YES, CONSERVING ENERGY DOES SAVE

Sure, we all ask just how much can be saved by conserving energy. Here are some pretty good figures in which you might be interested. In November 1990, there were 684 heating-degree days; in December 1990, there were 1011, a difference of 387 heating-degree days. Yet, because of various energy-saving measures, including shutting down much of the Station over the holidays, December's bill for oil and electricity was about \$9,000 less than in November. Those are significant savings, and should remind each of us to turn off lights when not needed, especially in greenhouses; shut down growth chambers in which there are no experiments; consolidate use of these two energy-intensive research procedures whenever possible; and to practice other common-sense measures for saving energy. appreciate the excellent cooperation that there has been from the entire staff—we cannot let it stop now.
