STATION NOTES

CHANGES ANNOUNCED IN COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

Effective now, some internal changes have been made within Communications Services that will provide better service to the Station through more effective use of the unit's facilities.

Photo: Almost all photo processing and printing will be done at Rm. A122, Barton Lab. Some photo work will be done in Jordan Hall, however Barton is now the photographic hub of the unit's activities. Rose Sticht and Dick Schading will staff the facility. There will be virtually no change in Joe Ogradnick's work on behalf of Entomology and Plant Pathology and he continues as a member of those departments. Photo work may be dropped off at either Barton or Jordan, as in the past.

Mail Services: Matt Lewis and the international mail, package delivery and similar services are now based in the northernmost half of the Graphics Studio, Rm. B14A, left of Jordan's back door and loading dock. There will be no change in pick-up and delivery times.

Graphics: Expanding to Rm. B13 (the former "Bulletin Room") while still occupying half of B14A, Graphics Services continues with business as usual. Elaine Gotham's duties are primarily unaffected. Sharing space in B13 will be Bernadine Aldwinckle who shifts to Jordan after many years at Barton. She is responsible for a variety of assignments.

Info Distribution: Beverly Dunham continues to have charge of distributing F&LS Bulletins, Special Reports, SEARCH and other current and historic publications. She moves her base of operations to the former Photo Studio (B6).

The Print Shop (Bruce Moore) and the administrative office (Sandy Antinelli, John Williams) are unaffected by the moves. Some phone numbers change, and these changes are reflected in the recently published phone list. It is *important to note* that incoming work may continue to be dropped off at either Barton Lab or Jordan Hall, as in the past.
