We have published historical NAICS-based employment information located here http://www.bea.gov/industry/NAICSEmployment_datarelease.htm

However, this historical data is not consistent with the current 1998-2012 employment file. The 1947-1997 employment data uses the 1997 NAICS classifications and was last revised in 2006 and will not match BEA's most recent methodologies.

Thank you for your inquiry. BEA provides employment data by industry here: http://www.bea.gov/industry/iedguide.htm#gdpia_ad_df. Under the heading "SIC Data:", click on the Excel file labeled "GDPbyInd_VA_SIC." Once the Excel file opens, the tab labeled "72SIC_Employment" will provide you with employment data from 1947-1987 on an SIC basis. The last tab labeled "87SIC_Employment" will provide you with employment data from 1987-1997 on an SIC basis.
