## What will you find in the Web Site Archives?

The North Carolina State Government Web Site Archives & Access Program (WSAAP) is composed of web sites created by North Carolina's state agencies. The WSAAP currently contains archived web sites back to 1996, and it is updated on an ongoing basis. These sites may be viewed for free by all users. Sites in the WSAAP were collected using an automated web crawler operated by the [Internet Archive](#). (To learn more about the Internet Archive's Archive-It service, click [here](#).)

Through the WSAAP, users can access important state government information that was once available on the web but that may no longer exist there or in any other location. This information includes, but is not limited to

- Board and Commission meeting minutes;
- publications that were only available on the Web;
- governmental policies;
- historically significant photographs and videos;
- state-wide statistics; and
- social networking sites.

The topics covered by sites in this collection cover all of the diverse areas that government agencies encompass. Moreover, when seen as a whole the WSAAP documents how North Carolina has developed its web presence over time and the different trends in government priorities.

All web sites in the WSAAP are captured at least on an annual basis. Most state agency web sites are captured quarterly or more frequently. For more information on the how we select and collect sites, please see [Our Web Site Archives & Access Program: History and Procedures](#).

Finally, users are reminded that the materials included in the WSAAP are made available for use in research, teaching, and private study, [pursuant to the U.S. Copyright law](#). 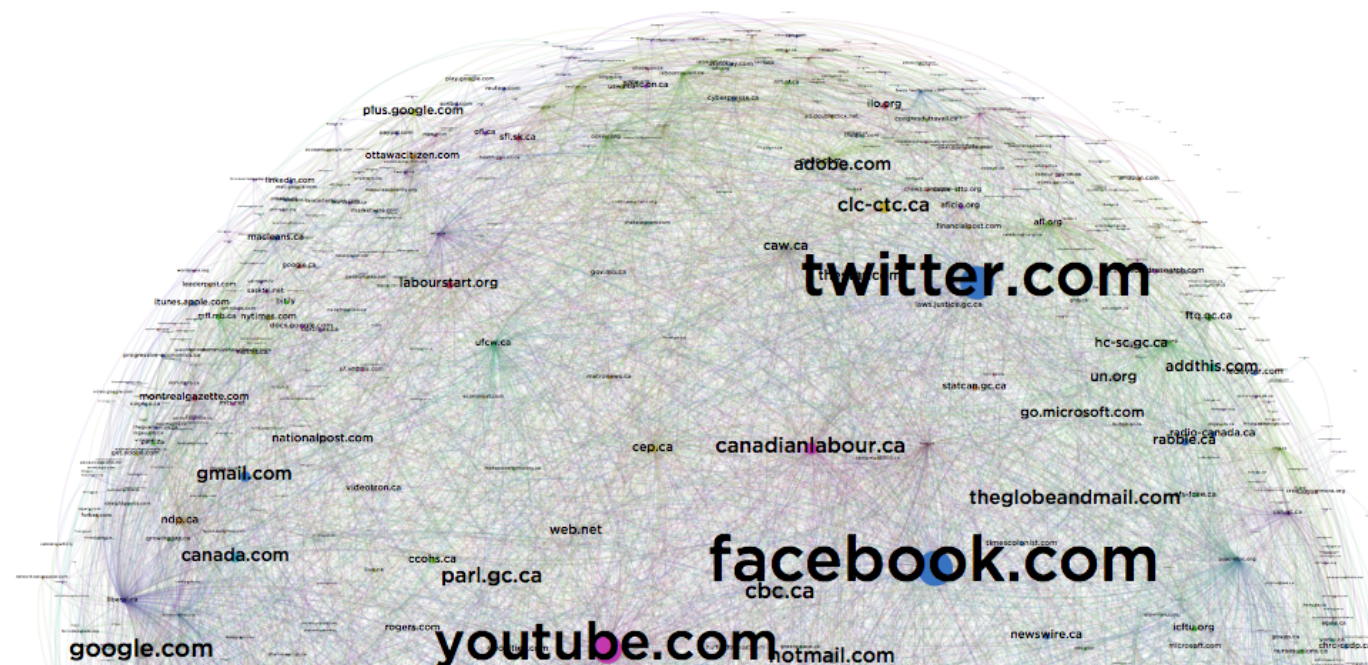

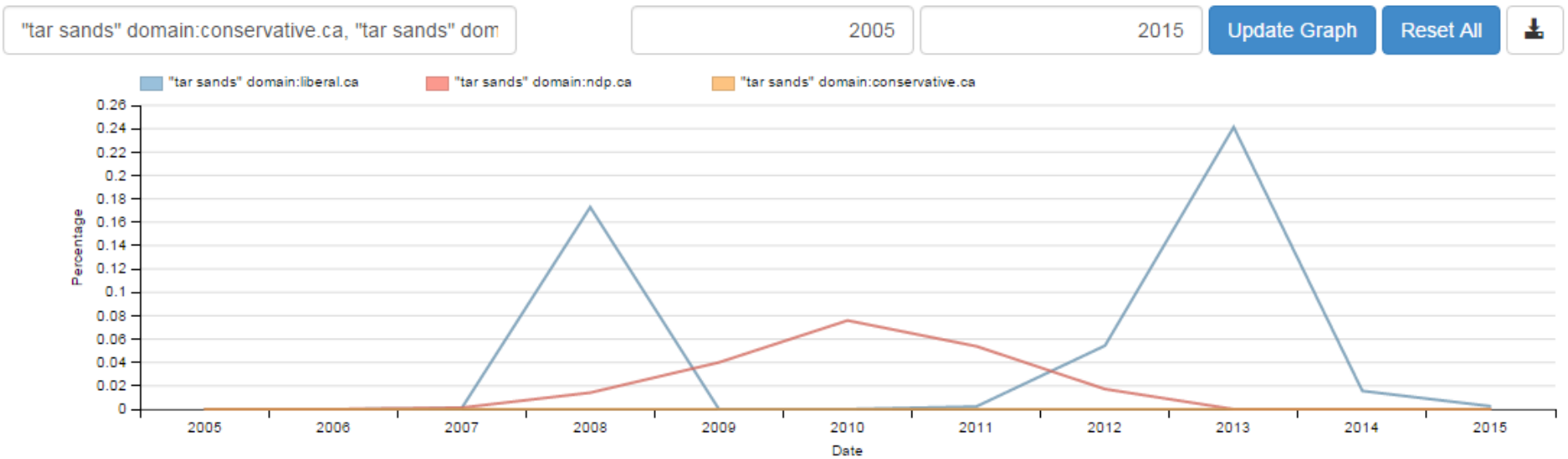

It should be no surprise that in 2009, the prominent NDP leader Jack Layton was the most frequent person mentioned on their site.


Yesterday morning, I used *Mathematica's* new geographic processes to use our Warchase NER output in order to generate maps based on web archived locations – I then wondered what we could do with the frequency of individuals?

One challenge I have often encountered with NER output is the “what now?” question. We generate fantastic lists of frequently appearing individuals, organizations, and people, but apart from exploring tables or finding use for network analysis, I haven’t been terribly compelled by this (one exception is the *Trading Consequences* ‘location cloud’ visualization, which we’re currently trying to rip off/borrow from)

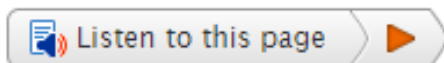

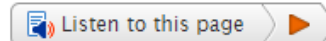

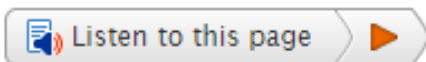

Soon after we were joined by Archive-It partner Washington University in St. Louis, MO who contributed lists of URLs and solicited URLs from communities in and around Ferguson. Maryland Institute for Technology in the Humanities contributed a significant number of URLs extracted from tweets about Michael Brown and Ferguson. In December we expanded the collection to include content related to the July 17th chokehold death of Eric Garner in Staten Island, NY, and the reactions around the country to the acquittal of the police officers in both cases. The collection then progressed further to reflect the movement building in reaction to the perceived unjust police violence against people of color. Today the #blacklivesmatter Web Archive contains news articles, blogs, social media, and other websites related to Ferguson, Michael Brown, Eric Garner, protests and demonstrations around the country, and seeks to document the movement as it grows and evolves. Much has been [written](#) about the significance of Twitter as the [recent events](#) in Ferguson echoed round the Web, the country, and the world. I happened to be at the Society of American Archivists meeting 5 days after Michael Brown was killed. During our [panel discussion](#) someone asked about the role that archivists should play in documenting the event.

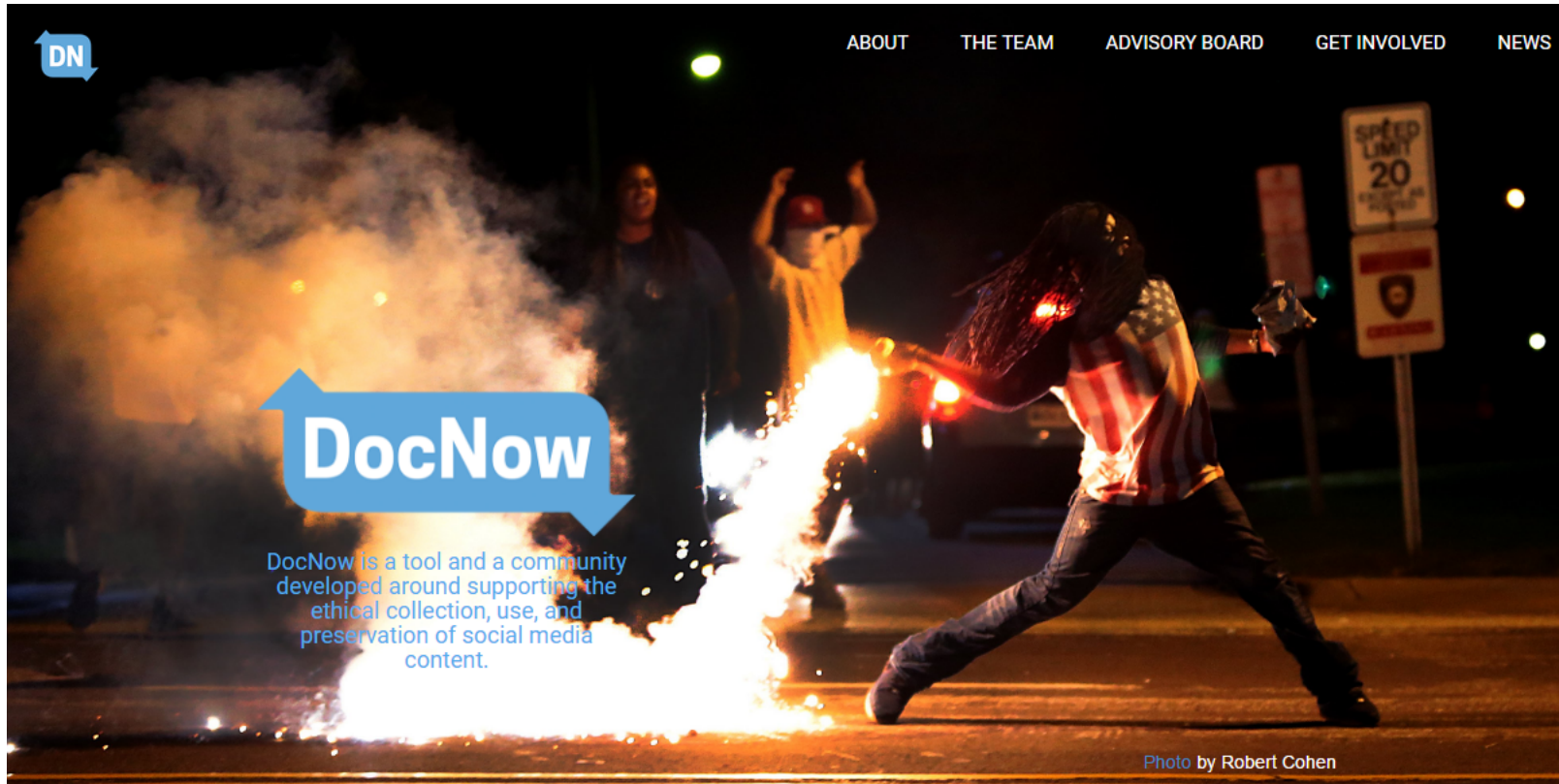
There was wide agreement that Ferguson was a painful reminder of the type of event that archivists working to “interrogate the role of power, ethics, and regulation in information systems” should be documenting. But what to do? Unfortunately we didn’t have time to really discuss exactly how this agreement translated into action.

Fortunately the very next day the [Archive-It](#) service run by the [Internet Archive](#) [announced](#) that they were collecting seed URLs for a Web archive related to Ferguson. It was only then, after also having finally read [Zeynep Tufekci](#)’s terrific [Medium post](#), that I slapped myself on the forehead ... of course, we should try to archive the tweets. Ideally there would be a “we” but the reality was it was just “me”. Still, it seemed worth seeing how much I could get done.

## ABSTRACT

In this paper, we present a new approach for building and archiving web collections about events. Our approach combines the traditional focused crawling technique with event modeling and representation.

## 1. INTRODUCTION

In the NSF funded Integrated Digital Event Archiving and Library (IDEAL) project [1] we are building an integrated system to collect, archive, organize, analyze (identify topics, summarize), access (search, browse), and visualize webpages and tweets about real world events (disasters as well as community and government activities). Event archiving is different from Domain/Site-based or Topic-based archiving. The first involves archiving a specific domain/website with all or some of the underlying subdomains/structure. The second covers a given number of webpages related to a user-defined topic.

We have identified and employed three approaches for archiving webpages about events:

Weinberg gives \$5 Million for New Library, \$1 Million for Judaic Studies Institute

## University Receives \$6 Million Gift

The University of Scranton has received a \$6 million gift from Harry Weinberg, Baltimore, the largest gift in its history. Weinberg, a former Scranton businessman, is giving \$5 million for the University's new library and \$1 million for the Judaic Studies Institute. His gift will be made through the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation.

While in Scranton, Weinberg operated the Scranton Transit Co. and the Scranton Lumber Co. He has fond recollections of the friendliness of the region and remembers Scranton as a community where people of different nationalities worked together while retaining a sense of their own heritage.

"Mr. Weinberg often told me of his high regard for the people of Scranton, people who get along well despite differing nationalities and backgrounds, while at the same time retaining a sense of their heritage," said J.A. Pansko, S.J., University president. "His regard for the University is based on the same recognition. While we have enjoyed many accomplishments, we have not forgotten our roots and still strive to be accessible to those who need us most."

Morey Myers, Scranton, a member of the Yale University law faculty and former University trustee, noted that the Weinberg gift comes from the son of immigrants who, while he did not have the opportunity to go beyond the primary grades himself, was immensely successful in business because of his ingenuity and capacity for hard work.

"His contribution to the University, a Catholic institution, is a living symbol of the generosity and the commitment to education and to interfaith understanding that are the hope for the future of our nation," Myers said.

Weinberg, 81, was born in Austria and came to the United States at the age of 4. After starting a business in Baltimore, he successfully developed public transportation interests in a number of U.S. cities. He moved to Hawaii in the early 1970s and expanded his investments into real estate and property development.

The University awarded Weinberg an honorary doctor of business administration degree in November of 1987, citing his business achievements and philanthropy. He and his wife, Jeanette, who died in August of this year, have been generous benefactors of the University for many years.

The Board of Trustees approved a plan in August of 1989 that paved the way for the final detailed design and construction of the new library. Construction of the 71,000 sq. ft. building is expected to begin in July of 1990, and should take 18 months to complete.

The library, which will cost an estimated \$13.5 million, will seat 700 users at small study carrels and tables and also provide lounge seating, small group conference/teaching areas and a 24-hour reading room. It will accommodate 300,000 volumes.

The library would better be described as a resource and information center as it will be electronically linked to major libraries

nationwide, giving faculty, students and researchers access to those collections.

Pansko described the new library as "a gateway to the future," noting that finding its construction is probably the biggest challenge of his presidency.

"Our strenuous efforts to obtain government funding did not succeed, but the University is very grateful to Glenn Peltus, vice president for planning, and Congressman Joseph McDade for their determined hard work," he said. "The past year has been like an exciting and sometimes scary roller coaster ride as hopes for government funding rose and fell. It is in this context that I feel a most special sense of gratitude to Mr. Weinberg; he gave us a magnificent gift just at the time we needed encouragement."

"I should mention for the University community that, as I indicated in my Faculty Convocation talk last September, we will still face tight budgets for the next few years, and there is much fund raising still ahead of us. We are, however, both determined to do what is necessary and optimistic of success."

The Judaic Studies Institute is an expansion of the Judaic Studies Program, which was established in 1979 through an endowment by the late Jewish community. Weinberg was one of the program's founding donors.

"The institute, still in the planning stages, will extend the work of the Judaic Studies Program to promote Jewish-Catholic-Christian dialogue and better understanding. The program, which has brought a series of eminent Jewish scholars and spokesmen to campus, will be expanded to include the Morris Galla Annual Lecture, faculty development, special speakers and additions to the library collection."

Cultural programming for the institute would include lectures or performances by noted Jewish authors, composers or performers. Also, special discussions would address Jewish-Christian relations or other topics.

Berlin Myers, cultural adviser to the governor of Pennsylvania and a member of the Judaic Studies steering committee, called the Weinberg gift "an unprecedented opportunity for growth, for service, for vision — for transcending divides into reality."

"It is one of the functions of a university to promote understanding among different groups," Pansko said. "We have been planning an additional fund raising to support the Judaic Studies Institute. That effort will continue, and now, through Mr. Weinberg's gift, we are assured that this program has a long-term future of quality service."

## Position Created To Improve Student-Neighbor Relations

The University has hired a professional staff member to further enhance relations between students living off campus and their neighbors.

Evelyn H. Nadell, who has spent the last eight years working in the higher education field, has been appointed director of commuter and off-campus affairs.

She is working directly with both student groups and also serving as a liaison between students and the community, according to James C. Bryan, vice president for student affairs.

"This is another step in an ongoing effort to develop a favorable interaction between the students and the community as they live and the University as a whole," Bryan said, noting that the new position is actually an expansion of the commuter affairs department that was created several years ago.

"There are issues that affect both groups (commuter and off-campus students), but there are also aspects that make the relationship separate. There are two distinct populations, and they need to be served in specific ways," he explained.

Nadell described her job as "being an advocate for both the students and their neighbors."

"I'm going to be available, and I'll be doing a lot of listening. I will address problems and concerns from both an educational and social context," she said.

One of her primary goals is educating students with respect to how their behavior reflects on the University's community and, most importantly, themselves.

"I want them to recognize their civic responsibilities and help them understand that what they do now will influence their

careers and personal lives long after they leave here," she explained.

Nadell said that she will strive to create an atmosphere between students and the community "that is not based on an 'us' versus 'them' mentality. We've got to get people talking to each other instead of at each other. I believe it's possible."

Among the programs she intends to develop are representative bodies that will include students from the various sections of the neighborhood and also the neighbors, particularly those involved with the Hill Neighborhood Association. She is also working with the student affairs staff to help activate what will appear to be commuter and resident students, including those who live in the dorms.

"We are trying to make the campus the focal point for student life, especially in a recreational and social context," she pointed out. "We want the students, particularly commuters and off-campus residents, to become involved with their school and what's happening here, not only during classes but in the evenings and on weekends as well."

Nadell comes to the University from the State University of New York at Buffalo, where she coordinated the Student Employment Program. She previously held various administrative positions at William Penn College in Oskaloosa, Iowa, including director of continuing education, director of alumni and public relations, special projects assistant to the president and advisor to the president.

She earned a master's degree in education, with a concentration in college teaching and student personnel, from SUNY-Buffalo. She received her bachelor's degree in

sociology and psychology from William Penn College.

Nadell is a member of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators, the College Student Personnel Association, the National Society of Fundraising Executives and the Council of Independent Colleges.

It is important to note that Evelyn's appointment is not a reaction to a crisis, said Bryan. "It is a positive step that will help us develop programs that will have a long-range effect and lasting impact."

Bryan listed other recent developments that are part of the University's efforts to improve student life and the relationships between students and the surrounding community. They include:

—renovation of The Archive, an on-campus facility that will serve as a multi-alcohol high-tech and snack bar;

—the hiring of an assistant director of student activities and more on-campus activities programming;

—more on-campus housing with the opening this fall of the 260-bed Georgian Hall dormitory;

—the addition of two clinical psychologists, plus the services of drug and alcohol counselors, to the Counseling Center;

—expansion of on-campus health care services and the addition of a wellness counselor.

—a revised Alcohol and Illicit Drug Policy that sets guidelines and penalties for all University constituents (students, faculty, staff, alumni and guests);

—a non-to-be revised policy on student behavior that will more clearly address expectations for conduct and penalties for violations.

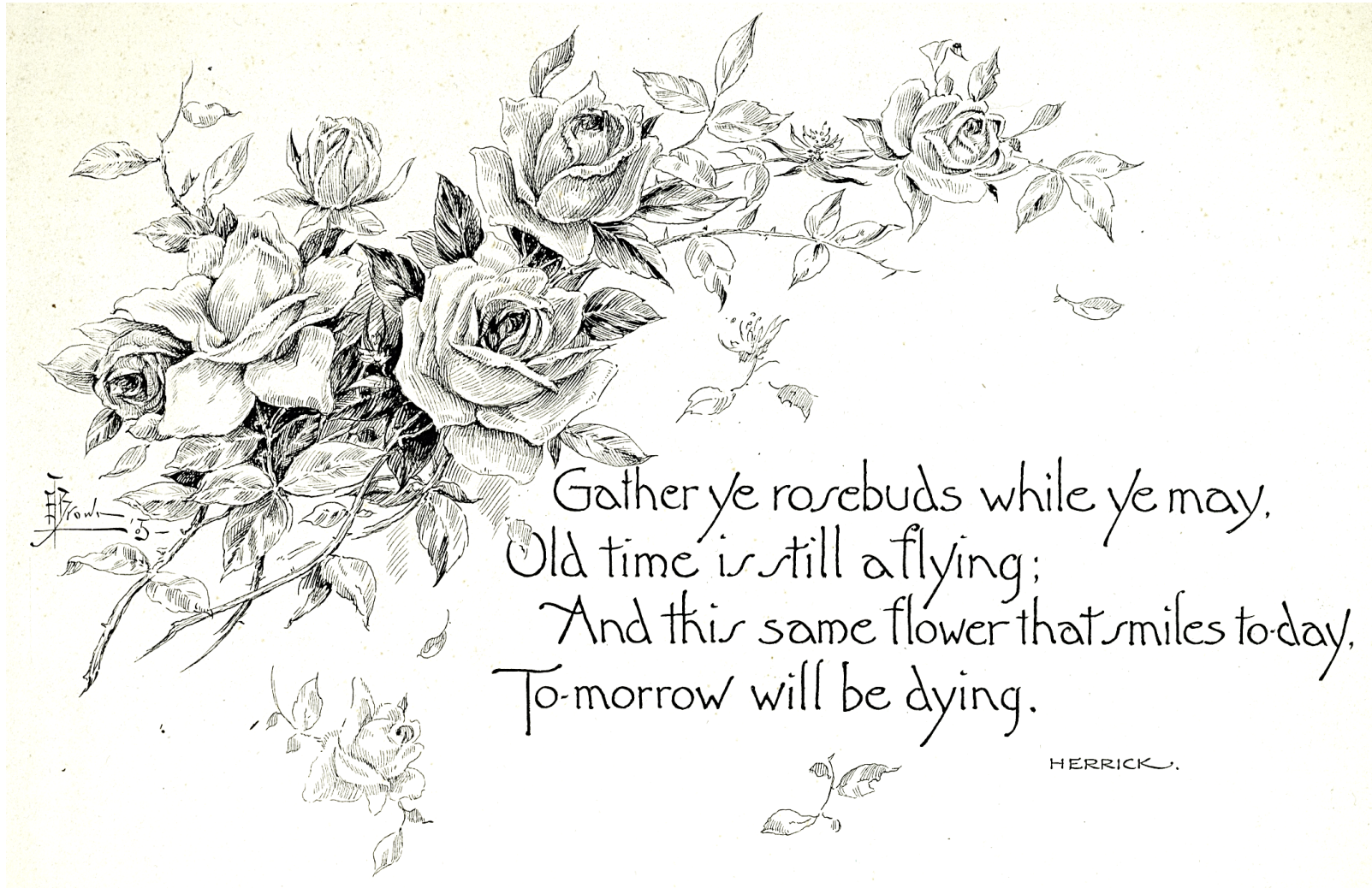

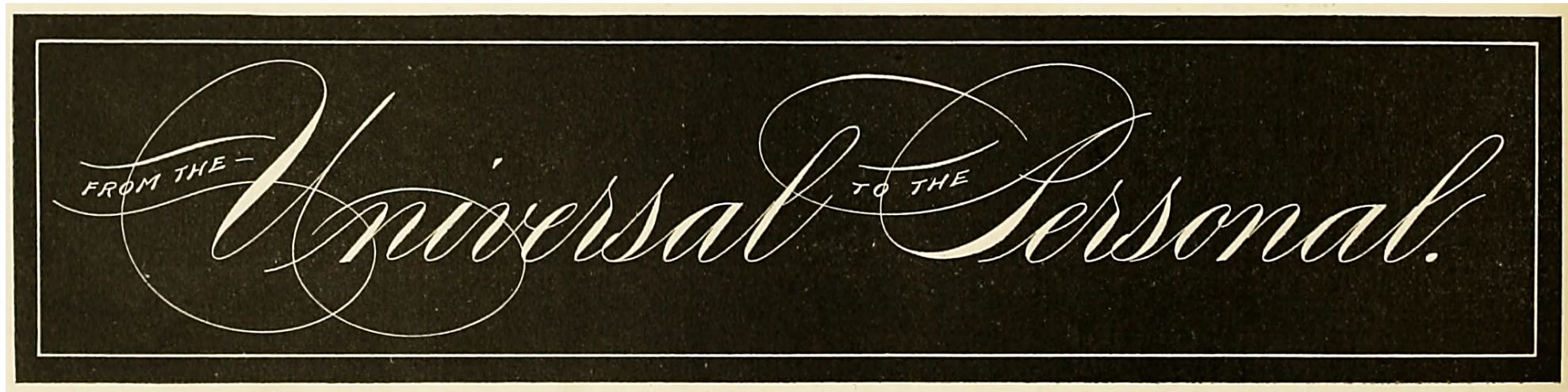

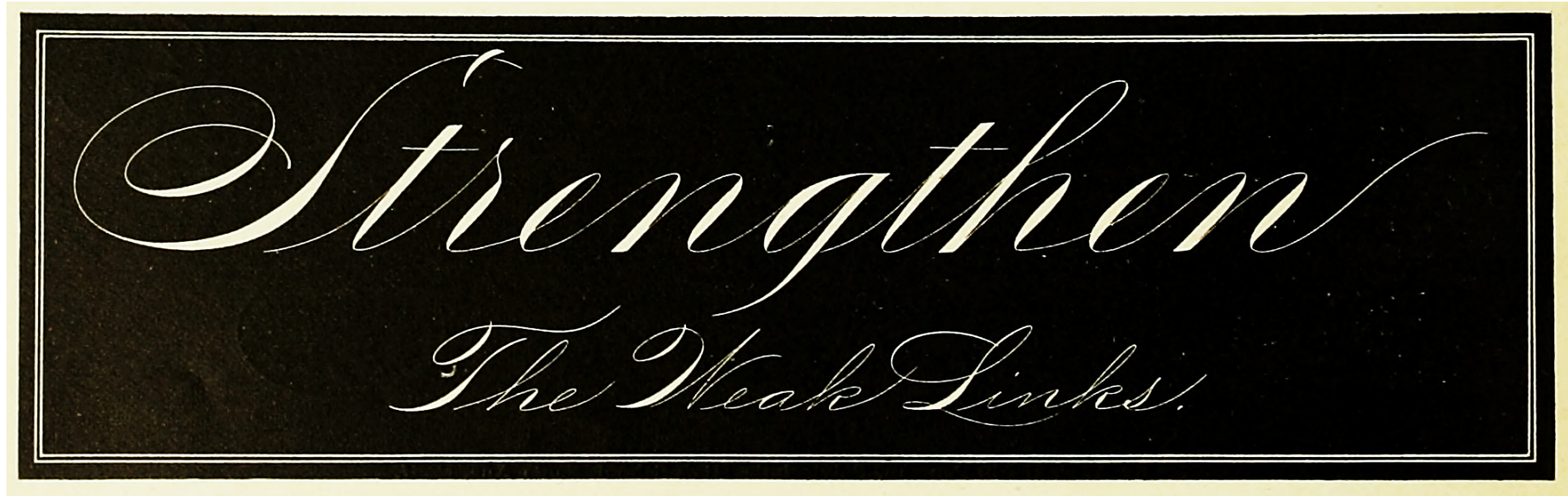
## MIDDLE STATES ACCREDITATION ACTIVITIES

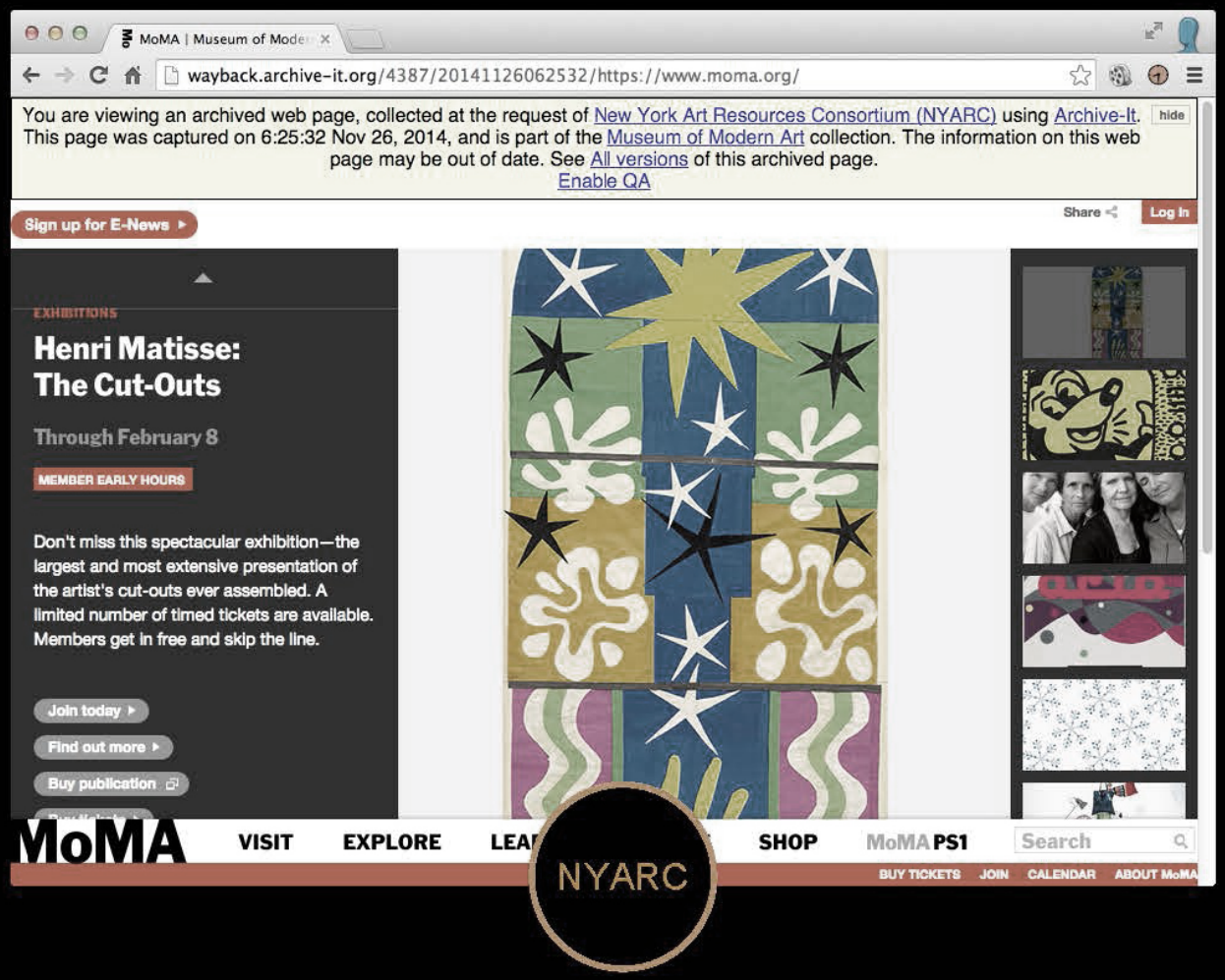
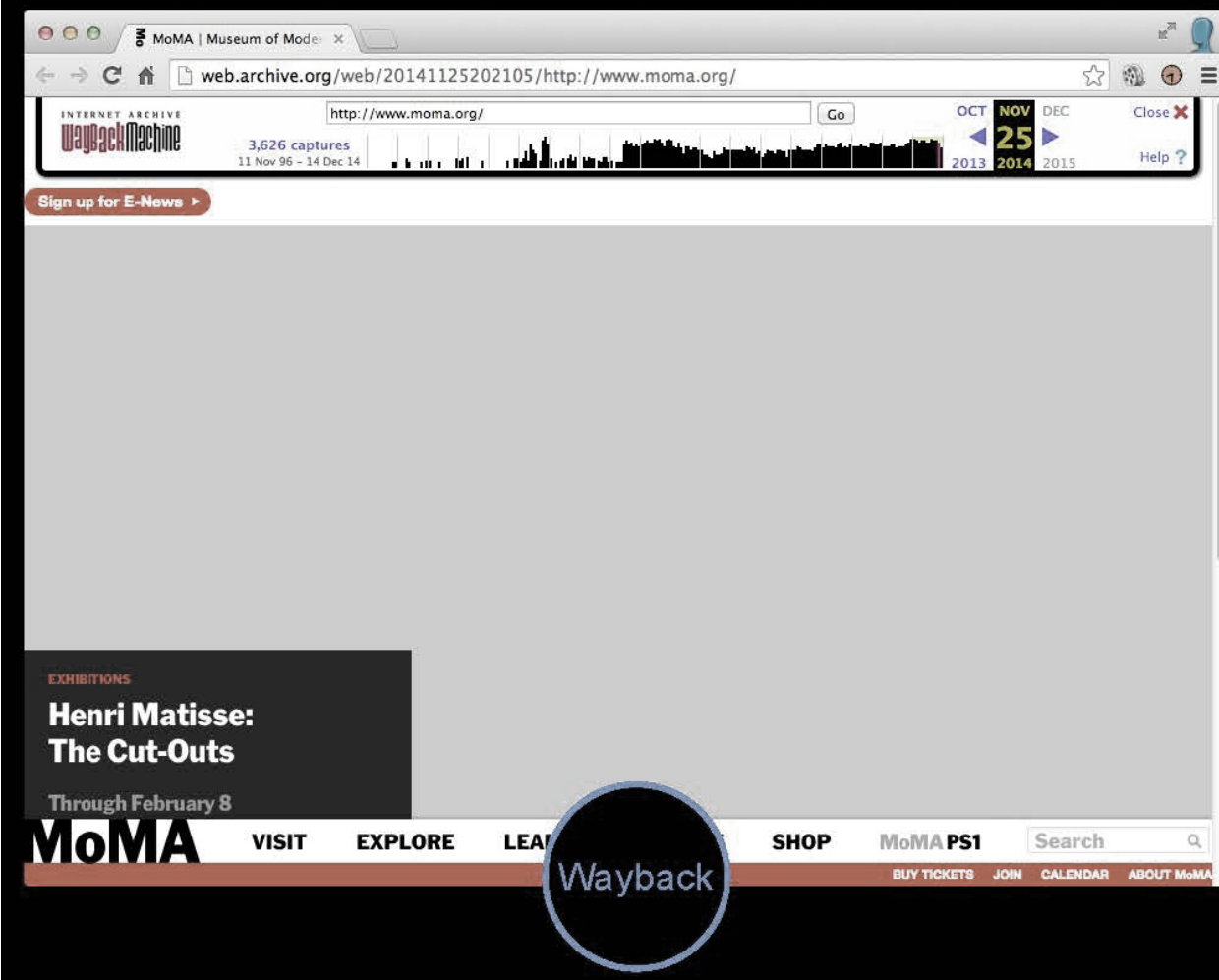
Colleges and university accreditation typically follows the following cycle:

The self study is reviewed by a team of peer reviewers, who can make recommendations of their own to the the institution, and by leadership at MSCHE.

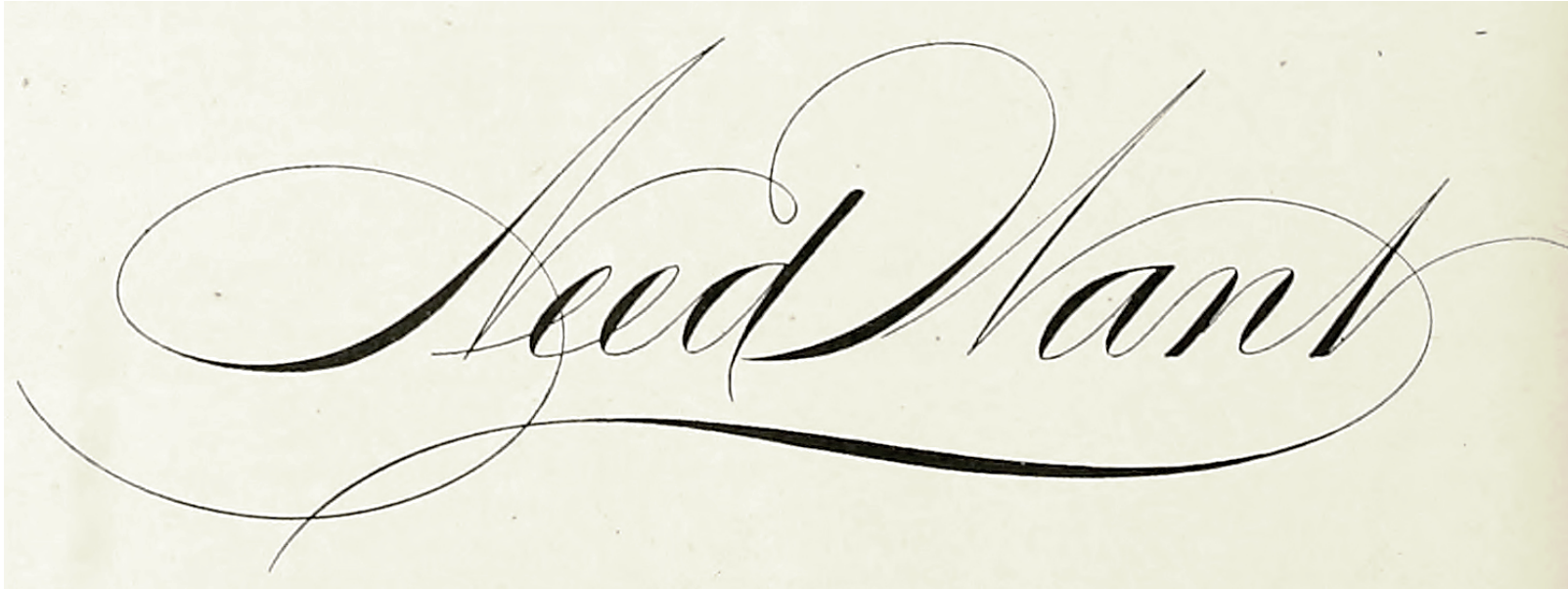

The school was founded in 1888 by Most Rev. William O'Hara, the first Bishop of Scranton, as **St. Thomas College**. It was elevated to university status in 1938, taking the name the University of Scranton. The institution was operated by the Diocese of Scranton, and later the Lasallian Christian Brothers, from 1888 to 1942. In 1942, Bishop William Joseph Hefey invited the Society of Jesus to take charge of the university. Today, The University of Scranton is one of 28 member institutions of the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities and is served by the Scranton Jesuit Community.

The university is composed of four colleges: The College of Arts and Sciences, The Kania School of Management, The Panuska College of Professional Studies, and The College of Graduate and Continuing Education (a recent merger of the Graduate School and The Dexter Hanley College).

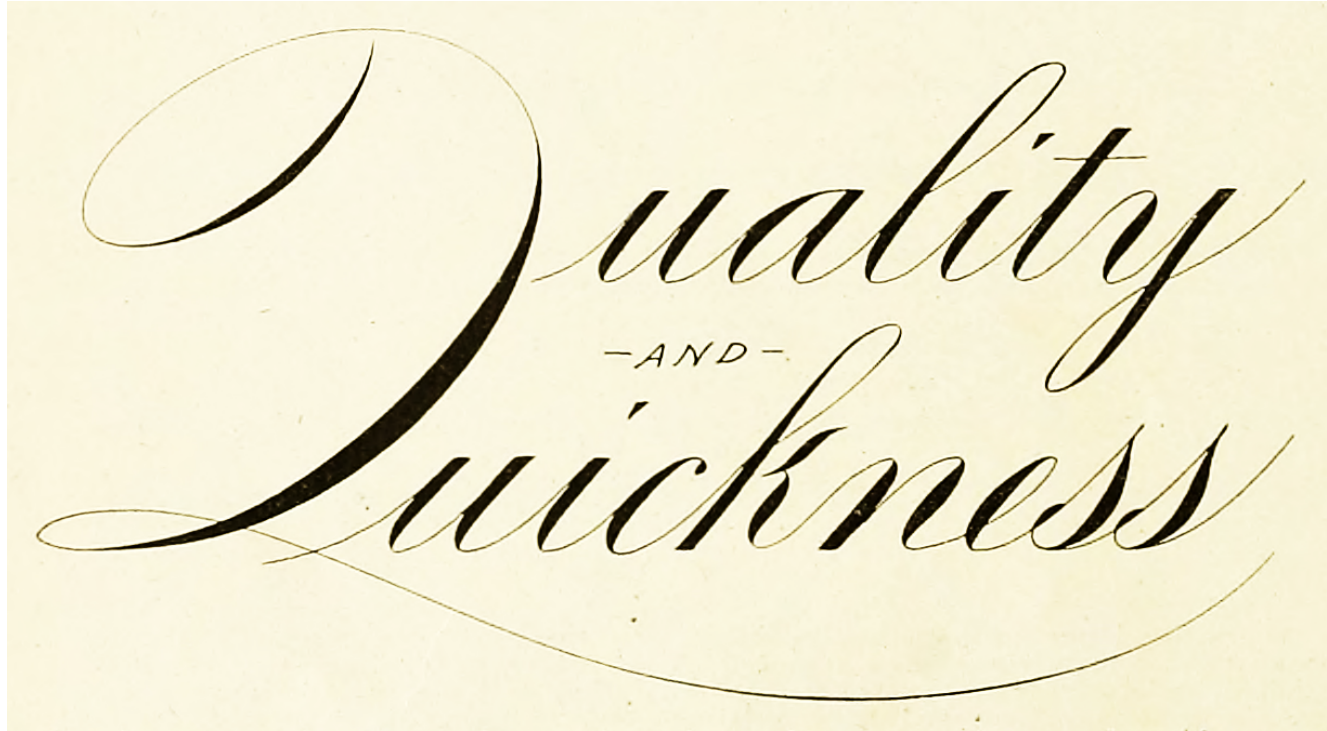

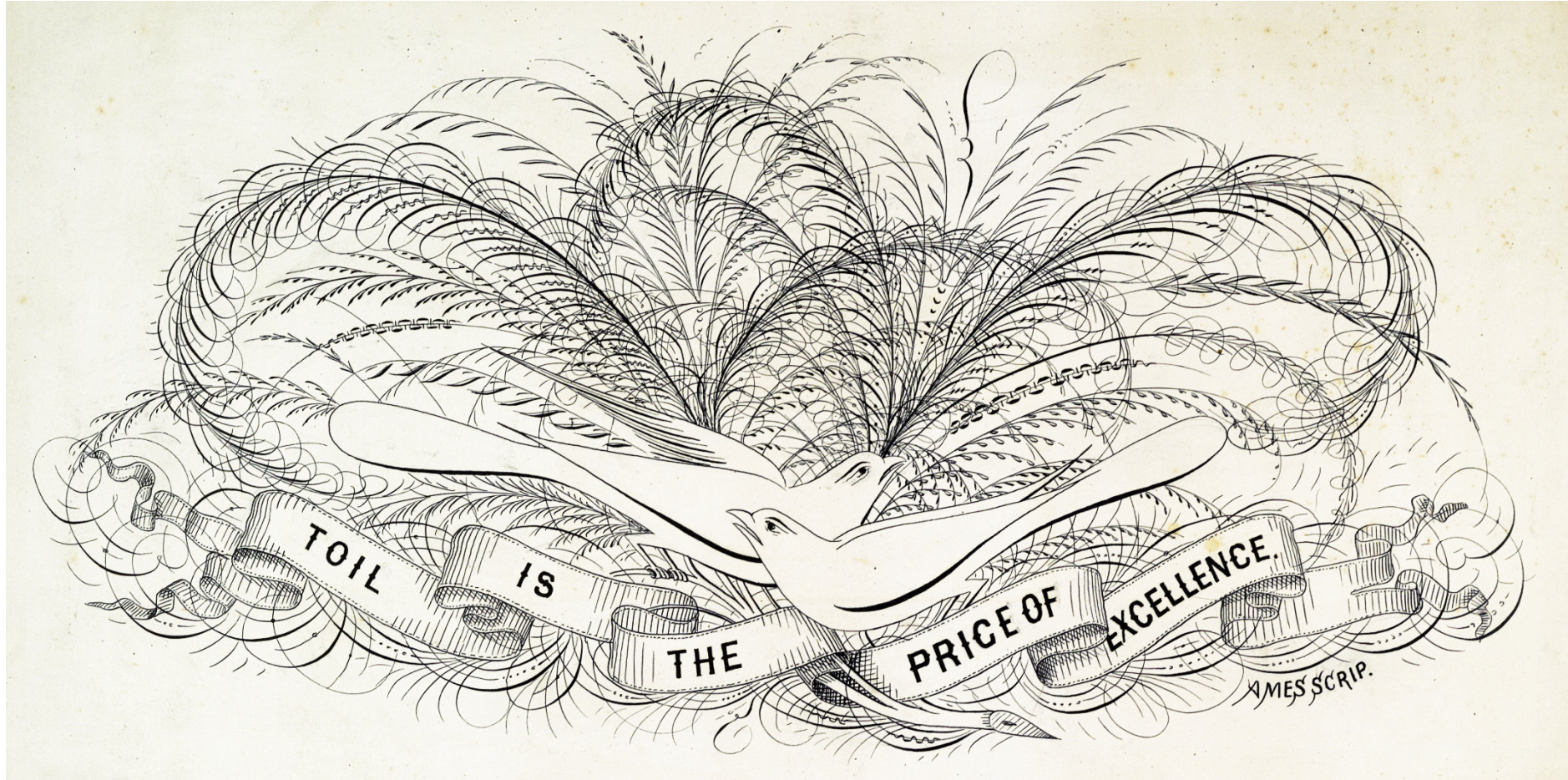

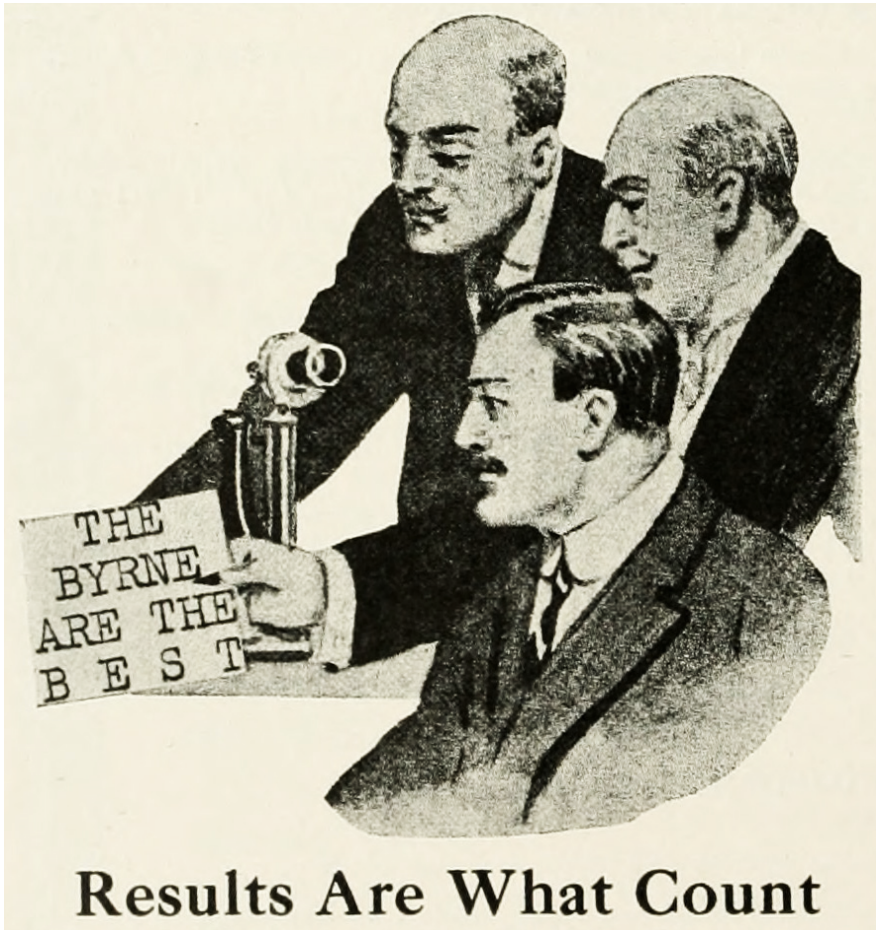
