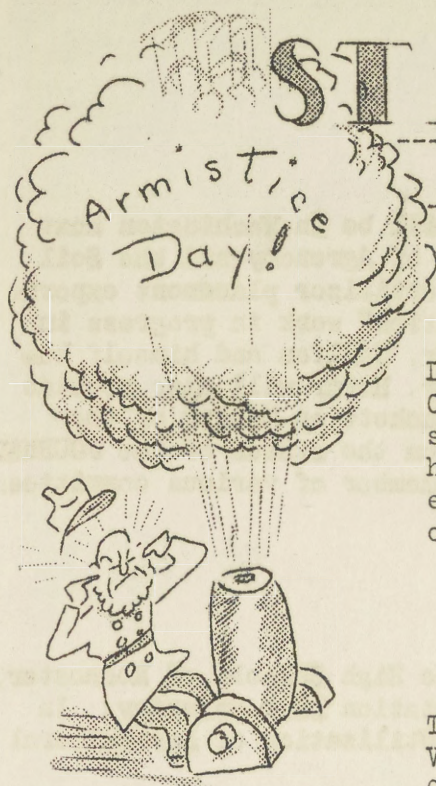

GOING TO WASHINGTON

Mr. Sayre, Dr. Hofer, Mr. Slater, and Mr. Luckett will be in Washington next week in connection with meetings of the American Society of Agronomy and the Soil Science Society of America. Mr. Sayre is reporting on fertilizer placement experiments with vegetable crops, Dr. Hofer on seed "sterilization" work in progress in his laboratory, and Mr. Slater will present a paper by Mr. Carlton and himself before one of the Sections of the Soil Science Society. Dr. Hofer will also preside at a round table conference on legume inoculants. Mr. Luckett as Editor of the JOURNAL of the American Society of Agronomy will report on the status of the JOURNAL and participate in several conferences as an ex officio member of various committees.
