Ask Aunt Jordie...

Dear Aunt Jordie: *Regarding employee safety and the condition of sidewalks in many places at the Station. Whose responsibility is it to maintain the sidewalks - the building janitor or Field Research Unit? There seems no clear definition. Case in point was the condition of the sidewalks at Food Science Building last week. Only a small portion in front of the door was cleared. The sidewalk to the front was snow and ice covered and the sidewalk to the side driveway was the same. People coming and going to meetings, etc. had to walk on this ice. When an inquiry was made, it was stated that the custodian refused to clear the sidewalks beyond the immediate building entrance, saying it was not their responsibility.*

Dear Tired: An employee may go directly to the building custodian for general building custodial assistance. The custodian's responsibility is to keep building entrances clear with "hand tools" and de-icing products. When the snow is deep enough to mandate machinery then the Field Research Unit acts. An employee may always approach the Department Chairman/Unit Leader when he/she is questioning general custodial maintenance. The Department Chairman/Unit Leader will contact the appropriate unit. This concern has been discussed with Dave Lasher and Ray Mallaber.
