

## BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Sarah Day-O'Connell was born and raised in Boulder, Colorado. She completed the B.Mus. in 1995, with majors in Piano Performance and Music History, at the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music, where she was elected to Phi Kappa Lambda. She received the M.A. in Musicology from Cornell University in 1998. Her graduate studies were supported by Sage Graduate Fellowships in 1995-96 and 1999-2000, the Buttrick-Crippen Fellowship in 2000-01, and the Women's Studies Dissertation Fellowship in 2002. She also held teaching assistantships in Piano Performance, Music Theory, Music History, First-Year Writing Seminars, and Women's Studies.

In July 1999 she married fellow musicologist Jeremy Day-O'Connell. Their son Micah Immanuel Day-O'Connell was born in February 2003.

In 2002-04 Sarah Day-O'Connell held a Lilly Fellowship in Humanities and the Arts and taught in Christ College, the interdisciplinary honors college of Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, Indiana. She has been appointed Assistant Professor of Music at Knox College in Galesburg, Illinois, to begin, after a year's sabbatical as Visiting Scholar at the University of Chicago, in the fall of 2005.
