

The last Will and Testament of Maria T. Hunt; wife of Ward V. Hunt, of Utica, N. Y.

I dispose of my property as follows:

1st. I give, devise and bequeath to my sister Sarah A. Van Rensselaer and to my neice ^{Caroline} M. V. R. Hillhouse, all my property of every name and nature, except such property as I may be the owner of, or entitled to, by distribution or as dower, or by bequest or devise, under the will of my said husband Ward Hunt, in case that I should survive him. Said property to be divided between the said Sarah A. Van Rensselaer and Caroline M. V. R. Hillhouse, share and share alike, and in the event of the death of either of them before my decease, then the survivor to take the entire property hereby devised and bequeathed.

2nd. In the event that I should survive my said husband, Ward Hunt, and should be the owner of, or be entitled to property, real or personal, from him by distribution or as dower or by bequest or devise ^{under his will, I give, bequeath and devise} all such property, interest or claim of every kind unto Ward Hunt Junr. and Eliza ^{S.}, wife of Arthur B. Johnson, both of Utica, N. Y., in equal parts and proportions, share and share alike, and to their heirs in case of the death of either of them before me. I appoint Ward Hunt Jr. executor of this my last will and testament.
