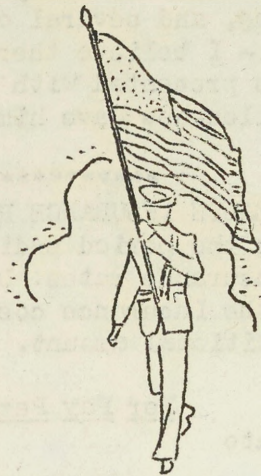

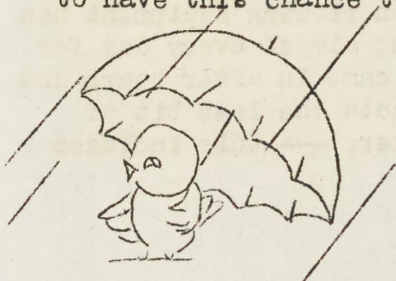

SPEAKS TO COUNTY AGENTS

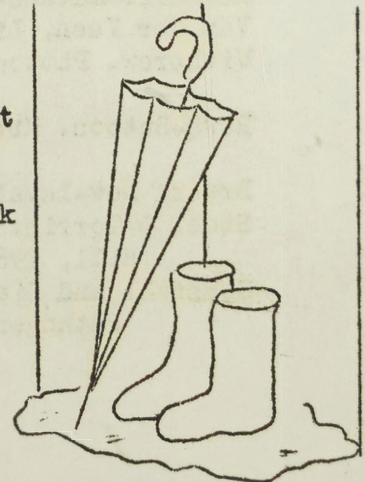
