Are you a member of the Cornell Federal Credit Union and trying to lower your tax bill? Do you have dollars in savings that you will probably not be using for five years? Are you tired of paying taxes on interest those dollars are earning?

- 1) Earnings in an annuity will grow tax-deferred until they are withdrawn;
- 2) In a fixed annuity, the insurance company guarantees to pay you a certain minimum interest rate for a certain period of time, and the principal is guaranteed never to lose value;
- 3) With a variable annuity, you can invest in stocks and bonds and the total return is tax-deferred until withdrawn. However, with a variable annuity there is no guarantee of principal or return;
- 4) Payments from an annuity can be in a lump sum, annual withdrawals, or on a monthly basis.

While annuities are an excellent investment opportunity, the options are complex and the tax implications many. To find out if an annuity is a good investment for you, contact:
