### REPORT OF THE TREASURER

To the Board of Trustees of Cornell University:

The annual report of the Treasurer covering the financial affairs of the University for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1948 is presented herewith.

Your attention is especially called to the balance sheet, pages 10 and 11, summary statements of income and expense, pages 12 and 13, and other financial results including summary operations of the so-called auxiliary enterprises, page 221.

### Income and Expenditures

The total income for the year of \$22,817,024.49 and total expense of \$22,748,303.55 shown on pages 12 and 13 are both in excess of previous year totals by more than \$4,000,000. The greatest increases were in the Endowed Colleges at Ithaca.

### Net Surplus of Endowed Colleges at Ithaca

The divisions of the Endowed Colleges at Ithaca (Architecture, Arts and Sciences, Business and Public Administration, Education, Engineering, Law, Nutrition and Graduate School) lived within their budgets for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1948 and better yet showed a surplus of \$36,344.14. To this was charged \$13,799.57 being the operating deficit of the Medical College at New York. There remained, therefore, a net surplus of \$22,544.57 for the year, exclusive of extraordinary charges.

### State Colleges and Other Divisions

The State Colleges (Agriculture, Home Economics, Industrial and Labor Relations, Veterinary) and other divisions including the Experiment Stations and School of Hotel Administration operated within their income as a group.

### Accumulated Deficit

The deficit of \$166,946.69 for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1947 established this account. Appropriations, largely of a non-recurring nature, were added to this beginning balance throughout the current fiscal year. These appropriations amounting to \$582,105.52 brought the accumulated deficit up to \$749,052.21. The final figure was reduced by crediting the account with unrestricted gifts of \$50,922.95 and Endowed College operating surplus of \$22,544.57. The accumulated deficit, therefore, stood at \$675,584.69 on June 30, 1948.

### Auxiliary Enterprises

It is interesting to note in Schedule 45, page 221, the magnitude of the operations of the so-called auxiliary enterprises. This presentation was especially designed to show the volume of business conducted by these particular divisions of the University. The actual income and expense of auxiliary enterprises shown elsewhere in the report do not include any interdepartmental transactions.

### Donations

Total donations for the period amounted to \$3,110,212.26 being an increase over the previous year of approximately \$300,000. The Alumni Fund produced \$407,611.04, the largest total in its history. For detail on donations see Schedule 41, page 200.

### Investments

The market value of investments in Bonds and Stocks on June 30, 1948 amounted to \$37,952,689.90 compared with book values of \$35,684,514.26, the unrealized appreciation being \$2,268,175.64. Other investments of \$7,202,265.65 brought the total book value up to \$42,886,779.91. The reserve to provide for possible capital losses had a balance on June 30, 1948 of \$1,963,844.83 compared with \$1,528,399.53 at the beginning of the period, an increase of \$435,445.30.

The rate of return earned on the investment pool (which included endowment and non-endowment funds, reserves, current funds invested and awaiting investment, funds the income of which is payable to others for a time, and other funds from time to time participating in said pool) amounted to 3.98% after deducting all direct out-of-pocket investment expenses including salaries of investment personnel. The rate was 3.78% after deducting 3% of investment income (\$49,202.28) as a service charge on pooled funds which was transferred to current income and after further deducting 2% of remaining investment income (\$31,817.47) for the investment reserve account. If the rate had been computed as in former years it would have been 4.35% compared with 4.29% for the year ended June 30, 1947.

The endowment and non-endowment funds participating in the investment pool were credited at the assigned rates of 4% and 2%

respectively with minor exceptions.

The income stabilization reserve was increased by \$51,044.31 and

had a balance on June 30, 1948 of \$250,440.05.

The amortization policies with respect to real estate investments have been extended to provide for the amortization of substantially all of the properties included in endowment and other invested fund assets. The total amount of such amortization increased from approximately \$86,000 for the year ended June 30, 1947 to \$198,650.38 for the year ended June 30, 1948.

### Miscellaneous

Following the detailed financial schedules are the reports of the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, the Manager of Residential

Halls, and the Manager of Purchases. Although these activities no longer come under the jurisdiction of the Treasurer's Office, it seemed appropriate to continue the practice of including this information herein, or at least until such time as other arrangements are made for

their publication.

In conclusion, I wish to express the pleasure I have had in working with the able organization which had been built up over the years by my predecessor, Mr. George F. Rogalsky, and to thank my associates in the Treasurer's Office for their cooperation and devotion to duty during what appears to be one of the most trying financial periods in the University's history.

### ACCOUNTANTS' CERTIFICATE

Board of Trustees of Cornell University:

We have examined the balance sheet of Cornell University as of June 30,1948, the related statements of income and expenditures for the year ended that date, and the supplemental schedules pertaining to such financial statements. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances; it was not practicable to confirm receivables from United States Government departments but we have satisfied ourselves with respect to such receivables by means of other

auditing procedures.

The book value of investments generally represents cost, or market value at date of acquisition in the case of investments acquired by gift. Effective March 1, 1941 provision has been made for amortization of bond premiums on a straight-line basis, no specific provision therefor having previously been made. Provision for depreciation of real estate investments has not been made on a basis of estimated life of the properties, but provision has been made during the year ended June 30, 1948 for amortization of substantially all of the real estate investments; in many instances the amount of such amortization is dependent upon the amount of income produced by the individual properties. In addition to provisions made for amortization of bond premiums and real estate investments, two per cent of the net income on investments has been set aside to provide for investment losses.

In our opinion, subject to the explanations in the preceding paragraph, the accompanying balance sheet and related statements of income and expenditures and supplemental schedules present fairly the financial condition of the University at June 30, 1948 and the results of its operations for the year ended that date, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that

of the preceding year.

For accounting purposes the University is separated into seven divisions: A, the Endowed Colleges at Ithaca; B, the Medical College at New York; C, the Veterinary College; D, the College of Agriculture; E, the College of Home Economics; F, the Agricultural Experiment Station at Geneva, New York; G, the School of In-

dustrial and Labor Relations.

In subdivision A, which for accounting purposes may be termed the University, are included many general items of income and expense which inure to the benefit in a varying degree of the six other divisions, or to the use and benefit of students registered in the colleges constituting these divisions. Some such items are the expense of the general administrative offices, the library, the infirmary, the residential halls, the upkeep of the campus and playgrounds, and the departments of music, hygiene, military, and physical training.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

To the Vice President for Business:

The activities of the Buildings and Grounds Department reflect the growth of the University. Expansion and change of the physical plant calling for alterations and additions represent a major proportion of our annual expenditures. Budget allowances for operation, maintenance and repair continue to increase to include, to an extent, added coverage and the steady rise in labor and material, supplies and equipment costs.

Campus transportation for our employees, the impact of our vacation policy, the adoption of a basic forty hour week, our generous policy toward our aging em-

ployees,—all affect our costs and overall expense.

#### CARE OF BUILDINGS

Once more in the summer of 1947 we had an opportunity to get our buildings in good shape for the coming school year with its increased enrollment. Floors were

sealed and waxed, walls washed, etc.

An effort was made to gradually increase the rates of pay of the custodians so that they could meet the increases in the cost of living. By a special act of the Board of Trustees, the Lower Campus custodians were granted a \$.06 per hour raise January 1, 1948 with a promise of a further increase July 1, 1948. By the latter date the minimum pay will be \$40.00 per week to \$46.00 per week. This increased scale has made the occupation attractive enough to result in the procurement of some very promising young men who are interested in continuing in this class of employment. The quality of work is already showing good results.

The State Campus had similar raises in pay.

The staff now is composed of 49 men on the Endowed Campus and 33 on the State Campus.

The Salvage Department did about \$6,000.00 in business during the fiscal year.

#### CARE OF GROUNDS

A particularly busy and trying year. An unusual volume of work to be performed

with labor supply inadequate both in numbers and quality.

July 1st found Faculty housing project under way, with grading, inportation of top soil and turf, seeding, construction of concrete and colprovia walks, curbs and streets.

Similar work being performed at Clara Dickson Hall during same period.

All walks at Vetsburg surfaced with colprovia and permanent drive built through subdivision marked for parking.
Underground power lines run to Clara Dickson Hall.

Top soil hauled and lawns made for Veterans Housing at East Tower Rd. Adequate drainage provided and all roads rebuilt. Top soil hauled and spread and lawns seeded at Kline Rd. barracks. Roads and colprovia walks built with one walk extending from above barracks to Balch.

Gravel hauled, placed and graded for road base on following roads: Marginal road-Farm road, Dairy Barns to Caldwell road-Pomology road, Poultry Farm, Kline to Warren roads, Warren farm road 1.3 miles. All above have since been

graded and penetrated with crushed limestone and asphalt surface.

Parking areas built and surfaced at Administration Building, Sage College, I&LR School, Morse Hall, Baker Lab., and Temp. Bldg. No. 1. Administration Bldg. graded, seeded, walks built and partially planted.

East Vetsburg graded, seeded, and walks and roads built and surfaced.

A flash flood occurring on August 15, necessitated a tremendous amount of repairs.

Drains, sewers, curb and rebuilding of track at new steel stands west side of Schoellkopf Field.

Storm drains, sewers, walks and roads built at West Ave. dorms.

New Parking area established and gravelled West of Baker Dorm group. Storm and Sanitary sewer for Nuclear Physics also steam line for this group.

New concrete curbs, walks, grading and seeding I&LR bldgs. Grading, sewer and water for new Ag. Eng'g. Quonset hut.

Drainage and gravel drive at Microwave laboratory.

Grading, sodding, etc. Filter Plant extension.

Excavating, grading, sewer, water drain and walk Service Bldg. Addition.

Excavation and concrete for Print Shop basement.

Quarried and hauled stone for repairing flood damaged wall at Balch halls, cleanup, grading and seeding.

25 maple trees planted at South Hill. 3 new parking areas at South Hill.

Excavated, graded, and gravelled new Comstock warehouse site, water, sewer drain and drive to above.

New concrete walk at FM station WHCU on Turkey Hill.

Removed stone wall east of Schoellkopf.

Built two new hard surfaced playgrounds at Vetsburg.

Due to the large number of construction and maintenance jobs our inability to take care of some jobs which obviously require attention has been recognized.

This together with the multitude of maintenance jobs necessary daily to upkeep of a large and rapidly growing University has made a most interesting year.

#### HEATING

A particularly severe winter coupled with the large additional loads imposed by recently completed buildings as well as fuel shortages have taxed the Heating Division throughout the year. 1633 service calls answered (an increase of 458 over the previous year) reflect increased duties of the Heating Division in operating small boiler units for Residential Halls and Real Estate Departments. These small units were formerly operated under contract and the service calls were not recorded by this Division.

The Division was represented in the many building alterations effected during

the year and completed several new heating systems where required.

Early in the Fall of 1947, pipe was purchased for a proposed 12" steam main from the Central Heating Plant north to Tower Road, thence east to the existing 8" main in East Avenue. A design was furnished by this Division and construction was begun at the close of the spring term, 1948. The design of the concrete envelope and method of insulation was adopted from the one used for the Nuclear Studies extension, which has proven considerably more effecient than previous installations.

Also begun during the year was a program for modernization of heating systems in older endowed-campus buildings. It is anticipated that these changes will pro-

duce better comfort conditions as well as increased operating economy.

Organizational changes included the acquisition of J. P. Hoar as Assistant to the Heating Engineer and the establishment of a separate Meter Section. A portion of the ground floor at the Service Building was set aside as a shop for Steamfitters with very satisfactory results.

Foundations were completed for a new Riley boiler unit at the Central Heating Plant and erection of the boiler itself was well under way at the close of the year.

# POWER PLANT AND TRANSMISSION LINES

Aside from the regular maintenance work several lines were replaced with larger copper to handle the increased load on the campus. A new 3-phase 2300 volt line was installed to furnish power and light for Nuclear Physics and Accelerator Building and several others. This line starts at the new substation at East Ithaca and terminates at Nuclear Laboratory. Nineteen new street lights were installed near Clara Dickson and three south of Balch. A new 3-phase 2300 volt underground line was installed to furnish power and light for Clara Dickson Hall.

#### WATER WORKS

During the past year an addition to the Filter Plant was completed. This provides space for three additional filters, of which one was completed. Space was provided also for a new control laboratory. All three of the old filters have now been rebuilt with porous plate bottoms, anthrafilt as the filtering medium and with Palmer Agitators for surface wash. The new filter is of the same construction.

The around-the-end baffles were removed from the mixing basin and a Stuart

mechanical flocculator installed.

A new one million gallon reservoir was placed in service. This doubles the storage capacity for filtered water.

The demand for water has continued to increase, but with the increase in capacity

of the Plant and the increased storage capacity this will be easily met.

For a period of over a month this summer water was furnished the City of Ithaca because of a landslide that put their raw water main out of service. At that time the University Plant was operated to the full capacity of the pumps, or at a rate of about 2,300,000 gallons per day.

An up to date record of underground water mains and services, showing the location and size of all mains, valves, services and hydrants was completed during

the fiscal year.

The field maintenance of the distribution system included repairs to broken mains, lubricating and flushing of all fire hydrants, and flushing of dead end mains, also, the operation of all gate valves.

The water meters to all buildings have received an annual inspection, and repairs

were made where necessary.

#### CAMPUS PATROL

This Division started the year and continued through to May 1 under the same administrative staff as in the year previous—an Executive Office, Assistant Executive Officer, a full-time stenographer and a full-time clerk. The officers supervised the work of the patrolmen and watchmen and administered the registration and parking of student and staff cars.

Four full-time patrolmen started and ended the year. A fifth was replaced after several months' lapse. There was considerable turn-over among the staff of watchmen with resultant falling below full strength at various times. The watchman staff was bolstered by the appointment of a capable foreman in October. Through his efforts, and with increments assured for the experienced men, this service should

be better cared for during the coming year than in any time in the past.

Records are not available for the number of student drivers who violated parking or moving regulations. Many who did not have permits attempted to park again in spite of warnings, suspended sentences or fines. One appeal case was heard during the spring term by the Board on Traffic Control. The total number of registrations for the spring term was 1962, which is a ratio of one car for every 4.7 students. This was an increase of about 250 cars over the registration for the spring term previous. No additional parking space has been made available, so the problem will continue to be acute.

Late in April the Executive Officer relinquished his work with the Campus Patrol to devote full-time attention to his duties as Personnel Director. With his replacement, a reorganization took place. The Campus Patrol and Fire Service were absorbed within the Safety Division, the new title. Control of car registration, parking and disposition of fines for violations came under the new heading of Traffic Bureau. The term "Night Watchmen" was changed to "Night Police." They, with the uniformed patrolmen, comprise the Campus Patrol.

The term "Executive Officer" was replaced with "Supervisor." The Assistant Executive officer resigned in May and was replaced in June. His successor was

given the title of Assistant to the Supervisor.

The Campus Patrol received and answered several hundred trouble calls. These included minor thefts, prowlers, accidents, utility troubles, and fires. Fortunately, most of the emergency calls were picked up in time through the emergency signal system. However, this system is not fast enough. It is hoped that a two-way radio communications system may be adopted in the very near future.

#### REPAIRS

The budget of this Division is primarily for general maintenance involving the following shops: Carpenters, Painters, Plumbers and Tinners. Aside from the above volume of small items there were several major repairs completed, such as general overhaul of the stone masonry of the Hydraulic Laboratory, the belfry of the Library Tower and rehabilitation of a large number of classrooms, Drafting and Lecture Rooms in the Sibley group and in Rockefeller Hall.

#### NEW CONSTRUCTION

Savage Hall and the Accelerator Building were completed and occupied. Nuclear Studies was partially occupied and the unit is scheduled for dedication

early in this October.

The six temporary academic buildings aggregating 50,000 square feet of floor space were completed and occupied intensively except Unit No. 6 at the East Hill Airport which has been used principally for storage of aeronautical equipment. A temporary modified quonset building was erected at the airport for Microwave study. Foundation work for Heating Plant expansion was completed. Basement under Print Shop was developed and will be completed this fall. Addition to Service Building was completed for electronics equipment and supplies as well as for expansion of Typewriter Division. Additions were built to the temporary Industrial and Labor Relations School buildings on Armory green. Filter Plant expansion was completed. Bids will be received on Statler Hall on July 8, 1948.

# ELECTRIC SERVICE—MACHINE SHOP AND WELDING

Our service organization has been brought up to full force and out maintenance schedule is being kept up.

Flourescent lighting is replacing old inadequate lighting rapidly. The Veterinary College, Engineering School and College of Architecture, are among those in

which lighting changes have been made.

With electrical maintenance and construction, welding, machine shop work, refrigeration and the maintenance work required on elevators in Clara Dickson Hall, Nuclear Physics and Accelerator Building, and the Administration Building, the demands on this department are becoming more and more.

#### FIRE SERVICE

Fire Service was maintained by one man, listed as Fire Inspector, whose principal function was to inspect and keep in service for emergency use all sprinkler and alarm systems and all first-aid fire fighting equipment. Due to the magnitude of that work, it became necessary to employ the extra services of the Foreman of the Night Watch and several of the watchman on numerous occasions.

Actual fire loss claims amounting to \$465,542.02 were received following seven fires in Endowed College buildings. The greatest loss (\$437,500.00) was sustained at the High Voltage Laboratory February 12, 1948, when fire of undetermined origin completely destroyed the building and all its valuable (some irreplaceable)

materials.

There were two fires at the Diesel Lab. The first on August 15, caused damage amounting to \$25,639.26 when lightning struck the building. A carelessly tossed cigarette at the Diesel Lab was the possible cause of a loss of \$1314.80 on October 20. Lightning struck a chimney at Baker Dormitory on August 15, resulting in a paid claim of \$759.96. Melted snow heated some lime to the ignition point at the Nuclear Physics Lab on January 8 causing \$160 damage. On February 16, a truck, which backfired, was damaged to the extent of \$168 at the Service Building. \$25.00 damage resulted from a fire in a couch at the Veterans Housing Office on November

There were four fires on the State Campus, two each at the Dairy Building and at Plant Science. Only one resulted in any appreciable damage. Accumulated gases from an unlighted pilot light may have been the cause of a fire which destroyed the South wing of the third floor at the Dairy Building on August 3. Students extinguished a fire caused by an overheated dehydrator at Plant Science on July 26, 1947, by using a fire hose. Students smothered a fire which followed a workman's careless attempt, on May 29, to remove paint with paint remover and a blow torch. The night watch foreman put out a fire in Plant Science by prompt use of an extinguisher on June 16. Rays from the sun had refracted through glass carboys, igniting a cardboard carton.

There were two trash fires, extinguished without damage by sprinkler heads in Sage and Morrill Halls respectively. Numerous other fires were prevented by prompt use of extinguishers. Welders at the Heating Plant started several of these.

We are fortunate that we have good cooperation from building custodians and from Department Heads. Students and workmen, for the most part, are fire conscious. This has been helped along by demonstrations, films and other media of education. Householders in the Veterans' Housing areas have been briefed, both

in prevention of fires and in their control.

Thorough inspections are made three times yearly by inspectors from the Factory Mutual Companies. We are kept busy trying to follow through on remedying their suggested corrections and at the same time keep alert to newly created hazards. New buildings and new equipment are being added throughout the campus raising the value of University property, thus adding to the burden placed on an undermanned staff. It is impossible for one man alone to do the tremendous job necessary to inspect and maintain equipment, and at the same time, dig into corners and crevasses seeking hazards as we should be doing.

#### BARTON HALL

The large glass area on the west side of Barton Hall above the balcony needs much attention and a fair amount was provided this past year. The steel sash have corroded and need thorough cleaning, painting and reinforcing. The roofs on the building have been renewed and at present the only trouble is with the gutters on the main drill shed. The State proposes to renew these with copper and plans have

been prepared for the work.

A new panel board has been ordered for the principal drill shed circuits replacing an old style one which has been causing much trouble. The State is considering rather elaborate alterations, particularly in the west end of the building in order better to accommodate the expanding needs of the ROTC with possible provision for the NROTC as well. The Artillery and Riding Stable area presents a much improved general appearance. One stable, No. 3, has been removed and rustic fencing erected at little budget expense due to enthusiastic efforts of Colonel Hospital's staff.

#### VETERINARY COLLEGE

The fairly formidable alteration on the Small Animal Clinic has been started on a Special Fund Estimate basis at about \$33,000. The usual volume of minor alterations was handled. New construction in the Veterinary group is still deferred. The Small Animal Virus Laboratory is being advertised for construction bids by the State. It is expected to cost about \$100,000 and designed for Snyder Hill area.

#### COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE

In Roberts Hall new space was allotted to the business offices and extensive alterations resulted. A second floor was created in the auditorium and this space put to intensive use. A broad program of electrical changes in this building is resulting in more adequate circuits, modern panel boards and flourescent lighting throughout. Heating facilities in Floriculture green houses have been modified and new piping installed. The State has let contracts for restoration of second and third floors of Stocking Hall where damaged by fire early in the year. Architectural plans for a Library, Agricultural Engineering, Animal Husbandry, and Agronomy have been developed by the State but no construction program started.

#### HOME ECONOMICS

Extensive interior painting has been carried forward. Permanent improvements at service entrance involving a lift, garbage room and special entrance doors have been completed. The temporary two-story structure on the north was completed by the government and put in service.

#### CORNELL PLANTATIONS

Under the able direction and almost wholly as a result of Professor Bristow Adams' efforts the quarterly bulletin continues to attract favorable attention.

Maintenance has stepped up. The Arboretum Road has been resurfaced. Gifts are coming in and limited funds are made available annually by the Endowed and New York State College of Agriculture.

The residuary estate of John R. Armstrong of Rochester, N. Y., amounting to some \$14,000 was left to the Cornell Plantations.

Professor J. N. Cornman has been appointed half time Director of the Plantations.

#### ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

The handling of all sports equipment and general maintenance of Athletic areas are covered by Athletic Association employees. Buildings and Grounds employees are provided on call for emergency and other work involving building repairs.

The steel stands were completed last autumn on schedule as well as the new Press Box. The Crescent still suffers from lack of maintenance and much repair work is indicated.

All charts and tabulations covering Buildings and Grounds Department have been omitted in this report this year, but it is planned to renew such records in 1949.

# REPORT OF THE MANAGER OF PURCHASES

For the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 1948

To the Vice President for Business:

During the past fiscal year, the procurement situation gradually eased as compared with the two previous postwar years. Fewer commodities have been on the critical list and, while general commodity prices have gone up, the rise in percentage has been much less than that of last year. Although fuels have gone up 28% and general industrial commodities 13%, paint products are virtually unchanged, chemicals are down 4% and coarse textiles 9%. The steel shortage is still a problem, especially pipe and nails, paper is scarce and brass fittings are tight. On the other hand, textiles, alcohol, electrical supplies and some paint products are somewhat less expensive. With expanding activities on the part of the University, especially in the field of nutrition, nuclear physics, aeronautical engineering and industrial and labor relations, and with budget income depleted due to inflation, it is imperative that the utmost care be exercised with reference to all expenditures. The Purchasing Department is committed to a program of source and commodity research, and a careful screening of all requisitions. Its aim is to provide competence and economy in the procurement problems of the coming year.

Surplus property acquisitions during the year have been of large volume and more selective than during the previous year. Equipment, which proved of great value to many departments of the University, has been obtained through the disposal programs of the War Assets Administration, the Federal Works Agency, and the donation programs of the Army and Navy through the State Educational Agency for Surplus Property. The large bulk of surplus property of the type useful to education has, however, been reduced in volume and availability and both the War Assets Administration and the Federal Works Agency are gradually discontinuing their activities and ceasing operations. Public Law 889, permitting a broad program of donation by the Army, Navy and Air Force, is not yet implemented, but it is hoped that many items useful in equipping and maintaining University facilities may be made available as soon as this new program goes into effect.

The total volume of expenditures handled through the Purchasing Department during the fiscal year amounted to \$4,165, 844.08. This figure represents an increase of nearly 34% over the expenditures of the previous year and is nearly double that of 1945-46. The average expenditure per purchase order was \$141.00 as compared

to \$118.00 last year and is double the figure for three years ago.

That the doubling and even tripling of expenditures in the last few years has been handled without a proportionate increase in purchasing office expense is due to several factors. The percentage increase in the cost of items has been greater than the percentage increase of salaries and expenses; the staff of the department has gained rapidly in competence and efficiency; adequate space provided by the new administration building has resulted in appreciable economies; and the development of affiliated services has greatly simplified procedures and reduced costs.

Equipment purchases for new buildings have included the completion of the School of Nutrition, the major portion of the Laboratory of Nuclear Physics and the Synchrotron, and a great deal of preliminary work on the equipment for

Statler Hall.

The unprecedented increase in the volume of procurement was naturally reflected in the activities of College Stores, Chemical Stores and the service departments under the direction of the Purchasing Department. The total volume of issues from College Stores increased from \$525,144.04 last year to \$714,142.22 during this fiscal year, an increase of 36%. This increase occurred in spite of the fact that the billing by College Stores of large expenditures for construction, which was previously handled for the Department of Buildings and Grounds, has been discontinued. The inventory of stock on hand in College Stores shows some increase over the past year, mostly due to increased costs and seasonal stocks. A cautious policy is being followed on stock inventory, although it is essential to assure adequate supplies for anticipated needs.

The addition of a wing on the southeast corner of the Stores and Service Building was completed during the year and is used for general stock and particularly for electronics supplies and equipment. It was very fortunate that this space was available to house the large quantity of surplus electronics items obtained through the War Assets Administration and to serve as a sorting and distributing area for such material. With the start of the new fiscal year, this activity is being set up as a separate operating unit to be known as Electronics Stores. It is contemplated that a complete stock of commonly used electronics components will be stocked and that provision will be made for repairing equipment and furnishing advisory service.

The Chemical Stores issues for the fiscal year amounted to \$89,069.68, an increase over the previous year of about 22%. However, existing facilities provided adequate service for expansion in student instruction and research. During the year, the entire stockroom area was equipped with a sprinkler system and a second room assigned for storage of dangerous chemicals. Both of these rooms are equipped with special provisions for safety from fire and explosion. Fire and safety inspectors have been very complimentary with reference to the facilities at Chemical Stores.

The volume of issues from the University Print Shop amounted to \$103,498.57, which shows an increase of about \$38,000 or nearly 60% over the previous year. This expansion was accomplished under serious handicaps of shortage of space, personnel, equipment and supplies, but a new Ozalid printer and a new Multilith added materially to the volume of business. Additional competent personnel was also obtained. During the year, the basement under the Print Shop was excavated, a concrete floor laid, and an elevator will be installed to facilitate the use of this basement for paper storage. This will release the entire first floor for printing plant use and will practically double available space. Even with some unavoidable delay in delivery of necessary equipment, it is expected that the new and expanded facilities will be available in the fall.

The Typewriter Division issues during the past fiscal year amounted to \$70,363.38, as compared to \$77,276.71 during the previous year. This reflects a reduction in the purchase of new equipment, all of which clears through the Typewriter Division. Some time was lost due to moving into the larger quarters provided by the construction of an addition to the Stores and Service Building which quadruples the area previously available for this activity. Facilities are now adequate for the efficient servicing of business machines including typewriters, mimeographs, dictating

machines and other items.

The Photographic Science Service issues during the past year totaled \$55,693.43 as compared to \$36,480.51 for the previous year. New purchases of equipment and new personnel have now provided practically all facilities for taking care of the essential photographic needs of the University. The situation at 7 South Avenue, however, is quite unsatisfactory; the space is inadequate and poorly arranged; the wooden building is a fire-trap and riddled with termites; and its location is inconvenient. A concerted effort is being made to locate space in a permanent building closer to the center of the campus.

The Machine Records Division, after a year of expanded activity mostly in connection with administrative records, student grades, pay rolls, and accounting services, has been transferred from an affiliated service of the Purchasing Department to an administrative section under the direction of the Registrar's office.

The University Messenger Service has handled the campus mail with considerable improvement in service, due to adequate personnel and transportation, and the central mailing room in the administration building has fulfilled a vital need

in handling both U.S. mail and campus mail.

There has been a continuation of the cordial relationships between the Purchasing Department and the State Departments in Albany. The Department of Audit and Control, State Education Department, State Division of Standards and Purchase, and the State Educational Agency for Surplus Property have been cooperative and helpful in the handling of the many problems and transactions involving the State Colleges under the management and control of Cornell University.

The Purchasing Department has had close contacts, through official representation and committee assignments, with the Educational and Institutional Cooperative Service, an affiliate of the National Association of Educational Buyers. Through contracts covering the requirements of over six hundred colleges and universities,

this incorporated cooperative has been of great help in effecting material savings in the purchase of a wide variety of items. Membership in the National Association of Purchasing Agents provides the Purchasing Department staff with current data on commodities, economic conditions and prices as well as competent consultant

Following this report is a summary showing the number of requisitions handled, the number of purchase orders issued, the amount of expenditures through purchase orders and the total amount of issues through Chemical Stores, College Stores, the University Print Shop, the Typewriter Division and the Photographic Science Service. These figures do not include certain contracts for which purchase orders are not issued.

# REPORT OF THE MANAGER OF RESIDENTIAL HALLS

To the Vice President for Business:

For the Department of Residential Halls the year 1947–48 was characterized by continuous adjustment of its operations to rapidly changing conditions. As the year began, housing and dining facilities were still being expanded and improved to complete projects started in 1946–47. Before the year's end, some of these same projects were being curtailed or abolished in adjustments to changing needs and

economic pressures.

For the fall opening, September 23, the Glen Springs Hotel project was complete and fully utilized by married students and faculty. The Veterans' Housing project on the Kline Road site was completed during the summer of 1947, adding housing facilities for 240 single men. From the renovation of the interior of the Navy Mess Hall emerged the Baker Cafeteria, food service facility for men; space for athletic training tables, a furniture repair shop, and additional storage space for food, furniture and equipment. Before the year's end, plans were being made to terminate the operation of the Glen Springs Hotel and curtail the dining service at both Sage Cafeteria and Baker Cafeteria; such curtailment due largely to the fact that these operations were not self-supporting.

Within the fiscal year a few urgently needed deferred maintenance projects were initiated. Certain areas of Risley Dormitory, the Baker Group, Balch Dormitory and Anna Comstock Halls were redecorated and minor structural repairs made. Lack of funds, coupled with high cost of labor, limited maintenance work to only a portion of what was needed. The flood water which struck the campus on August 15 caused damage to buildings operated by Residential Halls estimated at \$9,000. The largest single item of expense was the replacement of the stone wall south of Balch Dormitory.

Dining Service:

Dining services were operated throughout the year at the following locations:

East Ithaca Plant:

As in previous years, the East Ithaca Plant facilities were used to near capacity. Food and service amounting to \$689,724.69 was handled by the laundry, meat

rooms, bakery, ice cream plant, storage warehouse and trucking service.

It was a year of consistently increasing costs, particularly food, fuel and labor. Charges to students were not increased proportionately within the year, the net result being deficit operation. (Statements of financial operations, showing detailed income and expense figures, are given in Schedules No. 27, 28, and 29 of the Annual Treasurer's Report.)
