Orange Cauliflower Gains Attention

Dr. Michael Dickson is shown in front of a photograph of an orange cauliflower now in the developmental stage. The unusually colored vegetable is the product of a mutant orange cauliflower, first found in a field of white cauliflower in Southern Ontario, bred with a white variety. The color is the result of a high level of carotene content, which converts to vitamin A when ingested.

FIRE WISE ADVICE

Spring is here, grass is green, time for lawn mowers to come out. Lawn mowers can cut people as easily as they do grass. For fewer mower mishaps: (1) Make sure that the lawn is clear of stones, sticks, trash, and other objects before mowing. (2) Mow across the slope of a hill with a push mower, up and down with a riding mower. (3) Check the grass collector frequently and replace worn out bags. (4) Be sure the blades have stopped and the engine is off before adjusting or examining the blades. (5) Check that all nuts and bolts are properly tightened. (6) Never refill the gas tank when the motor is hot. A safety tip from Cornell Life Safety Services.
