Lucey Named First E.V. Baker Professor



Robert F. Lucey, former chairperson of the department of agronomy, has been named the university's first E.V. Baker Professor of Agriculture. Through years of research and extension efforts, Lucey has been instrumental in helping northern New York farmers increase their agricultural productivity.

The professorship, established by Cornell's Board of Trustees, honors E. Vreeland Baker. Baker of Houston, Texas, a 1923 graduate of Cornell who died in December 1985, left the bulk of his estate to the university.

For a quarter of a century at Cornell, Lucey has focused his research on the integration of crop and soil management into efficient dairy farm operations in Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence counties. The Northern New York Agricultural Development Program, which Lucey helped establish, deals with adaptability and culture of field and horticultural crops, soil and water management, dairy and livestock management, and climate studies.

Lucey has directed the program since its inception in 1961. Also cooperating in the North Country effort are the SUNY Agricultural and Technical College at Canton and the William H. Miner Agricultural Research Institute at Chazy.

MacMillen Retires



Glenn O. MacMillen '54, director of development for the college for the past eight years, retired December 31, 1986.

Dean David L. Call '54 commended Glenn for the significant growth in gifts to the college during his time of leadership, rising from some \$2 million to over \$10 million the past eight years. In the early years MacMillen also served as director of alumni affairs. During his tenure membership in the college alumni association reached 3,700, a figure not surpassed until last year.

In July 1986, Glenn was awarded the Distinguished Service Award from the National Agricultural Alumni and Development Association.

In honor of Glenn's dedicated and strong leadership, Jean Rowley '54, chairman of the college's development committee, praised him as an ideal and committed person. The development committee presented him with a \$1,000 gift certificate to a sports equipment company.

New York State Rural Safety

"If you want to get a feel for the magnitude of the agricultural accident problem, go to a farm meeting and ask for a show of hands on anything," suggests John Pollock '62. "Now look at the number of missing fingers. You'll see we've had a problem for a long time."

Commercial agriculture, said Pollock, a safety specialist in the department of agricultural engineering, is the most hazardous occupation in the United States. Along with mining it has the highest fatality rate—four to five times the national average according to National Safety Council statistics. In New York State alone, 23 agricultural workers died last year, 45 the year before.

Other industries have made major improvements in their safety records, but not agriculture. Little industry-wide effort and even less money continue to make the farm a dangerous place to work. In contrast to mining, where \$200 of government funding is spent per worker per year on safety, only \$50 per worker supports safety on the farm. What's more, there's little professional help available to those who want it. Only 36 states have college specialists in agricultural safety, many working part-time.

That's where Pollock and the New York State Rural Safety Council come in.



Formed in 1955 by volunteers and organizational representatives from the Farm Bureau, the State Education and Labor Departments, the Grange, and Agway and other interested companies, the council's mission is to gather information on agricultural hazards and address them through educational programs at the

Dean's Corner:



The College Onward and Upward

It is mid-February as I write, the temperature hovers around zero, snow covers the ground, and the snowdog has resumed his deep sleep after being rudely interrupted for a weather prediction. But even in February there is no gloom in Roberts Hall. The College of Agriculture and Life Sciences is strong, vibrant, and exciting.

How does a dean judge the health of an academic institution? As in any business or public endeavor, there are standards of performance that we constantly monitor. Let me run through the most important ones and see if you agree with my optimism.

The students

The college has some 3,100 undergraduate and 1,000 graduate students. The quantity has been constant, according to plan, but the quality continues to inch ever upward. Nationally, colleges of agriculture have experienced a steady decline in student numbers since the mid-1970s—down 35 percent in total, with some losing as many as 50 percent. We seem to be immune to this trend. In fact, the number of students seeking admission continues to rise. We are fortunate in being able to select students who can benefit most from our broad curriculum.

One major reason for this is that we have gradually broadened our curriculum to reflect our name change 20 years ago. Yes, we still train farmers, but we also train managers, communicators, plant and animal scientists, future doctors and veterinarians, environmental managers and scientists, and other professionals too numerous to mention. The list of firms and agencies that recruit our students grows rapidly as they learn of the quality of our curriculum and the commitment of our graduates.

We constantly review our offerings and encourage faculty to innovate and upgrade their courses. The president and provost have initiated a major study of the undergraduate experience and we are willing participants. Later this year we will offer an innovative five-day workshop on the science and art of college teaching and learning. We will invite 25 of our newer faculty to share this experience, which we plan to offer annually.

This workshop is funded by alumni gifts to the college. This same generosity has allowed us to move ahead with the use of microcomputers throughout the curriculum.

The faculty

The college has 450 faculty to meet its teaching, research, and extension needs. In the last three to four years, we have hired more than 100 new faculty. This replacement rate, well above what would be expected, reflects the growth in faculty numbers after World War II and a special retirement incentive offered by New York State several years ago.

For each new faculty member hired, 40 to 50 resumes were reviewed and three or four candidates were interviewed. The dean and directors met with every candidate, so we saw almost 400 young potential academicians as part of this staffing process. Believe me, they were an impressive group—bright, well trained, highly motivated, and all of them very interested in what Cornell and the college had to offer. In most cases, it was difficult for the department to narrow the choice to only one, but over 90 percent of those who were our first choice accepted a position in the college.

Our faculty are recognized in many ways—leadership in their professional associations, competitive prizes, and awards from a multitude of sources. One measure of productivity and quality is the ability to compete for outside funds. Our faculty has one of the best records in the nation. With the older faculty doing very well and the younger group showing great promise, the future looks bright.

Alumni and friends

The college's alumni association, with over 4,000 dues-paying members, is the largest in the university. With a new regional organization and strong, effective leadership, our alumni are poised to lend support wherever needed. A pilot program in several areas of New York is linking alumni to local high schools to better present the message on opportunities at the college. This is an attempt to increase our penetration into the more rural upstate school districts.

Working closely with other programs in the university, alumni are providing job opportunities through the Cornell Connection, internships and summer jobs jointly with the Cornell Tradition program, and excellent participation in our

annual Career Fair, where hundreds of students meet and talk with alumni. These relationships demonstrate that fund raising is not the only reason we are interested in our alumni!

Financial support for the college from alumni and friends has been generous and very helpful. Elsewhere in this issue, you can read of E.V. Baker's magnificent gift, the largest ever received by the college. Mr. Baker's love for agriculture will be multiplied many times by these gifts. But the smaller gifts are equally important, as demonstrated by the outpouring of support for the Stan Warren Fund by many of his former students.

Alumni gifts also have supported a re-birth of the public speaking program (now called forensics, and serving the whole university), started a new program in entrepreneurship and private enterprise, supported a multitude of student efforts, enabled young faculty to study abroad, and contributed in many other ways. From all of us, many thanks.

Agriculture and rural communities

What makes the Land-Grant University and this college different is that we are obligated to serve the people of the state through the extension of our research-based knowledge. As the former Director of Cooperative Extension, I am particularly concerned with this aspect of our mission.

The financial problems facing our nation's agriculture have been well publicized by the television camera, the movies, and all forms of the popular press. Not only is the college aware of the problems faced by New York farmers and the impact on our rural communities, but we also have the responsibility to help relieve the situation.

You can be proud of our faculty and extension field staff, for they have responded and they have made a difference. With rapidly changing federal policies, we have been called upon to explain to 15,000 dairy farmers a dairy diversion program and then a whole herd buy-out program. In both cases, the system responded with widely acclaimed programs.

In response to farm family financial stress, the Director of Extension commissioned a group to examine the problem and make recommendations. An action program called New York FarmNet followed quickly. Using an 800 number and a network of existing county extension offices, we went on line in March 1986. In less than a year, FarmNet has handled over 1,200 calls, responding to a wide variety of needs in less than 48 hours. Financial counselors were trained to work with farm families who couldn't be served by existing county extension personnel. All feedback indicates that we have dealt with many of the worst cases in a positive manner. Unfortunately, we foresee no quick turnaround in the economic situation and

we will continue to help wherever and whomever possible.

Trying to maintain an intensive agriculture in an urban state continues to challenge all of us. Our expanded Integrated Pest Management Program is helping with one of the points of contention. This program, through its research and extension components, helps farmers use fewer chemical pesticides, optimize the use of biological controls while producing the quality products you demand.

We are also very concerned about preventing groundwater contamination from pesticides, fertilizers, and other substances. Space doesn't allow even a listing of all the other extension programs that keep New York agriculture competitive, our rural communities nice places to live, our consumers educated about nutrition and food safety, and a host of other efforts. Suffice to say they are well done.

Facilities

Great students and excellent faculty need modern facilities. Our college is officially 84 years old and some of our facilities are severely outdated. Here again, we are making progress. Stone Hall is gone, and by the time you read this, Academic I will be under construction and the Food Science Laboratory will be well along to completion. The new Biotechnology Center will house faculty currently in Bradfield and Wing Halls, and the freed up space will allow us, for the first time, to ease the strain in the Plant Science Building.

It appears that the state will support our request for \$20 million for a major renovation and expansion of Mann Library. Not only is Mann outdated and overcrowded, but the library's dynamic staff is in the middle of a revolution in technology and developments leading to the new age of information management.

As we move ahead with these new buildings and major renovations, we have many offices and laboratories in other buildings needing attention. For the past three or four years practically all of our available funding went toward the renovations and new equipment for the 100 new faculty mentioned earlier. With faculty turnover slowing, we should be able to move ahead with classroom and laboratory renovations.

Often when meeting with a group of alumni, I hear the familiar lament, "The campus is just not the same, it was different when I was there." If one examines the history of Cornell, it is safe to say that it was always that way. Cornell is a great university. To perform the role expected of it, change is the constant. New science, new students, new faculty, new demands from society, all combine to foster a dynamic institution that requires new facilities, new curriculum, and new programs. The College of Agriculture and Life Sciences accepts that challenge with enthusiasm and optimism! ■

Larry Walker: Biochemical Engineer

"Larry Walker, I have the perfect job for you."

A young engineer with the Tennessee Valley Authority, Walker was looking for a chance to do research in process dynamics, particularly biomass conversion. Norman Scott, director of research and then chair of the agricultural engineering department, gave him the chance with the perfect job offer.

"Scott's approach was personal and positive. It said: 'You have talents that we can use. There's a place for you here,'" said Walker.

Looking back, he remembers others who had done much the same. Because of them a Black kid from inner-city Detroit who wanted to be a baseball player became instead a scientist searching for new uses of agriculture products.

"My mother planted the seeds, and bought the first chemistry set, when I was about nine." His science teachers, spotting a budding interest, spurred him on. In junior high he was intrigued by hydroponics. Later it was electronics, physics, and science fiction. As a high-school senior Walker won a Bausch and Lomb science award for a bioinstrumentation project with bumblebees.

It might have been his last award were it not for a persistent guidance counselor. "I applied to Michigan State just to get her off my back, I never really expected to go." But when the acceptance came enough money was found for two quarters, grants and student loans eventually paid for the rest. Few Blacks made it to college in 1969, let alone to predominantly white institutions, but Walker had promise and the faculty gave him additional courage.

"Going to Michigan State from Detroit was like being in an orchard with a variety of fruits to partake of." The first two years he was interested in solid state electronics. He worked with some solid-state physicists in a summer honors program at the Ames Laboratory at Iowa State, then switched into Michigan State's physics program.

At the same time he was reading widely in history and the social sciences. It soon seemed that, for him, physics was too narrow a perspective of the world. This conviction was reinforced two summers later in another honors program, this time at the Argonne National Laboratory outside of Chicago.

After helping develop a solid-state device for monitoring temperatures in the Great Lakes, Walker decided there was a lot more to be done with physics than just physics. He was ripe for the pitch that landed him in agricultural engineering. It came from a professor and an undergraduate friend who enticed him by promising all kinds of fascinating problems to work on. They argued that with his interest in mathematical modeling and his background in physics, the research possibilities in evaluating and analyzing biological systems would be practically boundless.

And so it proved to be, for to this day Walker bemoans the fact that there are half a dozen different projects he'd like to be working on right now.

He was on his first job, conducting energy studies on the production processes and application procedures for fertilizers, when Norm Scott and the agricultural engineering faculty invited him to Cornell. For the next seven years much of his time was spent directing a project on developing an energy integrated dairy system. The goal was to combine a variety of energy conservation practices and biomass conversion processes to make a farm energy-efficient. It was his first big project and one that allowed him to work with farmers Ron Space '53 and Ron Space, Jr. '81, as well as with specialists from agronomy, animal science, communications, and chemical engineering.

While satisfying his interest in analyzing how complex engineering systems operate in the real world, Walker yearned to do more fundamental research. Winning a National Research Council postdoctoral fellowship for minorities opened the way. This Ford Foundation award supported a year at Purdue University in 1986 learning more about biochemical engineering.

"Part of our problem in agriculture is that we are very good at producing biomass. Given the tremendous surplus of corn, soybeans and other commodities currently grown, how can we convert these into the things we need, pharmaceuticals, fibers, and energy, to name a few? Or should we be looking at other plants that can produce the necessary biochemicals more efficiently?" Part of the answer to this complex problem can be found in the fundamental research in biochemical engineering that Walker is doing now.

In collaboration with biochemist David Wilson, he has submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation to study how a group of enzymes, called cellulases, interact as they break down cellulose into sugar. "Traditionally, agricultural engineers do not work with enzymes, but today's agricultural problems are not going to be solved by individual specialists. What is needed is a partnership that combines the talents of people in many disciplines."

It's an innovative approach that serves Walker well. As Norm Scott predicted, he is the right man for the job. ■

Research Briefs

Animal scientist **R. Dean Boyd** has made research advances that can have a major impact on swine production. Using daily injections of somatotropin, the growth hormone, young pigs grow faster and more efficiently with dramatically leaner meat. Boyd, associate professor of animal science, said that 100-pound pigs treated with somatotropin grow 15 to 18 percent faster than untreated pigs, reaching market weight seven to 10 days quicker. Muscle fat was reduced by as much as 44 percent, and total fat was reduced by 55 percent. "In one step," Boyd said, "somatotropin brings about a major genetic improvement in swine and could provide the health-conscious consumer with a markedly leaner product."

In a related study, animal scientist **Donald H. Beermann**, produced dramatically leaner meat in lambs with an experimental chemical called cimaterol. Adding the chemical to the diets of young, growing lambs, Beermann found that total muscle in carcasses increased 20 to 30 percent while the amount of fat decreased by 30 to 66 percent. "Even the fat within the muscle decreased by about 50 percent," he said. Size and health of the ani-

mals was unaffected. "What's apparently happening is that more nutrients than are normally used for fat formation in the body go to muscle development," Beermann theorized. "It may work like bovine growth hormone, which mobilizes more nutrients for milk synthesis in cows."

In "The Economics of the Supermarket Delicatessen," Cornell economists recommend that supermarkets improve food preparation, distribution, packaging, product offerings, advertising, and the composition of their work force. After interviewing more than 100 food chain executives and 500 supermarket consumers, they found that more than half the nation's 30,500 supermarkets have added delicatessens because consumers prefer convenient, fresh, healthy foods and are interested in foreign foods. The study was done by **Edward W. McLaughlin**, **Gene A. German**, and **Michael P. Uetz**, all of the department of agricultural economics.

Elba, a new potato variety, has been developed by Cornell plant pathologists and plant breeders to resist early blight, late blight, Verticillium wilt, and the golden nematode, a soil-dwelling potato pest that

is thus far confined to New York State. The Cornell breeding team included **H. David Thurston**, **William E. Fry**, and **Bill B. Brodie**, all plant pathologists, and **Robert L. Plaisted**, a plant breeder. It took 18 years for the team to produce the Elba variety, including 10 years of trials in upstate muck-land.

Scores of lawsuits by farmers have been filed against utilities and milking equipment manufacturers over stray voltage that produces mild electrical shocks to cows. The farmers claim milk production is down, and Cornell animal scientist **Ronald C. Gorewit** heads a \$360,000 study to determine if the claims are true. "Stray voltage, which often occurs because of faulty wiring systems, among other causes, exists on almost all dairy farms," Gorewit said, "but whether it has a detrimental effect on cows is yet to be determined scientifically." Working with him on the study, which is funded by a number of utilities, are Cornell agricultural engineers **Norman R. Scott**, **David C. Ludington**, **Roger Pellerin**, and **Daniel J. Aneshansley**. The study will involve voltage levels ranging from one-half volt to 16 volts. ■

community level. Pollock, as the college's representative, is the resident expert whose task is to reduce the number of accidents and severity of injuries to agricultural workers. He also manages the council's budget and acts as secretary.

"Every time I do a program I'm asked to do another," said Pollock with a hint of surprise in his voice. Trained as an engineer who did research in fruit and vegetable mechanization, Pollock became a safety specialist only five years ago. A key to the success of his programs is that he looks at a farmer's job realistically—often that's not been done in the last 30 years.

"Traditionally a piece of equipment has been designed to do a task. Then afterward, in an effort to protect the people involved in running it, a list is made of things not to do. Safety people are then expected to get farmers to follow these rules. Many times that means changing their behavior. It just doesn't work."

By contrast, Pollock begins by understanding what farmers really do, then he analyzes the hazards involved and looks for ways to guard against them, if they can't be eliminated altogether.

Operating power equipment is but one problem. There are a host of others, including dusts and molds from the improper storage of grains and silage; improper storage and use of pesticides; toxic atmospheres due to manure decomposition; transportation of flammable materials; working at heights and on slippery surfaces; using new products, like nylon ropes, about which little is known; and handling animals.

To date the N.Y. Rural Safety Council's efforts have been low-profile and low-budget. A proposal is in the works to raise up to \$250,000 for each of the next three years. With these funds a partnership would be formed with the college to provide three additional staff people who would gather accident information and then develop the appropriate safety programs.

One area of emphasis will be on the youthful worker since there are indications that young people are at greater risk. (Farming is the only industry that allows children as young as eight to be in the workplace and part of the work force.) Another will be encouraging manufacturers to make engineering changes based on data the Council's staff collects.

Meanwhile John Pollock continues to meet with groups of farmers around the state. He's thrown away the safety cartoons (this approach doesn't even work with kids, he said), substituting emergency room trauma slides of actual farm injuries. This highly sought-after presentation again reflects Pollock's philosophy of starting with the real thing. Then he goes on with a description of how the accident happened and, most importantly, how it might have been prevented. It's a no-nonsense approach to safety education that seems to work. Farmers say they appreciate it. ■

Faculty News

The 35,000-member American Society of Microbiology has selected **Paul J. VanDemark**, professor of microbiology, as the 1987 recipient of the Carski Foundation Distinguished Teaching Award. VanDemark began teaching introductory microbiology at Cornell while a graduate student and was given full responsibility for the introductory course lectures in 1949. Except for sabbatical terms, he has taught introductory microbiology each year for 38 years. He also has been adviser to more than 500 undergraduates since 1954.

Wendell L. Roelofs, professor of insect biochemistry at the State Agricultural Experiment Station in Geneva, has been awarded a Superior Service Award from

the U.S. Department of Agriculture for his fundamental contributions to basic and applied biology of insect sex pheromones, their chemical composition and biosynthesis, insects' response, and their use in pest management for major agricultural crops. He was cited for his ability to lead teams of young scientists, to communicate scientific findings, and to work with industry in making new discoveries available to potential users. Roelofs has been at Cornell for twenty years. Among numerous honors, he has been awarded the Alexander Von Humboldt Award in 1977, the Wolf Prize in Agriculture in 1982, the National Medal of Science in 1985, and membership in the National Academy of Sciences in 1985. He has been Liberty Hyde Bailey Professor since 1978.

Daniel W. Drall, assistant professor of landscape architecture, has received the 1986 Award for Outstanding Educator from the Council of Educators in Landscape Architecture.

Barbara A. Knuth, assistant professor in natural resources, has been named a fellow in the leadership development program of the National Center for Food and Agricultural Policy, Washington, D.C. She is a specialist in natural resource policy and management.

William Hansel was selected to present the William Henry Hatch Memorial Lecture at the Annual Meeting of the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges by USDA, 1986. ■

Faculty Deaths

John Parker Hertel, 76, professor emeritus of personnel administration, died Nov. 18 in Ithaca. A native of Ralston, Pennsylvania, he received both his bachelor's and doctoral degrees from Cornell. During his career in the office of resident instruction, he influenced the lives of many students. Hundreds benefited from his thoughtful counsel, and he was instrumental in developing the overall advising program for the college. For many years he offered the introductory orientation course for entering students. Hertel's tenure with the college spanned the "horseless farm," which he wrote about in the *Cornell Countryman* in 1938, to the use of computers on the farm. In his three-and-a-half decades of service, he was secretary of the college, responsible for the records and registrar areas, secretary of the petitions committee, and oversaw advising, scholarships, and foreign exchange programs. He retired as emeritus professor in 1971. Several gifts to the college have been made in his honor by former students, friends, and faculty.

Louis Melville Massey, Jr., 63, a professor of food science at Cornell's Agricultural Experiment Station in Geneva, died Feb. 3 in Geneva. His principal field of research was the post-harvest physiology of fruits and vegetables. He conducted numerous experiments on the potential of

gamma radiation as a means of extending the shelf life of fruits and vegetables.

Massey began at Cornell in 1947 as a graduate assistant. He received his doctorate degree in biochemistry from Cornell in 1951, spent seven years with the U.S. Army Biological Laboratory at Fort Detrick, Md., and returned to the Geneva Station in 1958 as assistant professor of biochemistry. He was promoted to associate professor in 1963 and professor in 1970.

In 1968 he was awarded the Gourley Award in pomology from the American Society of Horticultural Science for his excellent research program. He was a member of that society and of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the American Chemical Society, the American Society of Plant Physiologists, and Sigma Xi.

André Gerard van Veen, first director of Cornell's international nutrition program, died Dec. 7 in Ithaca. A native of the Netherlands, he devoted his professional career to problems of nutrition in developing countries, first in Indonesia, where he spent many years, later with the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization.

He joined Cornell in 1962 to begin the international nutrition training program in the former Graduate School of Nutrition (now the Division of Nutritional Sci-

ences). He was the first to develop ways of applying social science research methods to the study of food and nutrition problems.

He retired from Cornell in 1968. In 1970 he received the Eykman Award for contributions to tropical medicine and health. In 1983 he was elected a fellow of the American Institute of Nutrition.

Dwight A. Webster, professor emeritus of natural resources, died Nov. 9 in Ithaca. An authority on salmon and trout, he was best known for research on the production and management of lake trout and brook trout in the Finger Lakes and Adirondack regions of New York.

He received a bachelor's degree in 1940 and a doctoral degree in 1943 in fisheries science at Cornell, where he then became an instructor. He became a professor in 1957 and chaired the department of natural resources from 1967 to 1971.

Memorial gifts from friends and colleagues who appreciate "Doc" Webster's influence on the quality of our natural environment have been made to the college Adirondack Fisheries Research Fund in his honor. ■

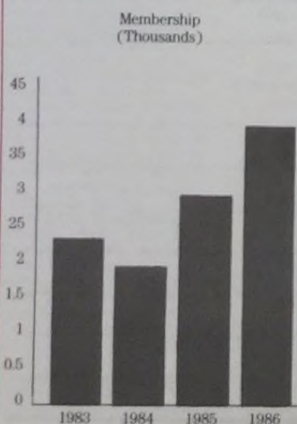

Army ROTC Appeals to More ALS Students



Arrmy ROTC is making a comeback. For nearly 100 years military science courses were compulsory for all Cornell men. The requirement, specified by the Morrill Act (land grant act), wasn't dropped until the early 1960s. In the ten years that followed, enrollment plummeted from 881 cadets to 75. This year 170 students are participating in the program, a quarter of them are women; 28 of the total are in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences.

"When we got back from Vietnam there were no ticker tape parades," recalls Lieutenant Colonel Clarence R. Buchwald '66, commander of the Army ROTC department at Cornell. "They were pretty bad times, but today's cadets who enter the service are going into a profession that's looked upon as an up-and-coming career, a respected way of life."

For today's students Vietnam isn't even a memory. "They aren't as idealistic about what their futures hold," said enrollment officer Captain Steve Barrows '76. "Students seem to understand the realities of the economic-political system, of what it takes to succeed in American society. ROTC is now seen as a viable option to help achieve career goals, whether in military or in civilian life."

"Training in management and leadership skills is a major selling point," Barrows said. "ROTC provides people skills. These round out a student's abilities as a manager and would otherwise take years to learn." It's for this reason, he said, that ROTC graduates are called back for successive job interviews when equally qualified peers are not. An active network among ROTC graduates doesn't hurt either.

Barrows also points to the financial advantages ROTC offers during undergraduate years. Sixty percent of those currently enrolled are on Army scholarships that pay full tuition, fees, and \$350 a year for books. All juniors, seniors, and scholarship students also receive a \$100 monthly living allowance.

With such benefits goes an eight-year commitment to the Army, but there's a good deal of flexibility in how that's served. In what Barrows describes as a "student market," cadets can request one of several options available after graduation: four years active duty plus four in the reserves, an educational delay for graduate school, a combination, or eight years reserve duty. With current budget cuts the Army's greatest need is for reserve officers.

"Ten years ago 95 percent of the people coming out of ROTC went on active duty whether they wanted to or not," Barrows said.

It wasn't an army life that attracted either Buchwald or Barrows. Buchwald joined ROTC for a student deferment, so he couldn't be drafted out of school. Barrows joined for the \$100 living allowance. But both stayed in, choosing field artillery as their branch specialty. Barrows served four of his ten years in Germany, three and a half in troop command. Buchwald served in Germany too and in Vietnam; before coming to Cornell he worked with the State Department as a consultant to the Korean Minister of National Defense.

The Department of the Army policy is to assign ROTC instructors to their alma maters. Since Buchwald and Barrows were born and raised in upstate New York they were pleased to return here for a three-year tour.

As senior commanding officer Buchwald supervises the 13 instructors in the department, advises seniors, and teaches one course. His interest in well-trained officers is close to home. "My 21-year-old son is a soldier, serving in Italy. I'll not commission anybody who I feel would not be capable of being my son's boss."

As enrollment officer, Barrows "spreads the good word about ROTC," shepherds students through their first year of the program and teaches two courses. "The further I progress in rank the more removed I'll become from the soldier on the ground," Barrows said. "Coming back is an opportunity to influence the leadership these soldiers will receive in the future."

Buchwald has started an Army ROTC alumni association. Those interested should write to him at the Army Reserve Officer's Training Corps Program in Barton Hall. ■

Plants Turn Wastewater into Fresh



The first large-scale demonstration of a sewage treatment system based on organic plants will open this summer at the new Ithaca municipal sewage treatment facility. It relies on plants grown in a modified hydroponic system known as the "nutrient film technique" to remove pollutants, turning wastewater into clean water.

"It's a real breakthrough in wastewater treatment," said William J. Jewell, professor of agricultural engineering. Capital investments are lower, as are operating costs, yet the plant-based system is as efficient as conventional treatment methods.

In the nutrient film technique, plants are grown in water-tight troughs similar to gutters. A thin film of wastewater flows through the plant roots, which act as a filter, picking up the pollutants. No soil is involved because sewage contains the major nutrients plants need to develop massive root systems. Since sunlight is required for growth, the inherent use of solar power makes the treatment process more energy-efficient.

The total system consists of three treatment sections, each requiring different types of plants. The first section, called "primary treatment," is designed to trap most of the suspended solids, followed by the second section—"nutrient conversion and recovery"—where remaining suspended solids and most of the pollutants are removed. The third section, called "water polishing," puts the finishing touches to the wastewater by removing most of the remaining pollutants.

Thus far, Jewell has experimented with many kinds of plants, such as wetland plants, ornamentals, grasses, and even food crops. Among the species tested are cattails, bristly sedge, woolgrass, soft rush, bulrush, reed canary grass, phragmites, napier grass, roses, chrysanthemums, carnations, petunias, geraniums, cucumbers, tomatoes, millet, and wheat.

Previously, Jewell said, the only plants usable in wastewater treatment were

trash plants, those of no commercial value. But this system has the potential of turning a sewage treatment facility into a nursery for the commercial production of ornamental plants. It could also produce energy, by growing plants that can be converted into ethanol, or natural gas. Use as a low-cost water supply treatment system for areas with groundwater contamination is another possible application, as is the production of drinking water from salt water. Since plants give off large amounts of moisture through transpiration, drinkable water could be condensed and collected in a greenhouse.

In addition to the economic benefits there are esthetic ones as well. "Admittedly this is difficult to quantify, yet an extremely positive part of the picture," Jewell said. "If you look at flowers in bloom with sewage flowing through them it's an entirely different impact than a concrete and steel sewage treatment plant."

Low-cost plastic greenhouses enable the system to operate efficiently in cold climates—perhaps even in space. NASA is using the nutrient film technique as the centerpiece of a total recycling system that will take nutrients and waste and convert them back into food to support a closed environment for people on 50 to 100 year flights through space.

Jewell's research team earlier developed the nutrient film technique in a greenhouse at sewage plants in Ithaca and Hanover, New Hampshire. The work was supported by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and the U.S. Department of the Interior. ■

Oltenacu New Associate Director of Instruction



Elizabeth Oltenacu, associate professor of animal science, has been appointed associate director of the college's office of instruction.

This office provides support services for undergraduate admissions and finan-

New Geneva Wheat Variety

Grain growers in New York state stand to gain \$2.5 million a year from a new wheat variety named Geneva. Released last fall by the Cornell Agricultural Experiment Station, it produces a 5 to 6 percent higher yield than all the leading varieties grown in New York State.

Geneva is a type of soft white winter wheat that is used for pastries—such as cookies, cakes, and crackers—and for breakfast foods. New York State is a major producer of light-colored wheat, with up to a quarter of a million acres in production.

In addition to higher yield Geneva has other characteristics that will give Empire State farmers a competitive edge against

the other major producers in Michigan and eastern Canada: outstanding test weight, excellent baking quality, and responsiveness to good growing management. Older varieties of wheat have ceilings on yield; with Geneva there is much farmers can do to increase productivity.

Work on this new variety began 25 years ago by Neal F. Jensen, then was picked up by Mark E. Sorrells, associate professor, when Jensen retired in 1978. Of the 14 varieties of wheat developed by Cornell plant breeders over the past several decades, it's the best yet. "Overall, Geneva is an outstanding variety," Sorrells said. "It is expected to become a major variety in New York within the next several years." ■

In the project's first two decades, acreage of corn silage tripled, acreage of corn for grain increased 15 times, and production of corn for grain skyrocketed 25 fold; the number of dairy cows per farm doubled, and milk production in the six-county region increased 25 percent, despite the abandonment of some farms.

Recently, a project on beef cattle marketing was added to the program. In just one year's time, the market value of beef cattle on the farms participating in the program increased by \$70 per head, a 28 percent jump from previous years.

Dean David L. Call, said, "The significant improvements in northern New York agriculture are the direct result of Bob Lucey's research and extension efforts, more than any other person. This latest recognition of his work not only is a tribute to him, but an honor for farmers and agribusiness in the state's North Country."

Lucey, who recently completed his second five-year term as head of the agronomy department, is a member of the American Society of Agronomy, the Crop Science Society of America, the Soil Science Society of America, the New York Academy of Science, the Soil Conservation Society of America, and several other professional societies, councils, and associations related to crops and soils. He has won numerous awards for his contributions to agronomic research and extension.

He earned a B.V.A. degree in agriculture in 1950 from the University of Massachusetts, an M.S. in crop science from the University of Maryland in 1954, and a Ph.D. in crop science from Michigan State University in 1959.

The Baker bequest also aids the college in the following ways:

- The E.V. Baker Research Fund in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, primarily for supporting activities at the Willsboro Farm.
- The E.V. Baker Student Aid Fund, with income from the \$1 million endowment to be used for financial aid to undergraduates in the college.
- The E.V. Baker Cornell Tradition Fund, with income from the \$1 million endowment to support Cornell Tradition Fellows in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. Cornell Tradition gives students the opportunity to work for, rather than borrow, money. The program includes a summer job network open to all undergraduates and fellowships for financially needy students.
- The E.V. Baker Dean's Fund in the college for special projects. ■

New Equine Unit Makes Debut



no longer will Professors Harold Hintz and Herbert Schryver have to perform their metabolic research on ponies and horses in the old swine barn, as they have for nearly 20 years. Due to the human need to drive more and more automobiles, the old swine barn will be torn down to permit a road to be built.

To carry out much needed research, a new equine metabolism unit has been built just off Judd Falls Road; it sports a bright red roof. Inside, not only do the ponies benefit from the spacious stalls, but there are two rooms set aside for laboratories, something not available in the old quarters. Additionally, there are four special metabolism stalls, so all experimental animal waste can be collected and analyzed. One problem Hintz and Schry-

ver are looking at is the problem of colic in horses. These animals are very prone to digestive upsets.

Said Schryver, "We're very grateful that the Ag School has provided us with this wonderful new building."

On February 26 the advisory council of the animal science department toured the new facility, and a formal open house was held March 3. The council, which meets once a year, comprises people who are concerned with research underway at Cornell on all species of animals. ■

Small Business Energy Program

Some 2,000 small businesses in dozens of New York City neighborhoods will get free, cost-cutting advice each year under a new program from Cornell Cooperative Extension.

The Small Business Energy Efficiency Program, piloted in Brooklyn, will field 15 technicians trained at Cornell who will maintain contact with Agricultural Engineering faculty members expert in energy conservation. The technicians will work with small businesses (and some non-profit organizations) in all five boroughs.

Pilot tests upstate, where energy is much less expensive, yielded small businesses an average savings of \$1,000 a year. Tests in Brooklyn indicate cash savings will substantially exceed \$1,000 a year and are likely to be in the range of 20 percent of total energy costs.

Extension's New York City District Director, Ruth Allen, said such cash savings tend to be reinvested in the business or the local community.

"Applying Cornell research to practical problems is what Extension has always been about. Here in the city, we have practical-education programs in nutrition, horticulture, 4-H youth development, and consumer education. We're delighted to add this new program for neighborhood businesses."

The program, formally announced February 20 by Mayor Koch and State Energy Commissioner William Cotter, is funded by the State Energy Office with money paid by Exxon for overcharges on price-controlled fuel. ■

Lucey Named First E.V. Baker Professor



Robert F. Lucey, former chairperson of the department of agronomy has been named the university's first E.V. Baker Professor of Agriculture. Through years of research and extension efforts, Lucey has been instrumental in helping northern New York farmers increase their agricultural productivity.

The professorship, established by Cornell's Board of Trustees, honors E. Vreeland Baker, Baker of Houston, Texas, a 1923 graduate of Cornell who died in December 1985, left the bulk of his estate to the university.

For a quarter of a century at Cornell, Lucey has focused his research on the integration of crop and soil management into efficient dairy farm operations in Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Jefferson, Lewis and St. Lawrence counties. The Northern New York Agricultural Development Program, which Lucey helped establish, deals with adaptability and culture of field and horticultural crops, soil and water management, dairy and livestock management, and climate studies.

Lucey has directed the program since its inception in 1961. Also cooperating in the North Country effort are the SUNY Agricultural and Technical College at Canton and the William H. Miner Agricultural Research Institute at Chazy.
