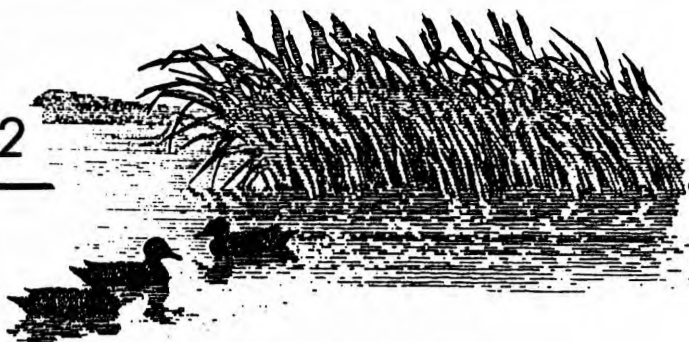

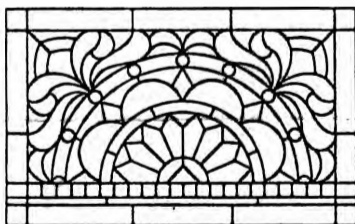

GENEVA EMPLOYEE COUNCIL

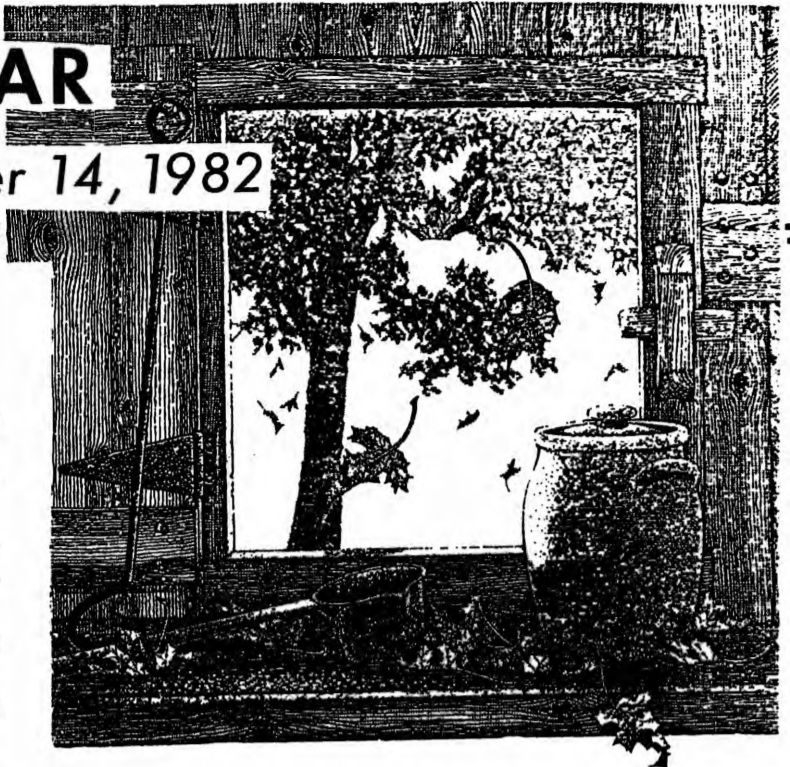

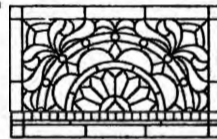
Hopefully this will be a temporary measure and can be lifted once we have assurance the problem has been alleviated.
