APPLE RESEARCH BOARD MEETS IN GENEVA

Members of the Apple Research and Development Program Advisory Board met on our campus Thursday and Friday, January 16 and 17. Purpose of this meeting was for Cornell scientists from Ithaca and Geneva to brief members of this board about the research and extension programs under way at the University. It was a very successful meeting for everyone concerned, and was highlighted by a presentation by Dr. Susan Brown, Horticultural Sciences, on Thursday evening reviewing the apple breeding program of Cornell. This presentation followed a dinner held for the members of the board and the participating scientists and administrators at the Scandling Center on the campus of Hobart and William Smith Colleges.

HORTICULTURE SHOW FOR 1992 NOW HISTORY



Another Horticulture Show has been completed. This year's event, held at the Rochester Convention Center, drew growers, processors, researchers, and other interested people from throughout New York State and many other parts of the Northeastern United States. Due in part to inclement weather, attendance was lower than hoped during this more than two-day meeting. Many excellent presentations were made by various individuals. Several members of the faculty from Ithaca and Geneva were among those making presentations. Featured at the show by Cornell university scientists were posters prepared on apple research and extension programs as well as posters prepared relative to the wine and grape research and extension programs. The Experiment Station, as a whole, had an exhibit that featured (above) three new introductions made during the latter part of 1991: the *Seneca* strawberry, *Royalton* sweet cherry, and the Geneva Rootstock 65. Also exhibiting at the show was the New York State Fruit Testing Cooperative Association, Inc.
