GOFFINET NAMED NYS GRAPE EXTENSION COORDINATOR

An appointment of significance to growers and others involved in New York's grape industry was announced today.

A former research associate in the field of fruit plant anatomy, Martin C. Goffinet, HS, received the appointment this week. He becomes Cornell's statewide Grape Extension coordinator.

Although Goffinet will continue to be headquartered at the Station, he will travel extensively throughout New York. His role will be to coordinate and enhance ongoing communications among Cornell scientists, Extension staff and other members of the grape industry relative to research and Extension programs.

"A similar program is in place for those involved in the vegetable industry in the state, and that program, also based here, has been recognized as among the best in the nation," said Director Plane in announcing the appointment. "We are confident that Dr. Goffinet will act as a frequent and knowledgeable contact person with grape growers as well as the many groups and individuals involved in this important New York agricultural/industrial enterprise."

Part of the new appointee's job will be to conduct research projects that will investigate developmental changes in grapevines, from bud break to dormancy, and studies involving such issues as pathological factors, environmental stresses and the impact of management techniques.

It is expected that Goffinet will assume chairmanship of a statewide Extension Viticulture Work Group (EVWG) soon to be formed. Membership of this multi-disciplinary group will include scientists, administrators, Extension specialists, buyers, processors, suppliers and others.

Goffinet is a native of Louisville, Kentucky. He received B.S. and M.S. degrees from Louisville and a

Ph.D. in Botany from the University of Minnesota. He joined Cornell as a research associate in 1982. Goffinet's wife, Apryl, is an accomplished Geneva-area weaver. The Goffinets and their two children live at 3109 Pre-emption Road.

Searching Bibliographic Databases:

This workshop provides an introduction to citation searching in online and compact disk bibliographic data bases such as *Biological Abstracts*, *Phychological Abstracts*, *ERIC*, and *Index Medicus*. The references retrieved can be printed out or downloaded to disk. You will be given an overview of these databases and the BRS After Dark system will be demonstrated. (Note: this session is a prerequisite to using the Mann Library U-Search service, but is not a handson workshops.) *No previous experience with a computer is necessary*.

Award Viewed as Well Deserved

ASHS HONORS BECKER FOR EXTENSION EFFORTS

The American Society of Horticultural Science has given an Award of Excellence to Bob Becker, HS, recognizing his dedicated and effective work in the area of agricultural Extension.

Becker received the award during the annual ASHS meetings earlier this month in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He has been involved in Extension work as both an agent and a specialist for nearly 30 years.

In bestowing the honor, the ASHS cited Becker's work in the area of disseminating information about processing vegetables among the state's growers. Mentioned in particular were his efforts in reorganizing small, isolated workshops and committees (many of them on county levels) into regional, and now state-

wide, advisory committees and conferences for maximum impact and practicality. This has kept Extension

programs in tune with expressed growers' needs and has become a model for other informational Extension efforts.

Commenting on the award, HS Department Chairman Bob Andersen said, "This award is rather special to an Extension faculty member like Bob because nominations for it can come only from local county Extension agents with whom the nominee has collaborated."

Becker received both B.S. and M.S. degrees in horticulture and plant pathology from the University of New Hampshire. He has done post-graduate work at the University of Missouri. A resident of Rushville, Becker served as a captain in the U.S. Army for five years before joining Cornell.

Also, it should prove to be much more convenient to have liquid nitrogen available right on our campus.
