NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

Keyword Searching Now Available on the Online Catalog (NOTIS)

Researchers can search the NOTIS online catalog from their own computers by title, author, and subject. Now a new feature has been added—keyword searching. A keyword search looks for a word or a combination of words in author, title, or subject fields. To search by a keyword, type **K=(word) <enter>**. Keywords may be combined by connecting them with logical or positional operators such as **k=diet and Japan** or **k=diet or nutrition**. You can search phrases as follows: **k=acid adj rain**. The system ignores certain common stopwords such as **be, what, about, many, dr, in, most**. For example, **k=truth in lending** responds **No entries found**. However, **k=truth adj lending** retrieves the right record.

Outstanding Employee Award
Call for Nominations

Twice each year the GEC solicits nominations for Outstanding Employee to be announced either at the Station Club Picnic in July or at the November Banquet. The catch is that a fellow worker must first submit the name of his/her nominee, with supporting materials, to the GEC Nominations and Elections Committee.

We will publish a list of nominees and their nominators so that you will have a full picture as to which candidate you would like to support. Supporting letters or comments can then be sent to the nominator of your candidate. The nominator will then collate all supporting materials, attach a paragraph or letter stating why the nominee should receive this award, and forward the documentation to the Nominations Committee. These packets will be evaluated by a volunteer panel of department representatives not currently on the GEC. The panel will convene to select the awardee.

Current deadlines are:

- June 17 Submission of names of nominee and nominator to GEC Nominations and Elections Committee (Dale Frankish (Field Research Unit), ext. 296 or Vegetable Research Farm 789-3689; or Steve Spangler (Entomology) ext. 341.
- June 21 *Station Notes* listing of these names with a call for employees to submit supporting materials to the nominators.
- June 28 Nominators submit all supporting materials to GEC Nominations Committee.
- July 3 Panel meets to select Outstanding Employee.
- July 12 Outstanding Employee announced at Station Club Picnic.
