### STATION SETS DEER HUNTING POLICY for EMPLOYEES

Station employees only, selected by a lottery system, will be allowed to hunt deer this year on selected Station farms with bow and arrow from October 16-December 15.

The ground rules are these: Hunting will be allowed only before 8:00 am and after 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. Regular hunting hours will be allowed on Saturdays and Sundays. If you wish to use a tree stand, it must be portable. Individuals must register their name and a copy of their license number and bow stamp number in Pat Krauss' office. All names will be placed in a hat and 21 names will be pulled from the hat in Pat's office at 2:00 pm Thursday, October 8.

An experienced panel has determined how many individuals can hunt on what Station farms. You will be given the opportunity to select your hunting area in the order that your name is pulled from the hat. Once you select an area, that is where you must stay for the season.

All individuals selected must sign a waiver of disclaimer absolving the Station and Cornell University of any responsibility in case of an injury or accident. Also, employees chosen will be shown farm boundaries by Ray Mallaber if they wish. Finally, each person will be given a Sta-

tion permit that has recorded your name, bow stamp number, and site selected. You must carry this with you any time you are hunting.

Farms involved and the number of bow hunters that will be allowed on each are: Childs—1, South Crittenden—1, Smith—1, Fruit and Vegetable Research—8, Lucey—2, Robbins—1, Darrow A—2, and Wellington—5.

If interested in this organized deer harvest for bow hunters, please send your name and a copy of your license and bow stamp to Pat Krauss, Jordan Hall, not later than 1:59 p.m. on Thursday, October 8.
