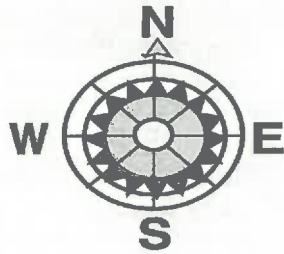

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# INTRODUCTION

## Greetings:

When Cornell opened its doors to the first class in 1868, five international\* students enrolled. Every year since then, international students have studied on the Ithaca campus. Remarkably, almost without exception, the enrollment has been on a growth curve since World War II.

For the academic year 1997-98, a record 2612 international students enrolled, representing 126 countries and constituting 13.83% of the total Ithaca campus student total. Two other milestones occurred, the largest ever number of freshman and transfer students enrolled (335, see page 11). Also, the overall total of international undergraduates topped 900; which is an increase from 395 undergraduates ten years ago.

Among our peers, Cornell has the highest percentage of international students enrolled at the graduate level (see page 29), while MIT has the highest overall percentage of international students (see page 28).

The table International Graduate Enrollment (see page 9) demonstrates the steep drop in international student enrollment at the graduate level. Some of this can be explained by the move of the L.L.M. students to the Law School professional program last year, but our record keeping shows a drop of over 100 graduate level students from Fall 1996 to Fall 1997.

The decline in the number of African students has continued since a recent high of 134 in 1991. This year we have only 89 students from Africa.

Nationally, Cornell ranked 13th in total international student enrollment for the academic year 1996-97, the latest year for which national figures are available (see page 19) and ranked 14th in terms of percentage of total enrollment for institutions enrolling 1000 or more international students.

The number of international scholars (foreign academic staff) in the academic year 1996-97 declined slightly to 1,155 from the previous year's record high of 1,205. In 1996-97, Cornell hosted the 9th largest number of foreign scholars nationwide (not counting the Medical School campus in New York City).

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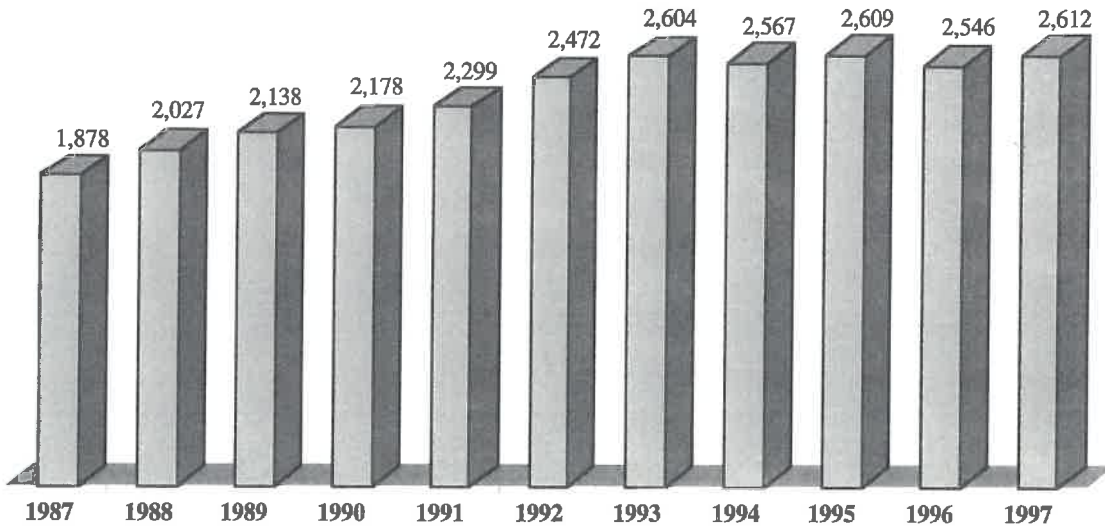
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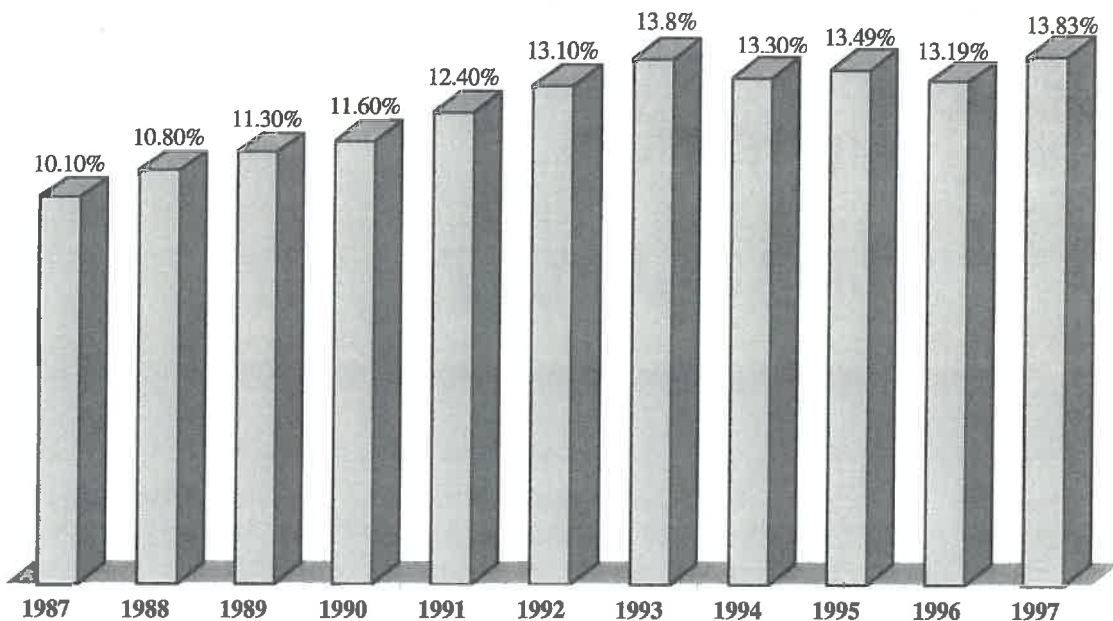

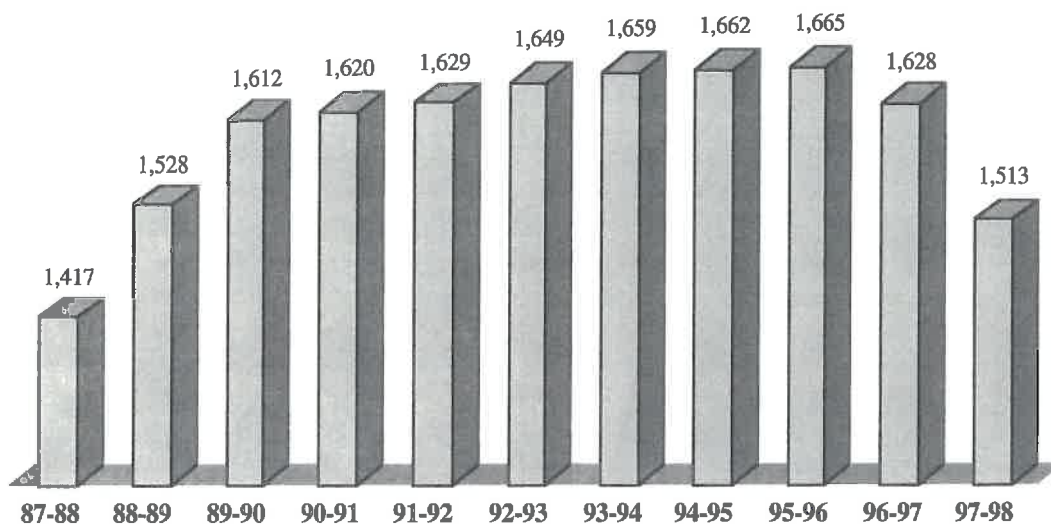

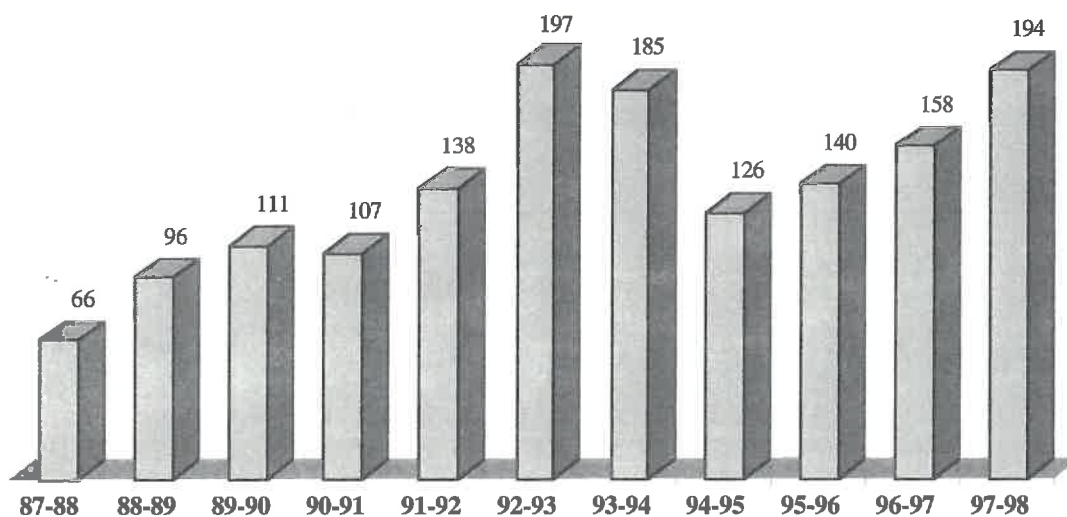

## INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE ENROLLMENT 1987-1997

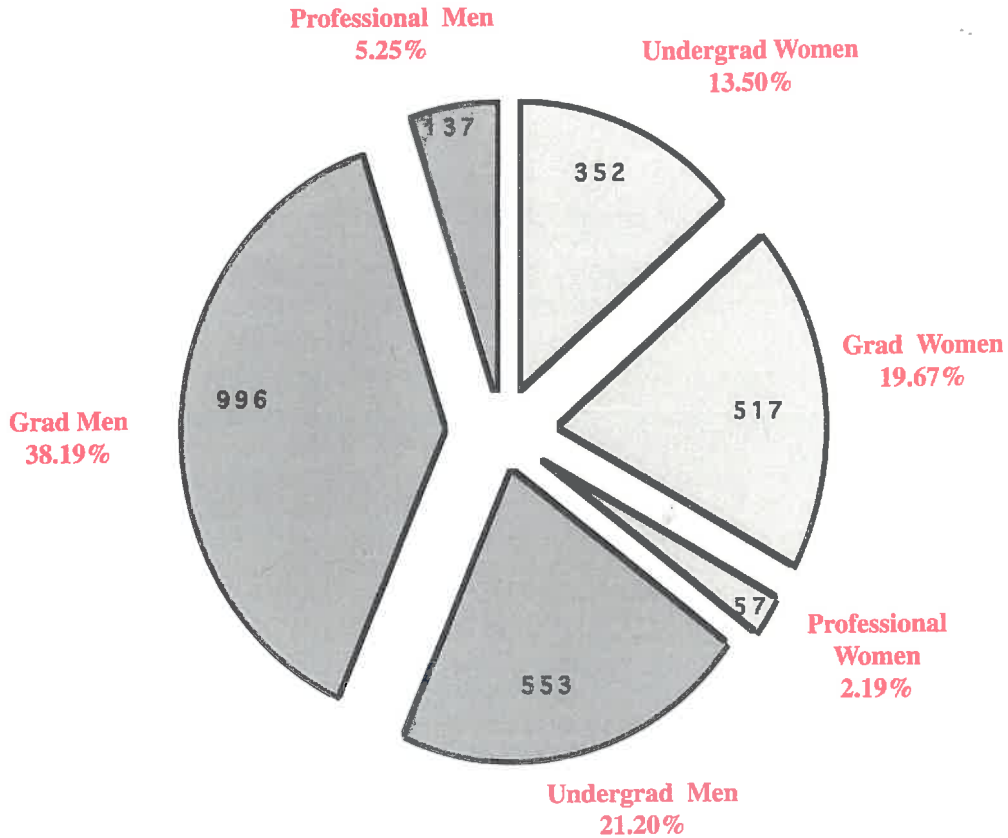


## INTERNATIONAL PROFESSIONAL ENROLLMENT 1987-1997

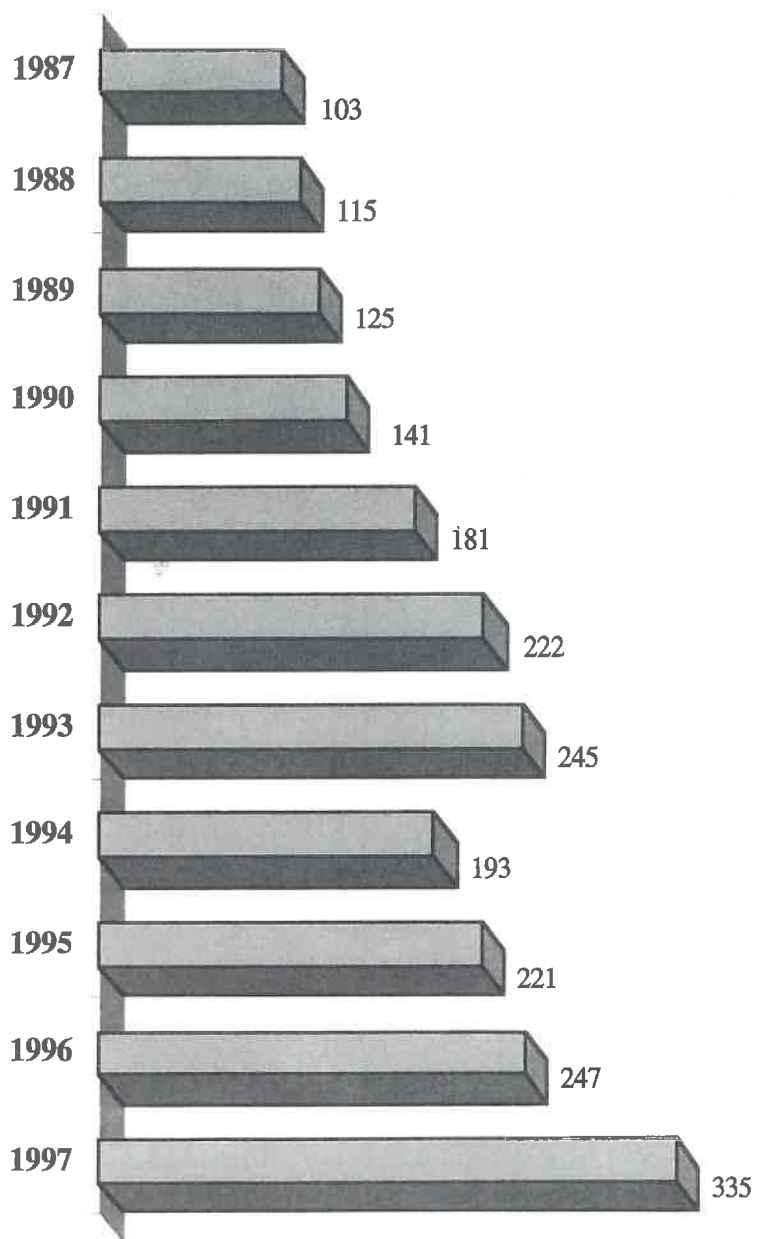
## 1997-1998 INTERNATIONAL WOMEN AND MEN AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL INTERNATIONAL ENROLLMENT



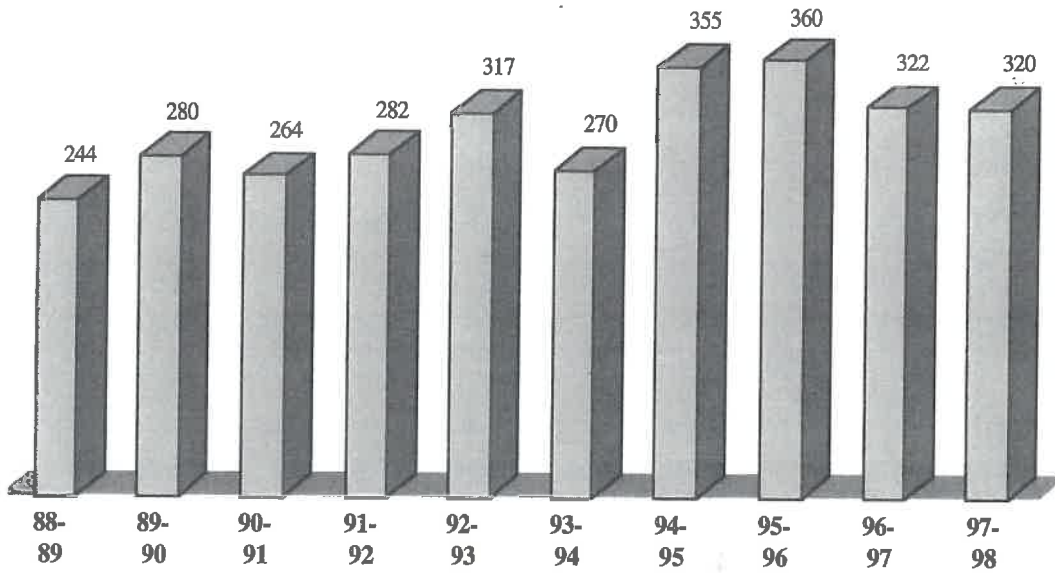

## INTERNATIONAL FRESHMEN & TRANSFERS 1987-1997




## INTENSIVE ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAM ENROLLMENT 1988-1997

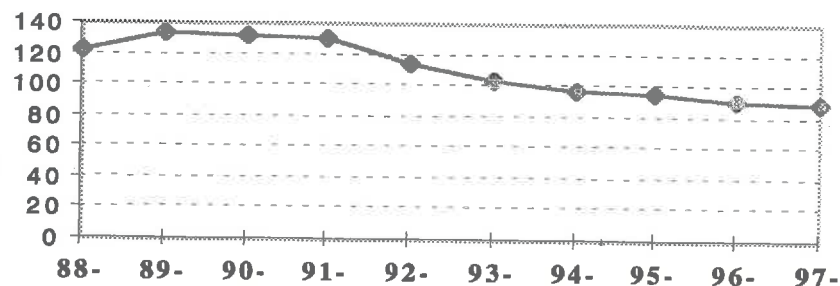

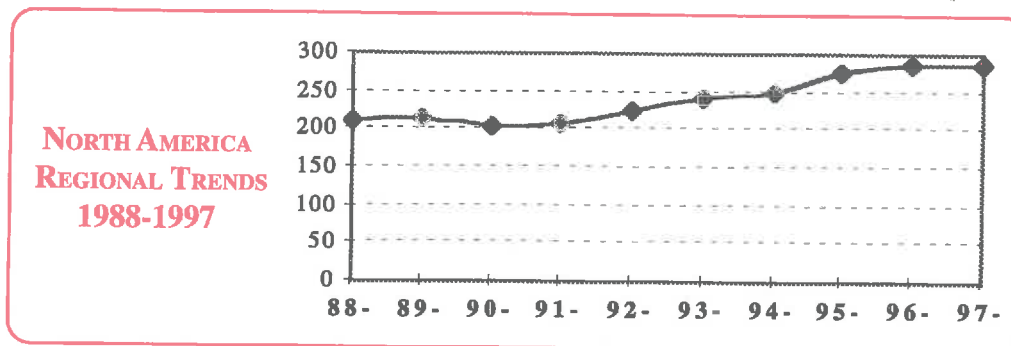

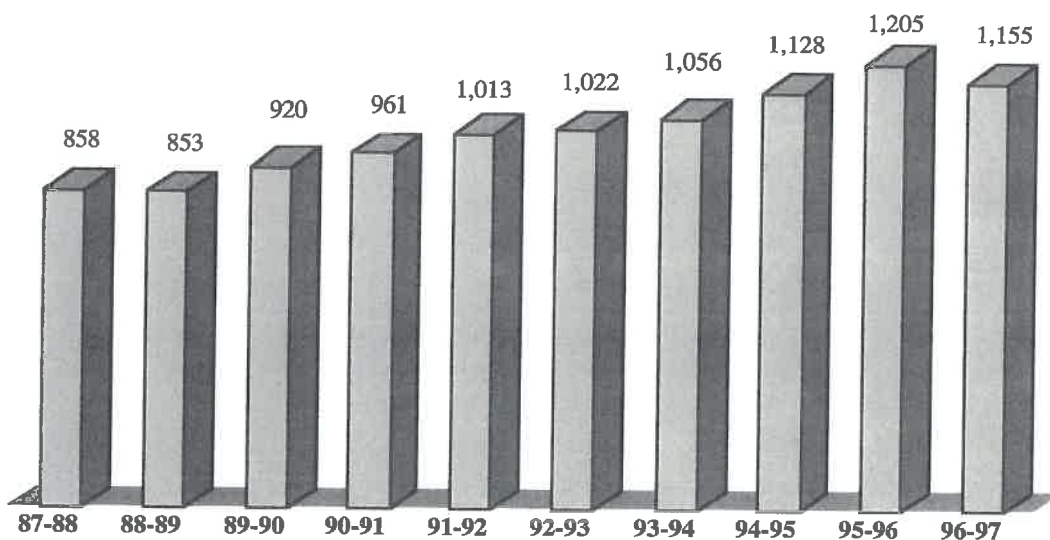

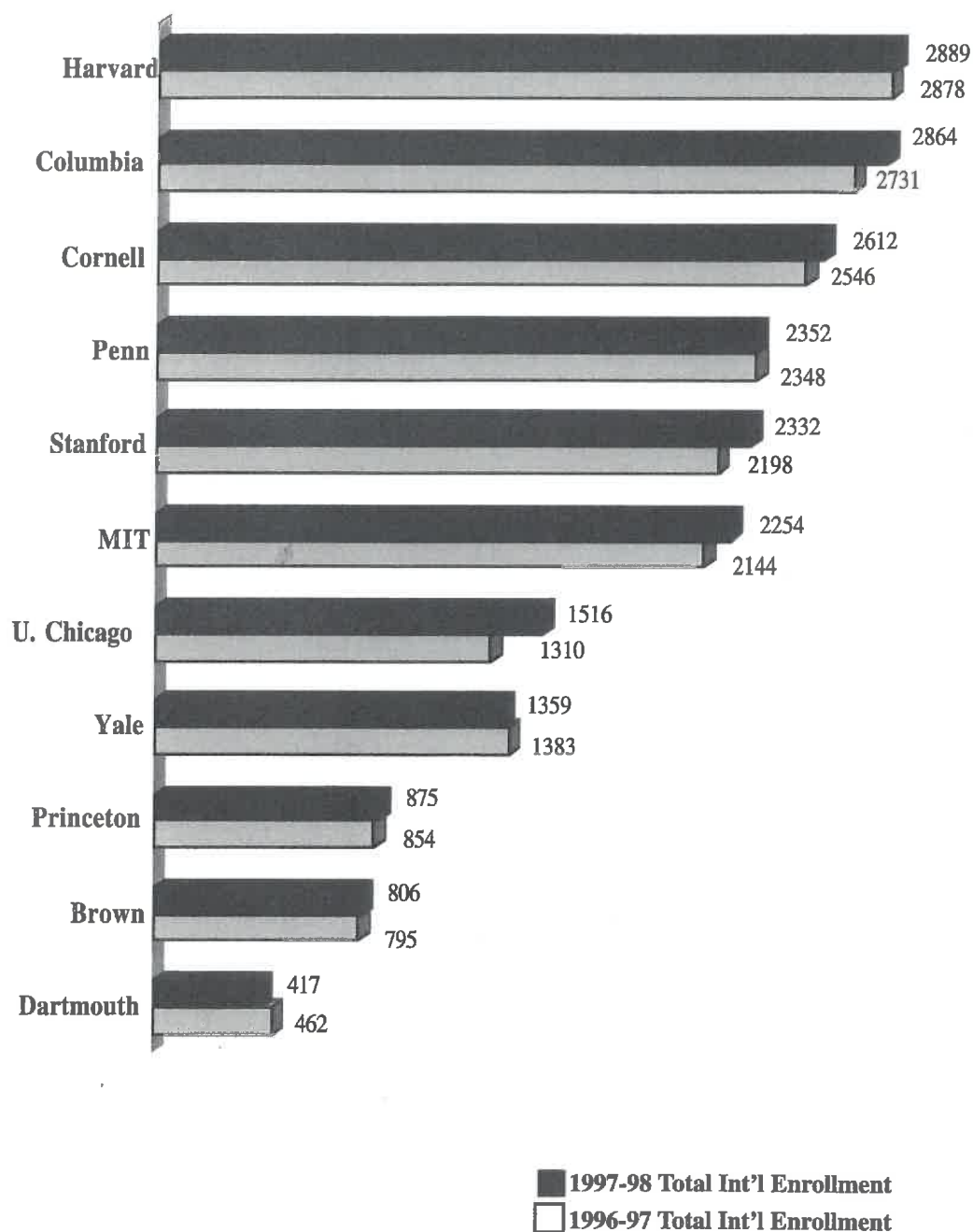

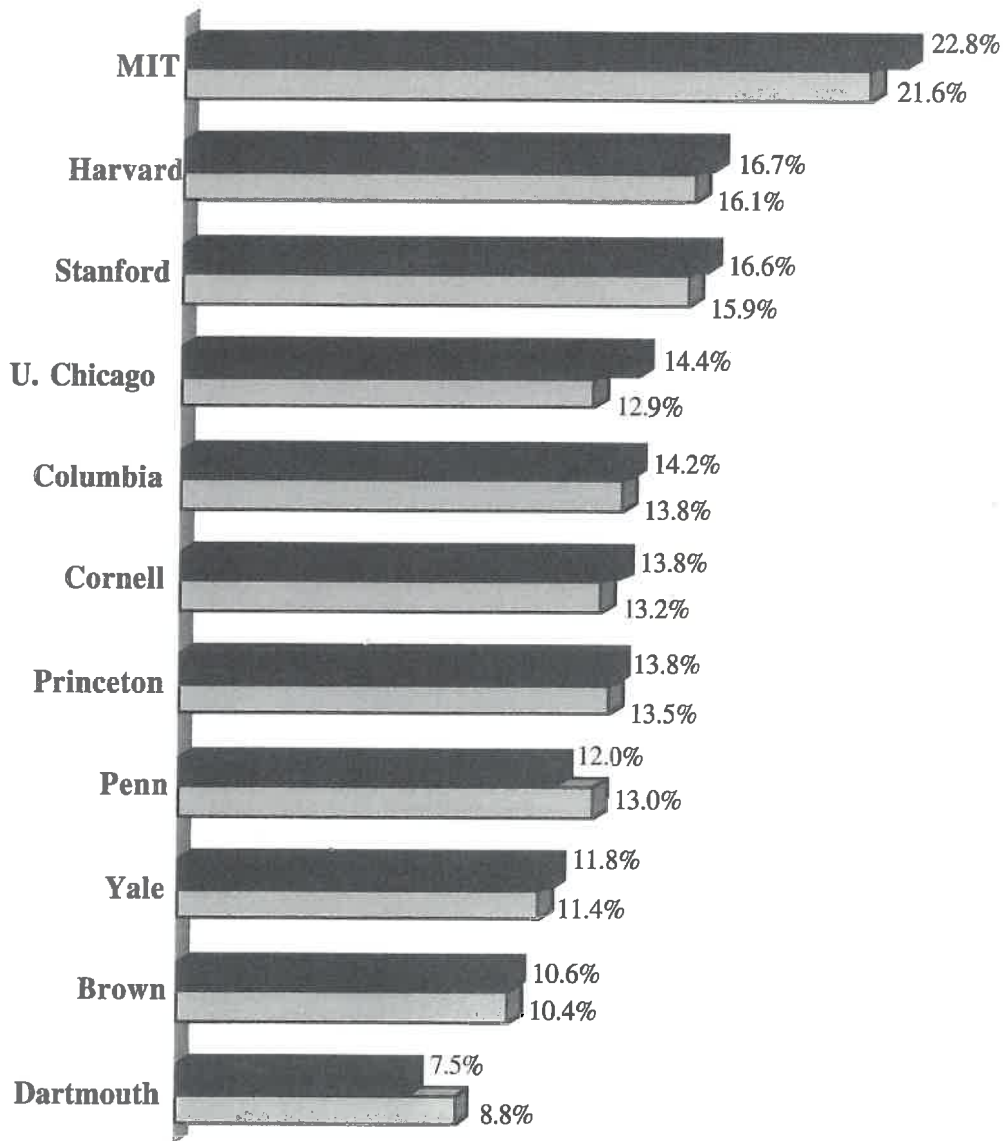

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT AT IVY LEAGUE AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS 1996-98

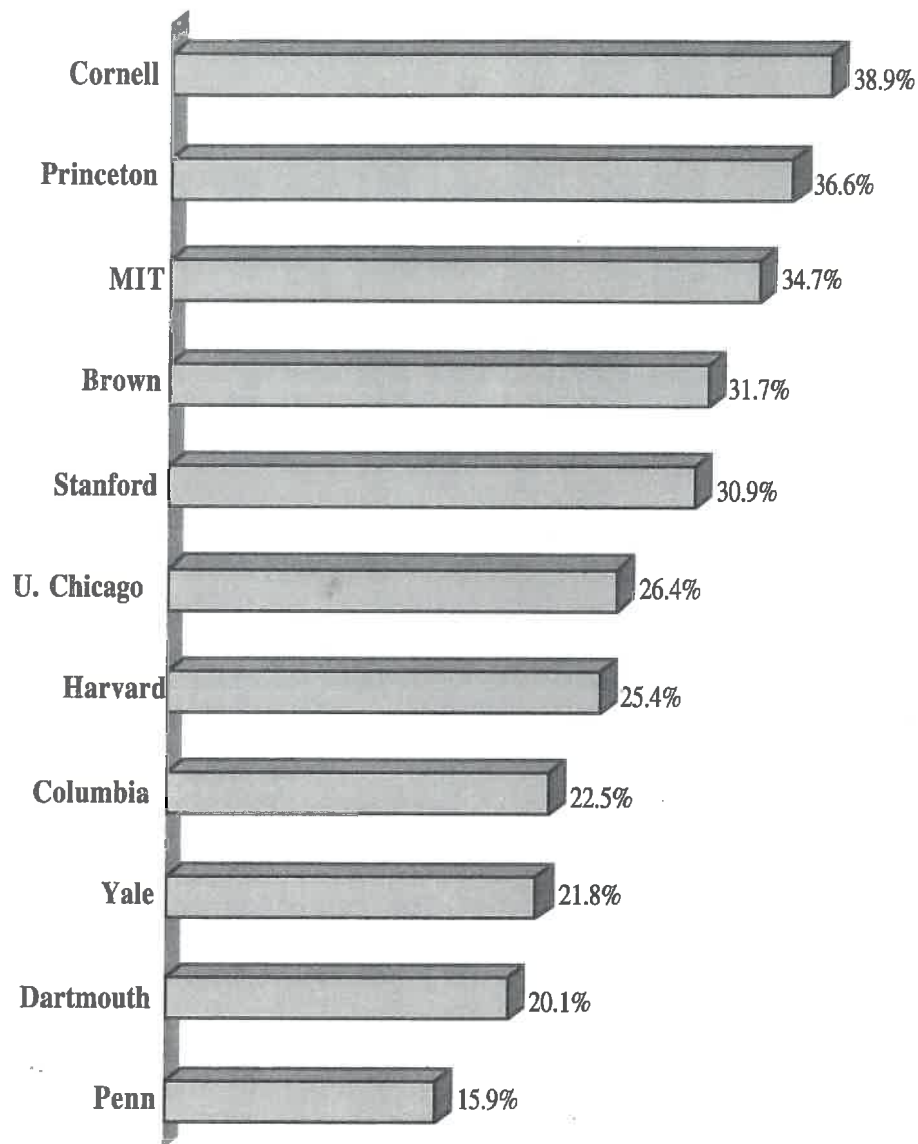


## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AS A PERCENT OF ALL STUDENTS 1996-1998

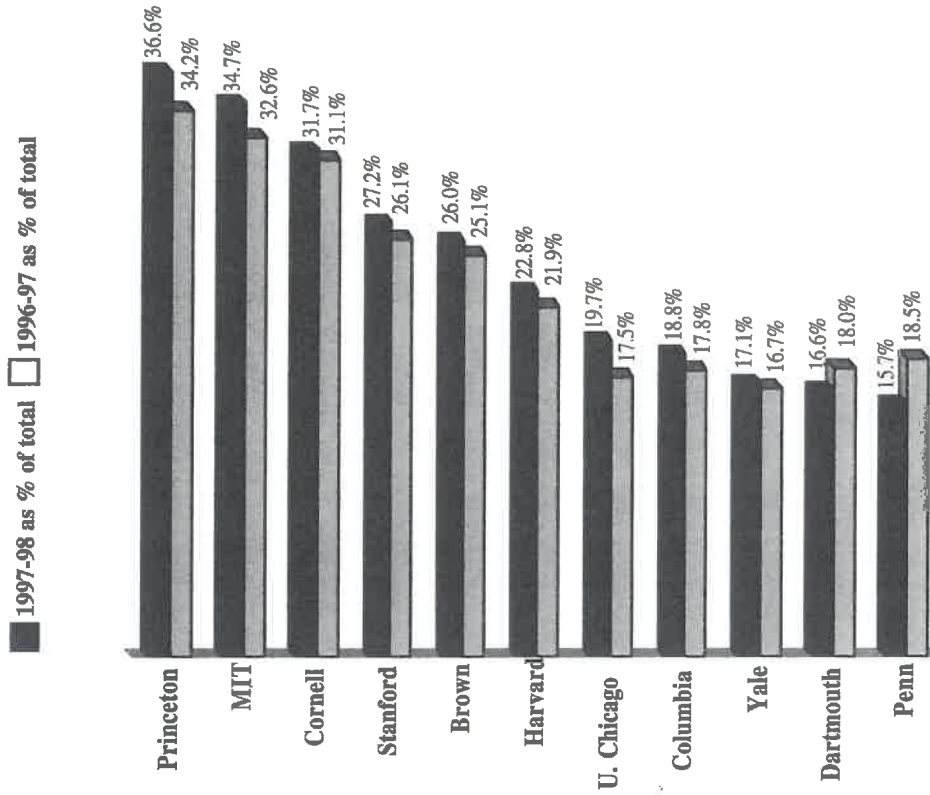

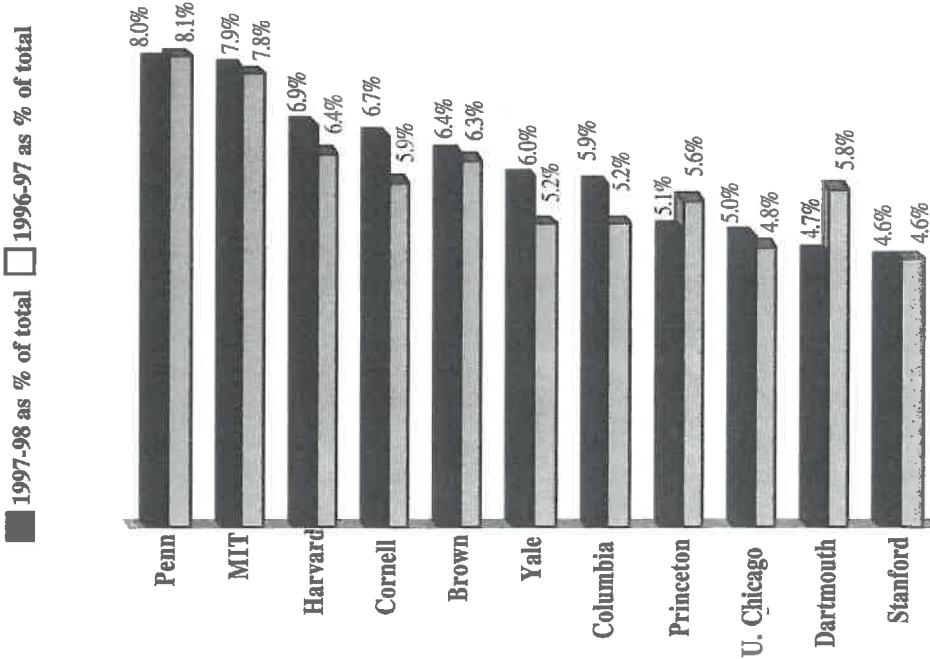
## INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE STUDENTS AS A PERCENT OF ALL GRADUATE STUDENTS 1997-1998

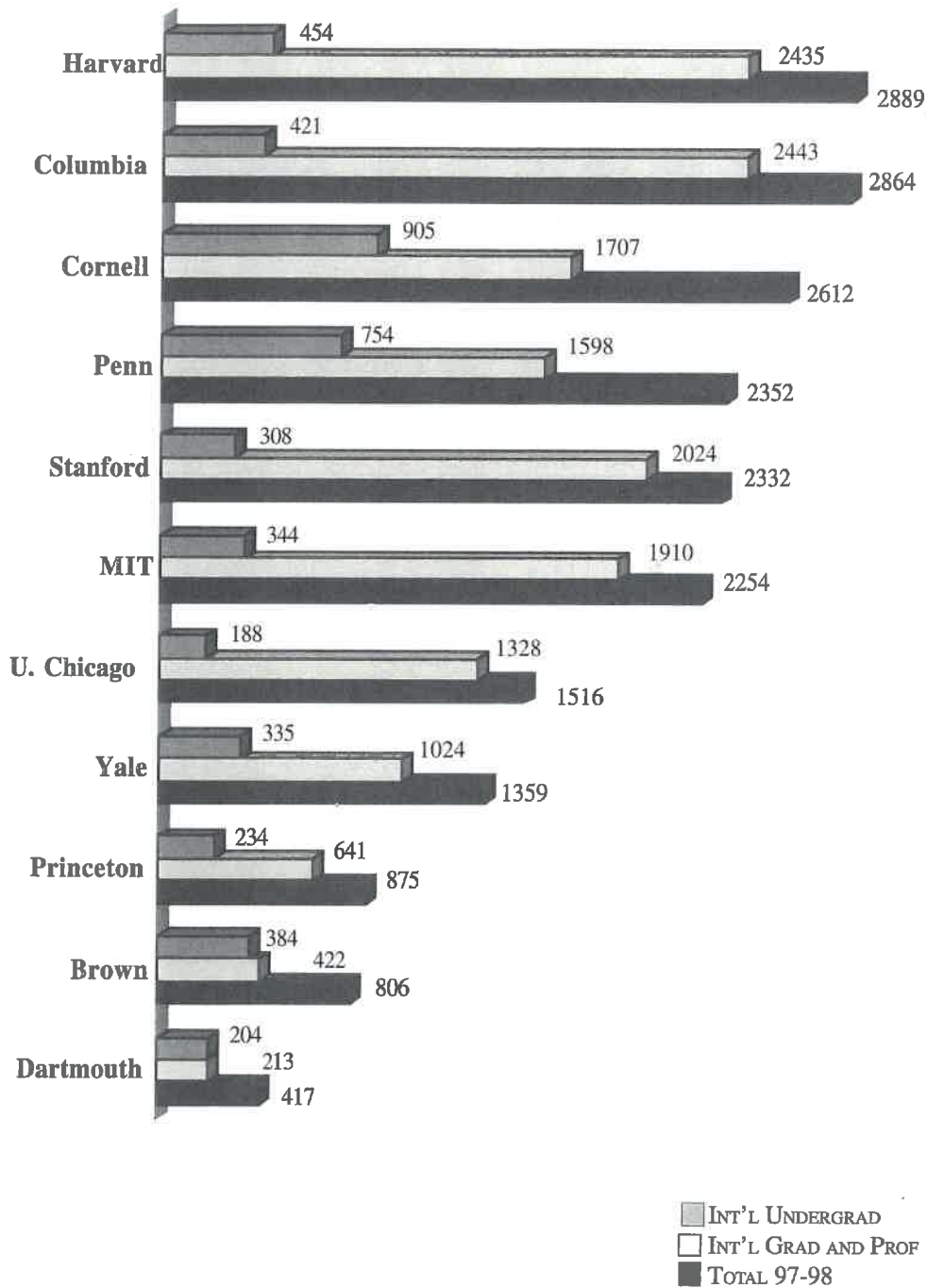

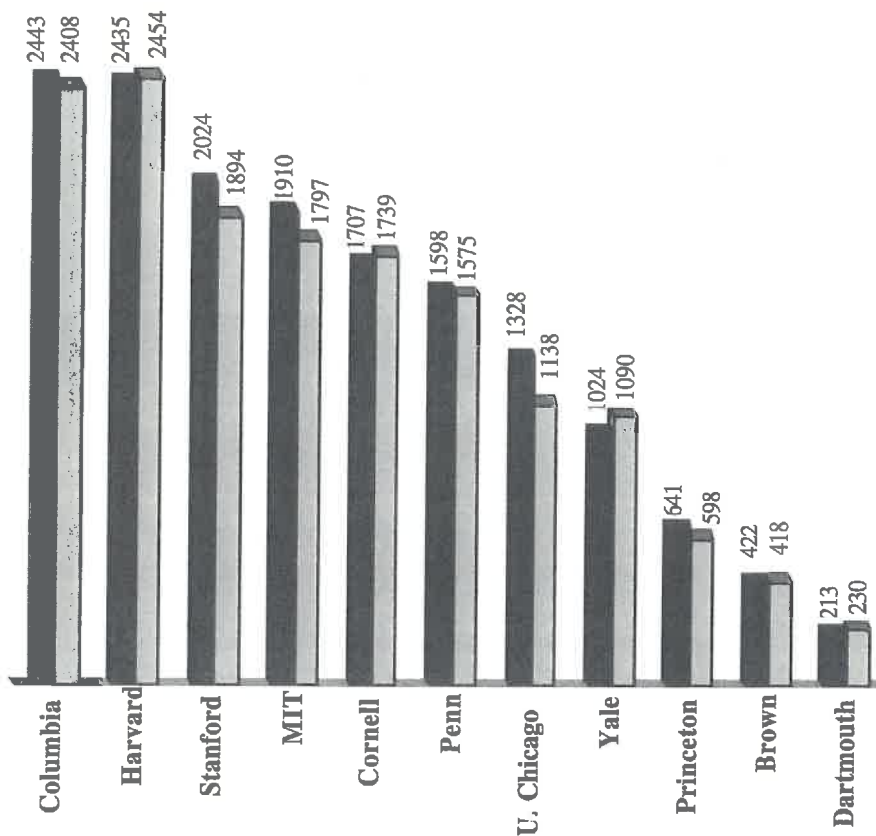

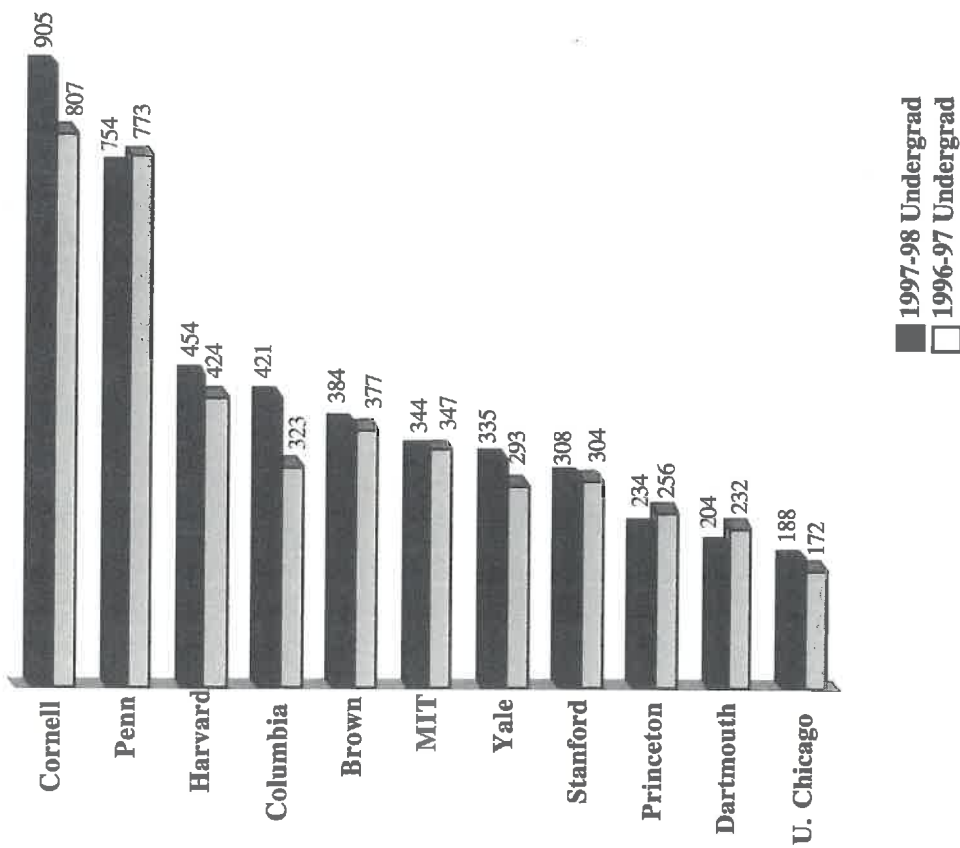




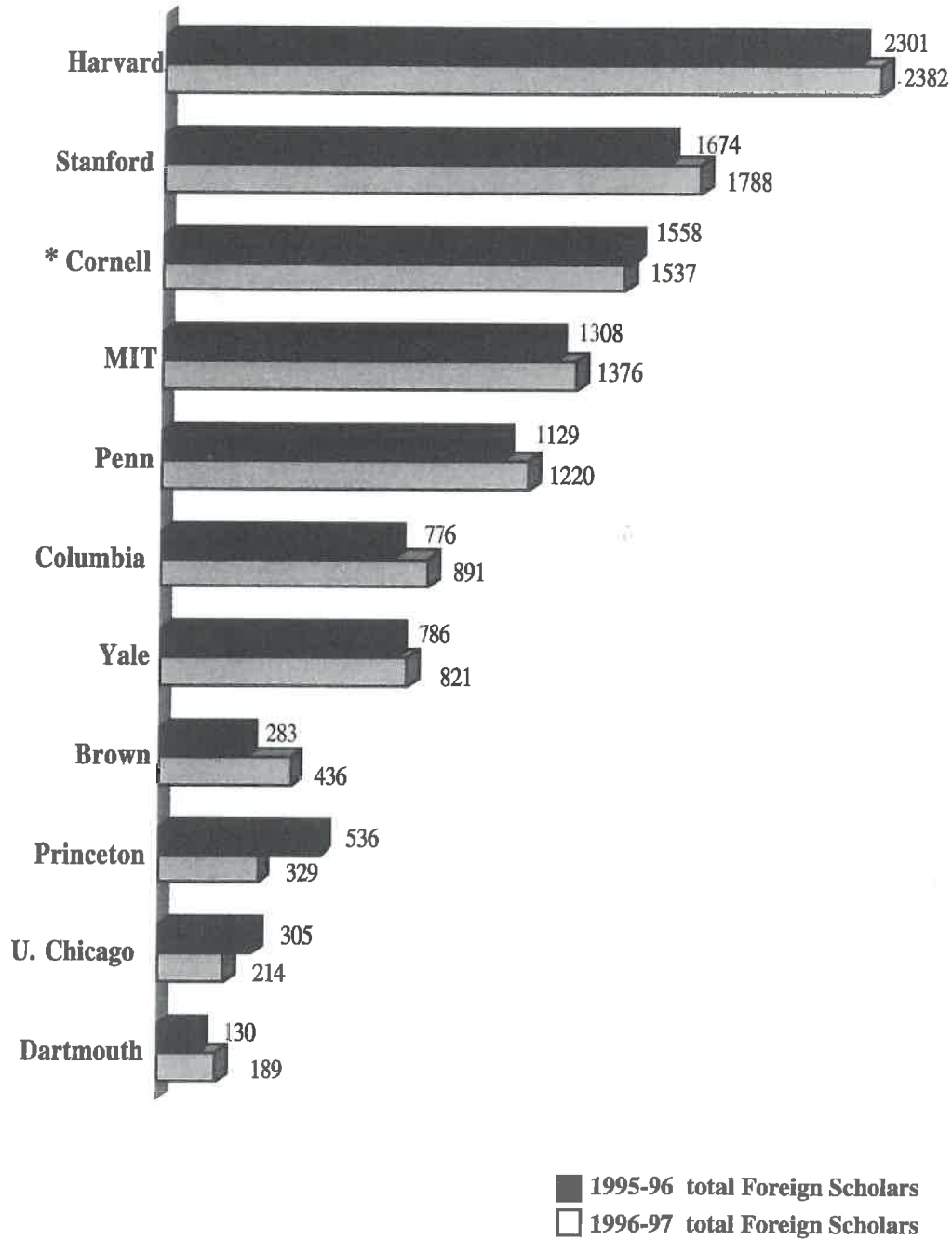
## 1996-98 INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE & PROFESSIONAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT
