

Bike & Walk Week 2000



Employees who have been assigned a





The Nelson J. Shaulis Award 2000

his year's recipient of the Nelson J. Schaulis Advancement of Viticulture award is Kiran Goldman from Ithaca. Goldman will be a junior in the Agriculture and Biological Engineering department in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Cornell. Four years ago her parents bought a vineyard and moved to Hammondsport, New York. "Since then," she said, "I have gained some hands-on experience planting, pruning, and

tying. As a result of this work, I developed an interest in learning more about viticulture." Goldman visited the Experiment Station on Thursday, June 1, where she was the guest of the

Horticultural Sciences Department. Like her predecessors, she met and talked with a number of faculty and staff. Unlike previous recipients of the scholarship, she could not meet the man for whom the award was named, Nelson J. Shaulis, who passed away earlier this year.

Schaulis is considered to be one of the fathers of modern viticulture—a field in which he made numerous important contributions during his distin-

guished career.

"Nelson Shaulis was one of the truly great minds in viticulture of the 20th century," Hugh Price, chairman of the Department of Horticultural Sciences commented at the time of Dr. Shaulis' passing. "His research and writings have had a profound influence on grape production in New York and around the world. He will be sorely missed by friends, colleagues and admirers and remembered every time one sees a vineyard trained to the Geneva Double Curtain system."

"I am sorry that I was unable to actually meet Nelson J. Shaulis and to experience first-hand his commitment to and enthusiasm for viticulture," Goldman said. "I am very honored, though, to have won the Shaulis Scholarship. I am excited to have the chance to get practical experience doing

research in the vineyards and working with specialists at the Geneva Station on their projects. Those to make the most of the opportunity. Dr. Shaulis has given me, and I look forward to the work I will do at the Experiment Station this summer." Goldman will be working primarily with Martin Goffinet, Jan Nyrop and Greg English-Loeb.

The Nelson J. Shaulis award was established in 1978 in honor of the then retiring scientist and world-renowned grape expert. The award funds the work of viticulture students and allows them to work directly with Cornell grape research and extension faculty on independent research projects.

"The goal of the award is to encourage students to enter the field of viticulture as a career by involving them in viticultural research," said John H. Brahm, of Arbor Hill Winery in Naples. Brahm is chairman of the N J. Shaulis Advancement of Viticulture Award Committee. The award is administered by the New York Grape Production Research Fund.
