

WORK IN THE CORNELL RESEARCH LABORATORY FOR DISEASES OF DOGS

Studies are being made of methods to help prevent undue loss of young puppies. Their mortality rate is high. Common causes are stillbirths, chilling, accidents to the newborn, or inability of the dam to suckle her young. In addition, and probably more serious than all other causes combined, are infectious diseases.

Colostrum Studies

As described in earlier reports, we have made countless studies and analyses with colostrum and have developed accurate information concerning its significance in the early life of newborn animals. Temporary passive immunity is absorbed by a puppy from colostrum received during the first hours of life, if the colostrum itself contains antibodies. Colostrum can confer this temporary immunity only against diseases to which the individual mother herself is immune, and according to her own individual degree of immunity. Such immunity in a puppy will decrease regularly day by day in a precise, predictable, mathematical manner, so that the puppy will become non-immune at a time that corresponds to the amount of immunity it received from its mother's colostrum; in other words, the higher the mother's immunity, the more effective are the antibodies in her colostrum, and the longer they will protect her puppies. While present in a puppy's body, these antibodies are effective not only against virulent virus of disease; they also will attack attenuated vaccine viruses of distemper or infectious canine hepatitis, if the puppy is vaccinated too soon. On the other hand, the puppy must be vaccinated as soon as colostral protection has diminished in order to be protected without interruption against virulent virus of disease. Some puppies are susceptible at birth or become so shortly thereafter, while others may have antibody for as long as 16 weeks.

We are continuing our efforts to help solve this problem which means life or death for so many young puppies.

Distemper

After definitive studies made at the Cornell Research Laboratory for Diseases of Dogs upon what was formerly termed the "Distemper Complex," better understanding has led to ability to make improved and standardized vaccines.

At the present time, the most important problem in the control of distemper is ability to provide adequate protection for puppies from the time of birth until the time when maternal distemper antibody has disappeared and the puppy can be immunized successfully. Amongst the studies we have made in this connection are:

- (1) Development of a laboratory test of the mother's blood which, by use of a nomograph, indicates when her puppies should be immunized. Described in earlier Institute Reports, this method, although it is not yet practical for all dog owners to use because of transportation difficulties, lack of sufficient trained personnel, inconveniently located laboratories, and the expense involved, has proved successful in laboratories where there are available sufficient technical help and facilities.
- (2) Use of heterotypic measles vaccine as soon as possible after puppies are born. No amount of maternal distemper antibody can interfere with the protection against distemper virus that is given by heterotypic measles vaccine. Encouraging progress is being made in this pioneer work at the CRLDD, and a measles vaccine—properly attenuated specifically for puppies—is in process of development and accurate testing at the CRLDD.
- (3) Antiviral therapy by use of some chemotherapeutic agent which could inhibit development of distemper or other viruses, should a puppy become susceptible and exposed to disease. In preliminary laboratory tests, certain drugs appear to be effective against distemper virus. These will be tested further.

Studies on Nutrition

Antibody production has been accepted as the major means whereby a dog protects itself against various infectious and parasitic diseases. Consequently, the earlier a dog forms antibodies the healthier it should be. Nutritional substances affect antibody production, especially the vitamins, folic acid, and pantothenic acid. Deficiencies of these vitamins impair antibody formation. Precise needs for these vitamins are being studied and standards are being established.

Mycoplasma

Of particular interest is a new disease that apparently causes a fatal septicemia of young puppies. Two litters of puppies that died within two weeks of birth were submitted to us for diagnosis. Their pathology was unlike previously recognized diseases. From them the infectious agent termed *mycoplasma* was isolated. Mycoplasma are bacteria that grow within cells, as do viruses. At the present time, attempts are being made to find suitable culture media on which mycoplasma will grow in the laboratory, in order that more intensive studies may be made. Other work in this connection will be to determine whether this disease is widespread and the extent of puppy losses it may be causing, as well as to develop an effective means of control.

Other Work in Progress

Work is continuing on diseases of the eye. The search for an effective heterotype for infectious canine hepatitis receives attention. A program for control of heartworm has been started.


Housing for Dogs

Proper housing for dogs should provide: (1) shelter with adequate space for comfort, (2) sanitary conditions, (3) ease of operation, and (4) features which may help protect the dogs from accident or disease. Heat


may be necessary in cold regions, and most especially for the whelping section of breeding kennels to prevent chilling of newborn puppies, which is nearly always fatal. Runs for the dogs should be connected to the heated area by a swinging door. Screening adds greatly to the health, appearance, and comfort of the dog by helping control insects that may carry diseases or cause unsightly lesions. To insure proper cleaning, runs should have a washable surface, like concrete, pitched ½ of an inch to the foot for good drainage. An adequate water supply is desirable, preferably with both hot and cold water. If the kennel drains can be connected with a septic tank, cleanliness of the dogs becomes a simple matter.

All of the above features have been incorporated in the breeding kennel for the Cornell Research Laboratory for Diseases of Dogs and have proved important in our successful rearing of disease-free dogs. For more than ten years there have been no diseases in this kennel, none of the dogs have died or become ill from any cause, and healthy puppies are being produced regularly.

At meetings of the Animal Care Panel and other organizations concerned with the welfare of dogs, our kennels have been described. Several large breeding kennels have been built in various parts of the United States using ideas developed at the CRLDD. Some of these kennels are pictured in the accompanying photographs.



Disease Free Kennel of the Institute




John M. Olin's Breeding Kennel at East Alton, Illinois





STAFF ACTIVITIES

During the past year Dr. James A. Baker was asked to help design a research facility and a laboratory for vaccine production to be built with the United States Agency for International Development (AID) assistance in the Republic of Mali in West Africa. Two former members of the Institute staff, Dr. Charles J. York, Ph.D., Cornell, '50, and Dr. Peter H. Langer, Ph.D., Cornell '60, who are experts in vaccine production in this country, cooperated in giving their advice, which enabled Dr. Baker to present completed plans to Mali government officials in Bamako. The new Mali Virus Institute should be of special benefit by allowing production of vaccines that eventually should help increase cattle production in that part of the world, where rinderpest is still endemic. Continued interest in this project resulted in specialized training here for an AID officer assigned to Mali, Dr. Marvin T. Goff, who spent the early part of 1964 at the Institute. It is expected that certain Mali laboratory personnel may receive technical training here in the Microbiology Laboratory at the Institute.

Additional participation by the Institute in the AID program included training for two months of Dr. Martina Segura of Buenos Aires, a staff member of Argentina's National Research Organization, INTA.

There has been continued progress in research with heterotypic vaccines. On the basis of these findings, the Institute now is proposing that BVD vaccine offers a possibility for eradication of hog cholera. Many strains of hog cholera virus have been studied, including fully virulent virus collected from outbreaks of hog cholera as they occurred in different parts of the United States, including the Hawaiian Islands. BVD was found to protect pigs in a highly satisfactory manner against every single one of the natural field strains.

Members of the Institute staff, Dr. Baker, Dr. Sheffy, Dr. Carmichael, Dr. Kahrs, Dr. Roberts, Professor Bradt, and Dr. Stephenson, have had a busy year giving various talks and having discussions with numerous visitors from foreign countries, other universities, with government officials and with industrial workers. Dr. Baker visited several schools and laboratories in South America last spring.

Dr. Leroy Coggins, who received the Ph.D. degree in 1962, is now on assignment by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the East African Veterinary Research Organization in Kenya. Dr. Coggins is conducting research upon African swine fever.
